LOBOS HEADED TO NCAA NATIONALS

• **2010 NCAA Nationals** ... The No. 2 New Mexico Lobos have qualified 11 skiers for the NCAA National Championships, March 10-13 in Steamboat Springs, Colo. ... A total of 148 student-athletes will compete at nationals, including 75 from RMISA member schools ... Colorado, Denver, Utah and Dartmouth are the only schools to qualify a full-12 skier squad ... Alaska-Anchorage and New Mexico qualified 11, while Vermont qualified 10 ... **The following Lobos will represent UNM at nationals: Nordic Men - Tor-Hakon Hellebostad, Martin Kaas, Pierre Niess; Nordic Women - Polina Ermoshina, Linn Klaesson; Alpine Men - Chris Acosta, Petter Brenna, Thomas Schwab; and Alpine Women - Anne Cecilie Brusletto, Malin Hemmingsson, Kate Williams** ... The Lobos took 10 qualifiers to the 2009 NCAA National Championships and finished 3rd ... Senior Malin Hemmingsson will be defending her 2009 NCAA women's slalom title.

• Nine Lobos Earn All-RMISA; Brenna and Kaas Are MVPs

... Nine UNM skiers earned Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Ski Association all-conference honors on March 1, the fourth-largest group of league honorees in program history (12 - 1992; 10 - 1999, 2004) ... UNM had five first-team award winners - Malin Hemmingsson (women's Alpine), Anne Cecile Brusletto (women's Alpine), Polina Ermoshina (women's Nordic), Martin Kaas (men's Nordic), Petter Brenna (men's Alpine) and Thomas Schwab (men's Alpine) ... Kate Williams (women's Alpine), Pierre Niess (men's Nordic) and Simon Reissmann (men's Nordic) earned second-team honors ... It is the fourth consecutive season that Hemmingsson and Ermoshina have earned the honor ... Brenna was named the RMISA regular season Men's Alpine MVP for his performance in 2010, including four wins so far this year. The sophomore from Baerum, Norway topped the UNM career men's Alpine wins list during the season, passing former Lobo All-Americans Stefan Lanzier, Lars Loeseth and Tor Fodnesbergene ... Kaas was named RMISA regular season Men's Nordic MVP. The junior

from Oslo, Norway started the season with five wins in six races, including three classic wins which set a UNM season and career record.

- **Lobos Win RMISA Regular Season Title** ... New Mexico edged out Colorado 3,480 - 3,438.5 points for the overall RMISA team title, while the Lobo Alpine squads ran away with their regular season titles. The Lobos beat Colorado for the Alpine team, women's Alpine and men's team titles and beat Utah for the men's Alpine title.
- **Overall Team Notes ... With two Alpine wins at the NCAA West Regional/RMISA Championships/CU Invitational, New Mexico has set a team record for individual wins in a season with 18. The Lobos tied its school record of 16 race winners set in 1992 at the RMISA slalom qualifier on Feb. 21. The 2009 squad recorded 15 individual wins, the most since the 1992 mark** ... Petter Brenna (men's slalom) and Anne Cecilie Brusletto (women's giant slalom) won NCAA West Regional/RMISA individual titles ... Seven Lobos have received RMISA Skier of the Meet honors in 2010 – Malin Hemmingsson (Utah Women's Alpine), Petter Brenna (Utah Men's Alpine), Martin Kaas (Montana State Men's Nordic), Pierre Niess (UNM Men's Nordic), Polina Ermoshina (UNM Women's Nordic), Thomas Schwab (UNM Men's Alpine) and Anne Cecilie Brusletto (UNM Women's Alpine) ... Once a skier earns the honor, they are no longer eligible for the rest of the season ... UNM has won two of the four regular season meets (Utah, New Mexico) and finished second in the other two to Colorado (Montana State and Nevada) ... The Lobos placed third at the 2009 NCAA National Championships in Maine.
- **In The Classroom** ... Official Fall 2009 semester grades were released by the University on Feb. 18 and once again the Lobo ski team is among the top teams in the UNM Athletics Department ... The men's half of the ski team posted the highest team grade point average among the men's programs with a 3.70. The men matched their Spring 2009 GPA and have earned a 3.23 or higher for 21 consecutive semesters ... The women earned a 3.77 team GPA, just .02 behind the women's tennis team for the highest women's mark of the semester. The 3.77 is the third-highest overall by the team and 18th consecutive semester of 3.28 or higher ... The National Ski Coaches Association will announce their 2010 scholar-athletes after the NCAA championships and skiers are eligible for the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America At-Large Teams in announced in June.
- **New Scoring System in 2010** ... The Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Ski Association has changed its scoring format for the 2010 season to match the NCAA Championships format. The scoring system is based on a 50-point system as opposed to a 30-point system used over the last few years. The new system is top-loaded, so the top finishers earn more points for their team than in previous seasons.
- **Men's Alpine Notes** ... Sophomore **Petter Brenna**, the 2010 RMISA Men's Alpine MVP, owns the UNM men's Alpine career wins mark after his GS win on Feb. 5 at the UNM Invitational. Brenna moved ahead of former Lobo All-Americans Stefan Lanzier, Lars Loeseth and Tor Fodnesbergene with his seventh win. The record moved to eighth with his slalom win at Taos on Feb. 6. He now has nine wins with his RMISA Championships titles. Brenna set the UNM record for men's Alpine wins in a season with five in 2009. ... Junior **Thomas Schwab** is in his first full season of training with the Lobos

