LOBOS SEASON REVIEW

- Lobos Finish 3rd at NCAA National Championships/Hemmingsson Wins Second National Title of Career ...** The University of New Mexico ski team brought a third-place trophy from the 2009 NCAA National Ski Championships back to Albuquerque ... **UNM scored 602 points to finish third, just 0.5 points behind second-place Colorado with 602.5 on March 14** ... Denver won the national title with 659 points ... It is the third time in the last six seasons the Lobos have finished in the top 3 at the national finals ... **Junior Malin Hemmingsson won the women's slalom, becoming the first Lobo to repeat as a national champion in an individual event (2007, 2009)** ... The Lobos picked up three All-America performances from **Polina Ermoshina, Martin Kaas and Simon Reissmann** in the Nordic freestyle races on Saturday to keep the Lobos in contention for the national title ... **UNM earned a total 11 All-America performances over the eight-event competition** ... **Malin Hemmingsson and Estelle Pecherand-Charmet** finished 1-2 in the 2009 women's slalom competition. The last time Lobos finished 1-2 in an NCAA championships event was the 1996 men's slalom when Mattais Erlandsson and Jimmy Renstrom went 1-2 ... No team has ever won the national title with just 10 qualifiers, which is the total UNM took to Maine. Colorado (2006) and Denver (2008) won shorthanded with 11. 10 Lobos qualified for the 2009 national event hosted by Bates College in Bethel and Rumford, Maine ... **Men's Alpine** - Petter Brenna, Nikolai Herlofson Finne and Thomas Schwab ... **Women's Alpine** - Stefanie Demetz, Malin Hemmingsson and Estelle Pecherand-Charmet ... **Men's Nordic** - Tor-Hakon Hellebostad, Martin Kaas and Simon Reissmann ... **Women's Nordic** - Polina Ermoshina ... **Junior Estelle Pecherand-Charmet was the national runner-up in both women's Alpine events**, while **Stefanie Demetz** earned All-America honors in the women's giant slalom ... Freshman **Petter Brenna** picked up a national runner-up finish in men's slalom to give **UNM enough Alpine points (354) to edge out New Hampshire (353) for the national Alpine team title** ... Sophomore **Martin Kaas** picked up two All-America finishes the men's Nordic events, while junior **Tor-Hakon Hellebostad** earned his second All-America honor in classical ... **Junior Polina Ermoshina added to her string of national runner-up finishes in the women's classical race.**

- Lobos' History At NCAA National Championships ...** The Lobo ski team owns the only New Mexico NCAA national team championship, winning in 2004 ... UNM has finished second at the national championships twice in 1992 and 2006 ... The 1992 squad is the last Lobo team to win the NCAA West Regional/RMISA Championships going into nationals ... In 2004, the team finishes were reversed with a second-place finish at regionals and first-place at nationals ... Since 1983, UNM has never finished lower than 9th at the NCAA national championships ... 11 Lobos have won individual NCAA titles. Most recently junior Malin Hemmingsson picked up her second

- Lobos Win 2009 NCAA West Region/RMISA Championships ...** The Lobos ended a 16-year drought, winning their first regional/conference championship since 1992 behind five individual wins and 565 points in eight events ... With the five individual wins, UNM ended up tied with Colorado with 14 individual winners in the 2009 RMISA season ... Freshman **Petter Brenna** won the men's Alpine individual title with wins in the slalom and giant slalom ... Junior **Estelle Pecherand-Charmet** won the women's slalom ... Junior **Polina Ermoshina** won the women's classical ... Sophomore **Simon Reissmann** won the men's freestyle ... Junior **Tor-Hakon Hellebostad** won the men's Nordic individual title with a second in classical and third in freestyle ... As a team, the Lobos also won titles in overall Alpine, overall men, men's Alpine, women's Alpine, women's giant slalom, men's slalom, and men's freestyle ... The Lobos ended up with 17 top 10 finishes.

