TIGER TRACKS

- Clemson won its 33rd-straight season opener on Friday (Nov. 10) in a 85-57 rout of Western Carolina. The Tigers moved to 12-0 all-time against the Catamounts.
- The win also marked the 125th career victory for head coach Brad Brownell as the Tigers' head man.
- Head coach Brad Brownell enters the season just eight wins shy of 300 for his career.
- In the Tigers' season opening win, they boasted four double-digit scorers - led by senior forward Donte Grantham (14 points, 5 rebounds).
- Clemson pulled away from Western Carolina with the help of a 22-2 run to end the first half. All told, the Tigers engineered a 33-6 run.

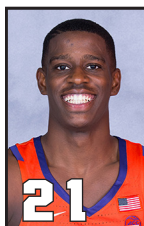
- Top-200 prospect nationally according to 247 Sports (No. 20 in Fla.)

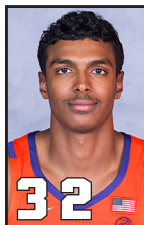

HEAD COACH BRAD BROWNELL

- Named the 21st men's basketball head coach in Clemson history on April 13, 2010.
- Is coaching his 16th season in Division I, having previously coached four years each at UNC Wilmington and Wright State before coming to Clemson.
- Set Clemson records for total wins (22) and ACC wins (9) by a first-year head coach in 2010-11.
- Led Clemson to first NCAA Tournament win in 14 years when the Tigers topped UAB in the first round in 2011.
- Has taken three different schools to the NCAA Tournament.
- Took the Tigers to the 2014 NIT semifinals and qualified for the 2017 NIT.
- Winningest coach in history on a percentage basis against ACC competition, and needs just one win to pass Cliff Ellis for the career record (60) at Clemson.
- Coached K.J. McDaniels (2014) and Jaron Blossomgame (2016) to first-team All-ACC honors. McDaniels was ACC Defensive Player of the Year, while Blossomgame won the ACC's Most Improved Award.
- Named Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year in 2003 and 2006. He coached CAA Player of the Year Brett Blizzard in 2002-03, his first season as a Division I head coach.
- Took over Wright State in 2006-07 and guided the school to a record 23 wins in his first season and an NCAA Tournament bid.
- Played Division III ball at DePauw University in Greencastle, Ind.
- He and his wife, Paula, have two daughters, Abby (19), a sophomore at Clemson, and Kate (17).

LITTLEJOHN IN SECOND SEASON AFTER RENOVATION

- Clemson held a ribbon-cutting for the newly renovated Littlejohn Coliseum on Friday, October 14, 2016.
- The game against the Bulldogs will serve as the 'grand reopening' of the facility, complete with all the bells and whistles.
- The \$63.5 million project was completed after 16 months of renovation, which began almost immediately after the 2014-15 season.
- Renovation features include:
 - Newly configured seating bowl, with court rotating 90 degrees from its prior layout
 - Swann Pavilion, a newly designed operations complex and practice facility connected to the arena
 - Burton Gallery, a new 10,000 square foot main entrance space
 - Expanded portals, allowing for a more accessible in-game atmosphere from the concourse level
 - Nation's largest centerhung curved videoboard, as well as ribbon boards atop each portal in the seating bowl
 - Coliseum club & courtside club premium seating areas
 - Coaches offices overlooking the practice gym
 - Expansive space for staff conferences
 - Locker room for players, coaches and staff
 - Team film and meeting room
 - Players lounge
 - Recruiting lounge
 - Weight room connecting the players lounge to the practice gym
 - Athletic training room

TIGERS BEGIN MAN OF THE MONTH CHALLENGE

- Brad Brownell and the Clemson basketball program began a "Man of the Month" competition which recently concluded its first month at the end of October.
- Each player is graded after each practice by his position coach, after each strength session by strength and conditioning coach Mike Bewley and twice a week on academics.
- Lyles Davis was the inaugural "Man of the Month" winner for October.

CLEMSON-NORTH CAROLINA A&T SERIES HISTORY

- This marks the first-ever meeting between Clemson and North Carolina A&T.

TIGERS RUN PAST CATAMOUNTS IN SEASON OPENER

- The Tigers routed the Catamounts on Friday night for its 33rd-straight season-opening victory, 85-57.
- Clemson finished the first half on a 22-2 run to take a 44-22 lead into the break and even extended its run after halftime to 33-6.
- Four finished in double-digits for the Tigers: Donte Grantham (14), Elijah Thomas and Gabe DeVoe (11) and Marcquise Reed (10).
- Shelton Mitchell led the offense with six of the team's 15 assists, while Thomas and Malik William both tallied two blocks each.
- The win marked head coach Brad Brownell's 125th as the head man at Clemson and moved him closer to 300 career victories (292).

