## NEW NCAA INITIAL ELIGIBILITY STANDARDS

### Basic things to know...

- These rules apply to all incoming freshman starting college AFTER 8.1.2016.
- The 16 core course (cc) requirements remain the same.

### NEW RULES:

- 10 of the 16 cc have to be completed prior to senior year (start of 7<sup>th</sup> semester).
  - 7 of those 10 have to be in:
    - English
    - Math
    - Science
  - The 10 cc are **LOCKED IN** and can't be replaced with better grades for GPA purposes.
- A **2.3** GPA and corresponding ACT/SAT test score **is the MINIMUM requirement for Athletics Aid, Competition and Practice**

### Academic Redshirt:

- This is for prospects that still satisfy the old minimum requirements.
  - 16 cc
  - 2.0 min GPA
- Will be eligible for Athletics Aid & Practice **ONLY**.
- NO COMPETITION IN 1<sup>st</sup> year.

### Head Coach Responsibility-Compliance Discussion Topics

- Amateur Status** – Know the things that would have a potential prospect lose their amateur status prior to enrollment (*Bylaw 12.1.2*)
- Recruited Prospect** – Know what actions from an institution constitute when a prospect has been “recruited” (*Bylaw 13.02.13.1*)
- APR** – Be familiar with the requirement and potential penalties. (*Bylaw 14.8*)
- Awards** – Be familiar with types and cost limitations (*Bylaw 16.1.4*)

## *NCAA Interpretation of Interest*

### **Expenses to Attend an Institutional Camp or Clinic that Conducts Organized Competition (1.9.2015)**

The Legislative Council determined that an individual may receive actual and necessary expenses to attend an institutional camp or clinic from an outside sponsor (e.g., team, neighbor, business) other than an agent or a representative of an institution's athletics interests (and, after initial full-time collegiate enrollment, other than a professional sports organization), provided the camp or clinic conducts organized competition in the sport for its participants.

## *NCAA Educational Column of Interest*

### **Previously Approved Incidental Expenses (1.5.2015)**

NCAA Division I institutions should note that the previously approved incidental expenses legislation provides that specific incidental expenses that have been previously approved by the NCAA Division I Legislative Council Subcommittee for Legislative Relief may be processed by an institution or conference.

The following is a list of incidental expenses that can be approved by institutions or conferences without submitting a formal waiver request to the NCAA.

#### **Transportation Expenses**

1. To return home for the birth of the student-athlete's baby.
2. To attend the funeral of a member of their former coach's immediate family.
3. To obtain a visa, provided such expenses are not available through the NCAA Special Assistance Fund.
4. To serve as witnesses in a lawsuit filed by a former student-athlete against the institution and/or a staff member.
5. Travel expenses for an international student-athlete to take a citizenship examination in conjunction with the student-athlete's travel to an away-from-home competition.

#### **Misfortune Expenses**

1. To replace lost/stolen items that were taken while the student was engaged in practice/competition (police report required).
2. To replace stolen essential items (e.g., dorm/apartment key, ID cards, textbooks), regardless of athletics participation (police report required).
3. To cover the cost of repairs to a student-athlete's car damaged by an institutional employee or student manager.
4. Expenses to repair a student-athlete's automobile that was vandalized during an away-from-home competition when the automobile was parked in a lot used by student-athletes when they travel.
5. Institutional monetary donation to a fund to assist a former student-athlete who sustained loss in the former student-athlete's home.

#### **Miscellaneous**

1. Expenses to pay for housing costs (e.g., rent, utility bills) for the rest of the term to a student-athlete when his or her roommate dies.
2. For a member conference to provide T-shirts as mementos for conference student-athlete advisory committee.

#### **Celebratory Events**

1. Expenses for student-athletes to attend banquets honoring a retiring coach.
2. To provide flowers or other similar mementos to the parents or individuals representing the student-athlete's parents during senior day or night.
3. To pay for formal wear (e.g., tuxedo, evening gown) rental expenses for student-athletes who are working at institutional promotional events or are being honored at an awards event.
4. To provide complimentary admissions to the family members of student-athletes to attend a home athletics contest that follows a celebratory event (e.g., awards dinner or brunch for scholar student-athletes).
5. To provide transportation and meal expenses for student-athletes to attend a banquet honoring their coach.
6. To permit members of an institution's coaching staff to purchase gifts (valued at less than \$25) for a pregnant team member.