- **Hellebostad Named Academic All-American ...** Tor-Hakon Hellebostad is a junior from Nesoddtangen, Norway. He has a 3.98 cumulative grade-point-average, majoring in University Studies. Hellebostad was named a Scholar-Athlete by the National Ski Coaches Association in 2008 and 2009. He is also a two-time NCAA All-American on the slopes in the 10K men's classical race.
- **NSCA Scholar-Athletes ...** 10 Lobos were named 2009 Scholar-Athletes by the National Ski Coaches Association - Petter Brenna, Casey Dyck, Rick Grahn, Jacqueline Hangl, Tor-Hakon Hellebostad, Martin Kaas, Olivier Lacaille, Karin Ohlin, Estelle Pecherand-Charmet and Melanie Zemp.
- **Lobos Honored By RMISA ...** Lobo Alpine coach **Martin Kroisleitner** was named the 2009 RMISA Alpine Ski Coach of the Year ... Eight Lobos were named to the All-Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Ski Association Team on March 4 - Men's Alpine: **Petter Brenna** (1st team), **Nikolai Herlofson Finne** (1st team); Women's Alpine: **Malin Hemmingsson** (1st team), **Estelle Pecherand-Charmet** (1st team), **Stefanie Demetz** (2nd team); Men's Nordic: **Tor-Hakon Hellebostad** (2nd team), **Simon Reissmann** (2nd team); Women's Nordic: **Polina Ermoshina** (1st team) ... It is the third year in a row that Hemmingsson and Ermoshina have earned the honor ... It is the second year for Reissmann ... Before the West Regional/RMISA Championships in February, the Lobos were honored at the championships banquet. The **women's Alpine team** earned the RMISA regular season title ... Sophomore **Thomas Schwab** was named the RMISA men's Alpine Most Valuable Skier on the strength of six top-10 finishes and 10 top-16 finishes. Schwab was one of eight RMISA racers to finish every race while earning qualification points for the Lobos in men's Alpine ... **Yellow Bibs:** Women's Alpine - Estelle Pecherand-Charmet; Men's Freestyle - Simon Reissmann.
- **Annual Team Awards ... Most Valuable Players:** At the annual team banquet in March, head coach Fredrik Landstedt announced the 2009 Team Most Valuable Players - **Petter Brenna** (men's Alpine), **Martin Kaas** (men's Nordic) and **Polina Ermoshina** (women's Nordic). **Stefanie Demetz, Malin Hemmingsson and Estelle Pecherand-Charmet** shared the women's Alpine award ... Brenna, a freshman from Norway, won five races during the season, a new UNM men's season record, and earned All-America honors in the men's slalom ... Kaas, a sophomore from Norway, earned All-America honors in men's classical and freestyle and recorded career-best finishes at the NCAA West Region/RMISA championships ... Ermoshina, a junior from Russia, earned her fifth All-America honor in three seasons, finishing national runner-up in classical and 8th in freestyle. She recorded her career-best finishes at the NCAA West Region/RMISA championships, including her first win in classical. It is the third year in a row for Ermoshina to win the award ... Demetz, Hemmingsson and Pecherand-Charmet won the 2009 NCAA Women's Alpine team title and kept the Lobos in the hunt for a national championship. Hemmingsson, a junior from Sweden, was the national champion in women's slalom for the second time in three years. It is the third year in a row for her to receive the team award. Pecherand-Charmet, a junior from France, was the national runner-up in giant slalom and slalom, finishing the season with 10 top-3 finishes. Demetz, from Italy, picked up All-America honors in the women's giant slalom to cap her freshman year ... **Abruzzo Scholarship Winners:** Pat Abruzzo Scholarship - **Karin Ohlin**, Ben Abruzzo Scholarship