after fulfilling his Austrian Army duties over the past two years. Schwab, the 2009 RMISA Men's Alpine MVP, has recorded career-bests in 2010, a third in slalom and second in giant slalom at the UNM Invitational ... Freshman **Chris Acosta** got on the board at Montana State with a then-season-best 12th-place GS finish at the RMISA qualifier. Acosta improved his SL mark with a sixth-place finish at UNM. At Nevada, his GS finish improved to 10th ... Senior **Olivier Lacaille** set a career mark with a 4th-place finish at the Nevada GS. Lacaille also set a career mark with his 6th-place slalom finish at Montana State ... Senior **Gary Beresford** made his first appearance on the slopes on Jan. 11 with a career-tying 25th-place finish in Utah GS, after a knee injury sidelined his 2009 season last January ... Freshman **Chriss Salbu** had a strong slalom debut on Jan. 12 with a 5th-place finish at Utah. Salbu followed up with a 5th-place GS finish at the RMISA qualifier three days later.

- **Women's Alpine Notes** ... Senior **Malin Hemmingsson** began defense of her 2009 NCAA women's slalom title with a win at the Utah Invitational on Jan 12, the sixth Alpine victory of her UNM career. Hemmingsson added a GS win on Jan. 16 at the Montana State Invitational, bumping her career Alpine wins to seven and taking over sole possession of second place on the all-time UNM career Alpine wins list. Agneta Hjorth owns the record with 15 from 1992-95. She picked up back-to-back slalom wins on Feb. 20 (Nevada) and 21 (RMISA Q) to bump her UNM career wins total to 9 ... Freshman **Anne Cecilie Brusletto** competed at the World Cup on Jan. 23 for her native Norway. Brusletto is believed to be the only Lobo to compete at the World Cup level while also competing for New Mexico. On Jan. 15, she picked up the first win of her college career in the RMISA GS qualifier. Brusletto had an RMISA Skier of the Week performance in the UNM Invitational with a SL win and second in the GS. She earned the third win of her short UNM career on Feb. 19 in the Nevada giant slalom ... Freshman **Kate Williams** used home-slope advantage to pick up two top-10 finishes at Utah, 10th in GS and tied for 6th in slalom. Williams added a 3rd-place finish in the slalom at Montana State. Williams tied her season-best 3rd in SL at UNM and ranks 8th in the MVP Points standings ... Sophomore **Jacqueline Hangl** got her 2010 season off to a good start with fourth-place tie in the slalom at Utah. Hangl helped the cause at Nevada on Feb. 19 with a career-best 18th place GS finish ... Senior **Estelle Pecherand-Charmet** will miss the 2009-10 season with a knee injury suffered in December. Pecherand-Charmet was the 2009 NCAA national runner-up in giant slalom and slalom, finishing 1-2 with Hemmingsson in the slalom ... Sophomore **Stefanie Demetz** joins Pecherand-Charmet on the injured list. A knee injury training for the UNM meet sidelined her for the rest of the season. Demetz made her first podium trip of the season on Jan. 11 with a career-tying second-place finish in the Utah GS ... Pecherand-Charmet and Demetz were 2/3's of UNM's 2009 NCAA Women's Alpine championship with Hemmingsson.
- **Men's Nordic Notes** ... Junior **Martin Kaas** has won five of eight races this season (3 classic and 2 freestyle), tying the UNM season and career records for wins. He moved into first on the list with a classic and freestyle win on home snow in Red River. He earned RMISA Skier of the Meet honors by taking wins in the Montana State classic and freestyle. Kaas is one of only four Lobos to win a classic race in a UNM uniform. With his classic win at Utah, Kaas becomes the men's classic career wins leader at two ... Senior **Tor-Hakon Hel-**

