Notes on WSU's 30-Point Games, 20-Rebound Games

Dave Stallworth is the only Wichita State player to record consecutive 40-point games with 45 and 40 against Loyola-Chicago and Louisville, respectively, in 1964-65. He also had 37, 43 and 30 against Texas Western, Arizona State and Duquesne in consecutive games in 1963-64, and consecutive games of 30, 31 and 34 against St. Louis, North Texas State and Tulsa in 1963-64.

Xavier McDaniel had consecutive games of 30, 37, 44 and 31 points vs. Drake, Creighton, West Texas State and Indiana State in 1984-85. He also had 30 or more in consecutive games against Drake (31) and Bradley (33), and Indiana State (34) and Tulsa (34) in 1984-85. McDaniel scored in double figures in all 31 games of his senior season (1984-85) and had a stretch of 18 straight games with 20 or more points.

The only other Shockers to score 30 or more points in consecutive games are Cleo Littleton (30 against Houston and 34 against St. Louis in 1954-55), Greg Carney (30 against Bradley and 35 against Drake in 1969-70), Maurice Evans (33 against Illinois State and 38 against Florida A&M in 1998-99 and Jason Perez (33 against Missouri State and 34 against Evansville.)

Only two times have two Wichita State players scored 30 or more in the same game. Nate Bowman (35) and Dave Stallworth (34) did so against Marquette Feb. 1, 1964, and Cliff Levingston (34) and Antoine Carr (32) against Drake Feb. 18, 1980.

As for consecutive 20-rebound games, Terry Benton had three such games against Drake, Arkansas State and Loyola-Chicago in 1970-71. Gene Wiley had back-to-back 20-rebound games against Tulsa and Bradley in 1961-62 and Terry Benton did the same against Bradley and North Texas State in 1970-71.