- **UNM Scholar-Athlete Awards ... Casey Dyck and Melanie Zemp** were named to the All-Lobo Academic Team at the 2008-09 Fidelity Investments UNM Scholar-Athlete Banquet ... 14 Lobos were honored at the banquet as UNM Scholar-Athletes - Simon Reissmann, Olivier Lacaille, Tor-Hakon Hellebostad, Rick Grahn, Nikolai Herlofson Finne, Casey Dyck, Petter Brenna, Melanie Zemp, Estelle Pecherand-Charmet, Karin Ohlin, Svenja Niemeier, Ingrid Leask, Malin Hemmingsson and Jacqueline Hangl.
- **Overall Team Notes ... Thomas Schwab and Stefanie Demetz** competed in the 2009 Winter World University Games in Harbin, China, on Feb. 24-27. Schwab placed 6th in the giant slalom and 7th in slalom. Demetz placed 5th in giant slalom, but did not finish her second run of the slalom ... **Petter Brenna and Tor-Hakon Hellebostad** were the seventh and eighth Lobos to earn 2009 RMISA Skier of the Meet honors for their performances at the NCAA West Regional/RMISA Championships ... **Stefanie Demetz and Polina Ermoshina** became the fifth and sixth Lobos to earn 2009 RMISA Skier of the Meet honors. Both earned the award for their performances at the Denver Invitational ... **Karin Ohlin** earned Skier of the Meet honors for her performance at the Colorado/Laura Sharpe Flood Memorial Ski Invitational ... **Simon Reissmann, Nikolai Herlofson Finne, and Estelle Pecherand-Charmet** received RMISA Skier of the Week honors for the Seawolf and UAA Invitationals ... The Lobos have the most honorees among RMISA schools this season ... *Ski Racing* magazine posted a pre-season coaches poll that ranks the Lobos 6th overall and 4th among RMISA teams ... **New Mexico had 15 race winners in 2009, the most since the Lobos won a school record 16 races in 1992.**
- **Men's Alpine Notes ...** Freshman **Petter Brenna** led the Lobos with five individual race wins. The freshman from Baerum, Norway, sets a new record for UNM Alpine wins in a season and is two wins away from setting a new career record. The UNM record of six career wins is held by Stefan Lanzier, Lars Loeseth and Tor Fodnesbergene. Brenna made the most of his collegiate debut by winning the Seawolf men's slalom on Jan. 10 and placing second in the UAA slalom the next day. Earlier in the week he was earning FIS points, a giant slalom win, and three top-10 finishes in four races at the Nor-Am Cup in Sunday River, Maine, site of the 2009 NCAA Championships ... Freshman **Nikolai Herlofson Finne**, who had off-season surgery on his shoulder, finished right behind Brenna in the RMISA men's slalom qualifier on Jan. 16 in second place. In the CU slalom, Finne edged past Brenna for fourth place, a UNM career-best finish. The Asker, Norway native won the UAA men's giant slalom and placed 6th in the slalom to earn RMISA Skier of the Meet honors and go along with two additional top-10 finishes in the Seawolf slalom (5th) and giant slalom (9th) ... Sophomore **Thomas Schwab** qualified for the NCAA national championships for the second year in a row. He tied his career-best finish with a 5th in the UAA giant slalom. Schwab spent the fall semester completing his responsibilities to the Austrian Army ... Junior **Olivier Lacaille** picked up his first top-20 finish of the season with a 15th-place finish in the CU slalom. Lacaille earned his career-best giant slalom finish in 18th place at the RMISA Qualifier ... Junior **Gary Beresford** bettered his career-mark with a 25th-place finish in the UAA giant slalom. Beresford missed the majority of the 2009 season with a knee injury.