lebostad battled through asthma issues to start the season with a 12th in classic and 14th in freestyle at Montana State. He missed the Utah Invitational with illness. But nothing slowed him down at the UNM Invite with a 4th in classic and 2nd in freestyle ... Freshman **Pierre Niess** joined the team during the first week of the Spring semester and came up with a 7th place classic and 8th place freestyle finish at Utah. His finishes improved at the UNM meet with a 2nd in classic and 3rd in freestyle ... Junior **Simon Reissmann** placed 6th in classic and 17th in freestyle at Montana State to start the season. He followed that up with a 15th in classic and 9th in freestyle at Utah. Reissmann was the No. 4 finisher in the Lobos 1-2-3-4 UNM freestyle race ... Freshman **Eivind Solberg** kicked off his collegiate career with a 28th in classic and 29th in freestyle at Montana State. He bettered his freestyle finish with a 26 at UNM.

- **Women's Nordic Notes** ... Senior **Polina Ermoshina**, a five-time All-American, won the UNM classic race, just her second career win. She tied her career-best with a 3rd-place finish in freestyle and placed 4th in classic at Montana State ... Sophomore **Ingrid Leask** and freshman **Linn Klaesson** will round out the team points' scoring in the 2010 season. Klaesson, after joining the team in January, has picked up six top-15 finishes in eight races. Leask has earned four top-25 finishes, including two at UNM.

- **RMISA Qualifiers** ... *The RMISA qualifiers for Alpine have been inserted into the schedule to match the number of races conducted by the Eastern schools* ... No team scoring for the qualifying races, but the Lobos performed well to improve their RMISA MVP Points standings ... **Giant Slalom (Jan. 15)** ... Freshman **Anne Cecilie Brusletto** won her first race in a UNM uniform with a time of 1:49.65 ... Sophomore **Stefanie Demetz** placed sixth, senior **Malin Hemmingsson** placed ninth and freshman **Kate Williams** placed 14th for the women ... The men took 3-4-5 by sophomore **Petter Brenna**, junior **Thomas Schwab** and freshman **Chriss Salbu** ... Freshman **Chris Acosta** placed 12th and senior **Olivier Lacaille** finished 14th for the Lobos ... **Slalom (Feb. 21)** ... Senior **Malin Hemmingsson** showed why she is the defending national champion in women's slalom with her ninth career Alpine win, and her third slalom win of the 2010 season ... Freshman **Anne Cecilie Brusletto** was right on her heels in second place.

- **Lobos Take Second at Nevada (Feb. 19-20)** ... The Lobos battled through illness and injury to finish second at the Nevada Invitational ... **Malin Hemmingsson**, a senior from Ostersund, Sweden, earned her eighth career win in the women's slalom on Feb. 20, while freshman **Anne Cecilie Brusletto** won her second giant slalom race of the season ... For the men, **Petter Brenna**, **Thomas Schwab**, and **Olivier Lacaille** finished 2-3-4 in the giant slalom for an almost perfect team score in the event ... On the Nordic trails, senior **Polina Ermoshina** battled illness for a second-place women's classic finish, while junior **Martin Kaas** picked up a second-place in the men's freestyle.