- **Women's Alpine Notes ...** Junior **Estelle Pecherand-Charmet** accounted for three of the Lobos 15 race wins. She recorded a string of six consecutive Top-3 finishes in giant slalom with a 2nd place finish at nationals. She earned her second win of the season in the RMISA women's slalom qualifier on Jan. 16. Earlier in the week, the native of Praz Sur Aly, France, placed second in the CU giant slalom. Pecherand-Charmet won the UAA women's slalom and took 3rd in the giant slalom to earn RMISA Skier of the Meet ... Freshman **Stefanie Demetz** earned RMISA Skier of the Meet honors for her 2nd place finish in giant slalom and 9th place finish in slalom at the DU Invitational, both UNM career marks. The native of Italy did well in her debut as well with top-6 finishes in the Seawolf (6th) and UAA (4th) giant slalom. Demetz picked up a 4th place finish in the CU giant slalom ... Junior **Malin Hemmingsson** qualified for her third consecutive NCAA national championships. Hemmingsson won the DU slalom, her first win since taking the NCAA title in 2007. The three-time All-American and two-time National Champion placed 5th in the CU slalom, her third top-10 finish of the season ... Senior **Karin Ohlin** set a career-best 10th finish in the CU giant slalom, replacing her 11th finish in the UAA giant slalom the previous week. Ohlin earned RMISA Skier of the Meet honors for the CU meet with her career giant slalom mark and 4th-place finish in slalom ... Freshman **Jacqueline Hangl** recorded top-4 finishes in the Seawolf giant slalom (4th) and UAA slalom (3rd) ... Freshman **Sofie Hjorth** will apply for a medical hardship after tearing an ACL during preseason training.

- **Men's Nordic Notes ...** Simon Reissmann picked up his first All-America finish in four attempts in the NCAA men's freestyle with a 10th-place finish. He earned the third freestyle win of his career at the West Regional/RMISA championships and qualified for his second consecutive NCAA national championships. He earned his second collegiate win in freestyle at the Denver Invitational. He posted his first career collegiate win in the Seawolf men's 15K freestyle race on Jan. 11. The sophomore from Germany posted four top-10 finishes in the Seawolf and UAA Invationals with a 1st and 2nd in both freestyle races, along with a career-best 4th (Seawolf) and 10th in classical races. His Seawolf combination of finishes earned him RMISA Skier of the Meet ... Sophomore **Martin Kaas** kept getting better with each meet in 2009, capping the overall run with two All-America finishes at the NCAA championships. His 4th-place finish in freestyle was a career-best finish. Kaas' marks at West Regional/RMISA Championships were career marks – 4th in classical and 5th in freestyle, improving his career-bests for the third time this season. After having a career-meet in the UAA with 11th-place finishes in the classical and freestyle, Kaas bettered both marks in the CU Invitational with a 7th-place finish in classical and 10th in freestyle ... Junior **Tor-Hakon Hellebostad**, a two-time All-American, set a career-best in the CU freestyle with a 2nd-place finish, just one week after setting the mark with a 10th-place finish in the Seawolf freestyle. Hellebostad went on to set a career-best in classical at the West Regional/RMISA Championships with a second-place finish, bettering his mark of 8th-place at the 2008 NCAA national championships ... Senior **Rick Grahn** set a career-mark with a 20th-place finish in the UAA freestyle ... Freshman **Christoffer Callesen**, who left the team in January, was the top finisher for the Lobos in the UAA men's classical in 7th place ... Senior **Casey Dyck** picked up two top-30 finishes at the CU Invitational ... Freshman **Peter Landl** earned his first top-30 finish of the season in the CU classical.

- **Women's Nordic Notes ...** Junior **Polina Ermoshina**, a five-time All-American, picked up her second consecutive national runner-up classical finish at the 2009 NCAA Championships. She earned her first collegiate win in the classical race at the West Regional/RMISA Championships after nine 2nd-place finishes over her career. Her 3rd-place finish in freestyle was also a new career-best mark. She earned RMISA Skier of the Meet honors for her then career-tying finishes at the Denver Invitational. The Moscow, Russia native tied her classic finish in second and her freestyle finish in 6th. Earlier in the season, she tied her career-mark in the classical with a 2nd-place finish in the UAA race. In the CU classical, Ermoshina was in 2nd place before she fell and dropped down to a 9th-place finish ... Senior **Melanie Zemp** has recorded nine top-20 finishes in 10 races this season ... Freshmen **Ingrid Leask** and **Svenja Niemeier** picked up top-30 finishes in the CU Invitational in classical and freestyle ... Leask missed the Denver Invitational to compete at the World Juniors Cross Country Ski Championships in France.