- **There's No Place Like Home (Feb. 5-6); Lobos Win** ... The Lobos made a strong showing at the 2010 Jade Enterprises/New Mexico Invitational in Red River and Taos, taking first place in the meet with 961 points, 160 points ahead of second-place Colorado ... The last time the Lobos won their home meet was in 2004, the same year they won the NCAA national championship ... Over two days, UNM won six of eight events and recorded 20 top-10 finishes ... Junior **Martin Kaas** won

the men's classic and freestyle races bringing his season and career wins total to five ... Sophomore **Petter Brenna** won the men's giant slalom and slalom, taking over first place on the UNM career Alpine wins list ... Senior **Polina Ermoshina** earned just her second collegiate win in the women's classic at her final home meet ... Freshman **Anne Cecilie Brusletto** had a stellar Alpine weekend with a second-place finish in giant slalom and a win in the slalom ... The Nordic men pulled off an amazing 1-2-3-4 finish in the freestyle race on Feb. 6 ... Junior **Thomas Schwab** earned career finishes in the men's giant slalom (2nd) and slalom (3rd).

- **Utah Invitational, Part Deux (Jan. 22-23); Lobos Win** ... The Nordic squad added to the Alpine lead over the two days of competition for the Lobos second team win in their last four meets ... Junior **Martin Kaas** picked up his second classic and third overall win of the season, becoming the first Lobo men's Nordic skier to win two classic races in a season and in a career. His win streak came to a momentary stop with a third-place finish in the freestyle race on Jan. 23 ... Despite battling illness during the week, the Lobos came up with eight more top-15 finishes to seal the win ... New Mexico held off NCAA defending champion Denver by 15 points for the team win. UNM scored 850 points overall, 467 (1st) in Alpine and 383 (3rd) in Nordic.

- **Montana State Invitational (Jan. 15-17)** ... The Lobos finished second in the team standings behind a strong Alpine performance, including wins by senior **Malin Hemmingsson** and sophomore **Petter Brenna**, and two Nordic wins by junior **Martin Kaas** ... New Mexico scored 835 points overall, 443 (1st) in Alpine and 395 (2nd) in Nordic ... The meet began with five Top-15 finishes in the men's and women's classic races. Kaas picked up his first win of the meet and the first of his UNM career ... UNM earned three wins and 10 top-15 finishes on Day Two with another win by Kaas in the freestyle and wins by Hemmingsson and Brenna in the giant slalom ... With eight top-15 finishes in the slalom races on Sunday, the Lobos kept their overall second-place finish and edged out Denver by 12 points in the Alpine competition.

- **Utah Invitational, Part One (Jan. 11-12)** ... The Alpine squad picked up where they left off at the 2009 NCAA Championships. The Lobos won the team Alpine title back in March in Bethel, Maine, led by now-senior **Malin Hemmingsson's** second national title in the three seasons ... The Lobos were in first place at the Utah Invitational with 467 points, 44 ahead of defending national champion Denver, after four of the eight events ... On Monday, Jan. 11, Hemmingsson and the rest of the Alpiners got 2010 off on the right foot with five top-6 finishes in the Utah giant slalom to take a quick team lead. Sophomore **Stefanie Demetz**, a 2009 All-American in GS, placed second, just ahead of Hemmingsson in fourth and newcomer **Anne Cecilie Brusletto** in sixth for the women. On the men's side, sophomore **Petter Brenna** picked up a third-place finish, while junior **Thomas Schwab** tied for fifth. Senior **Olivier Lacaille** picked up the remaining points for UNM in the GS at 17th place ... In the slalom competition on Tuesday, Jan. 12, in Park City, Hemmingsson earned her fourth career victory, while sophomore **Jacqueline Hangl** tied for fourth and newcomer **Kate Williams** tied for sixth. Williams, a freshman for the Lobos, was skiing on her home course. Brenna led the men with a fourth-place finish, followed quickly by freshman **Chriss Salbu** in fifth place. Lacaille picked up 10th place to give the Lobos six top-10 finishes in slalom.