BROWNELL CLEMSON'S WINNINGEST COACH VS. ACC COMPETITION

- Head coach Brad Brownell opens his eighth season with the Tigers on Friday. He carries a career record of 292-188 overall, 125-103 at Clemson.
- Brownell is Clemson's career winning percentage leader against ACC competition, and has led the Tigers to 10 regular-season wins in two of the past three seasons.
- Brownell owns 59 career wins over ACC teams, tied for the most in school history with Cliff Ellis. He needs just one win this season to pass Ellis atop the Clemson record books.

BROWNELL CLOSING IN ON 300 CAREER WINS

- Head coach Brad Brownell now has 292 career wins after the season opening win over Western Carolina, needing just eight to achieve the milestone mark.
- With 14 wins, Brownell would move into third on the program's all-time win list.
- Since arriving at Clemson prior to the 2010-11, Brownell has averaged nearly 18 wins per season.

GRANTHAM CHASING 1,000 CAREER POINTS

- Senior forward Donte Grantham is closing in on the 1,000-point plateau. He needs 155 points after his 14-point performance against Western Carolina on Friday.
- Grantham scored 590 points his first two seasons at Clemson, and added 241 during his junior campaign last year.
- He would become the 39th 1,000-point scorer in Clemson history.

GRANTHAM NAMED TO CBS' JON ROTHSTEIN'S TOP 20 BREAKOUT PLAYERS

- CBS Sports' Jon Rothstein released his list of the "Top 20 Breakout Players for 2017-18" and listed senior forward Donte Grantham.
- Coming off of a down year in 2016-17, Grantham will serve as a go-to senior on the court this season.
- Grantham scored 590 points through his first two years and will look to revitalize his scoring threat, while playing primarily in the post for the Tigers this season, but also showcasing his ball handling skills in helping run the Clemson offense.

THOMAS NAMED TO CBS' JON ROTHSTEIN'S TOP 20 UNDER-THE-RADAR PLAYERS

- CBS Sports' Jon Rothstein released his list of the "Top 20 Under-The-Radar Players for 2017-18" and listed junior center Elijah Thomas.
- Thomas is coming off of his first season playing for the Tigers in 2016-17. He averaged 7.5 points and 4.2 rebounds per game and swatted 28 shots.
- The Texas A&M transfer shot 57.8 percent from the floor, the top figure by a first-year player at Clemson since Trevor Booker in 2006-07.
- Thomas was a consensus top-50 prospect in the class of 2015 and was rated No. 29 overall and No. 2 in the state of Texas by Rivals.com.

REED CLOSING IN ON 1,000 CAREER POINTS

- Redshirt-Junior guard Marcquise Reed will make a run at 1,000 career points entering the season opener this season. He needs 132 points to reach the 1,000-point plateau after scoring 10 against Western Carolina on Friday.
- In his first season as a DI player, Reed busted out with 529 points in his lone season at Robert Morris.

CLEMSON HOSTS TENNESSEE IN HURRICANE RELIEF EXHIBITION

- The Tigers hosted the Volunteers for Hurricane Relief benefitting the Salvation Army and their relief efforts to all those affected.
- The exhibition marked Tennessee head coach Rick Barnes' first trip back to Clemson since leaving in 1998 to become the head coach at the University of Texas.
- It also marked a reunion of sorts for new director of player development Terrell McIntyre who played for Coach Barnes while at Clemson.
- Tennessee outlasted Clemson 71-67 in the contest, despite a late 16-2 run put on by the Tigers.
- Marcquise Reed led all scorers with 25 points on 7-for-12 shooting from the floor, while also grabbing seven rebounds.

GRANTHAM PACES TIGER OFFENSE IN EXHIBITION WIN OVER AUGUSTA

- Senior forward Donte Grantham tallied a game-best 18 points and grabbed eight rebounds in the Tigers' win over Augusta on November 2.
- Grantham poured in 18 points on 8-for-11 shooting in an 80-56 triumph in which five players reached double figures in the scoring column.
- Grantham has made 94 career starts.

LOTS OF NEW FACES

- Clemson will boast eight players who have seen limited or no action in a Tiger uniform during the 2017-18 season.
- The program welcomed four freshmen into the fold, including redshirt-freshman Anthony Oliver II who enrolled as an early enrollee in January of 2017.
- Both Mark Donnal and David Skara will see the court for the first time in Clemson colors after transferring.
- Donnal is a graduate transfer from Michigan and Skara sat out last season after transferring from Valparaiso prior to the 2016-17 campaign.
- Sophomore Scott Spencer saw action in just six games before a back injury limited his season and kept him out of ACC competition.

CLEMSON TIGER RADIO NETWORK

- Clemson will debut a new voice on the airwaves for the 2017-18 season with Don Munson taking over as the Tiger men's basketball play-by-play voice for the 17-18 campaign.
- Munson is in his sixth year with the Clemson athletic department in a full-time capacity and serves as the play-by-play voice of Tiger football and baseball.
- Tim Bourret will return for his 38th full season providing color commentary for Clemson Basketball, the longest active tenure among color commentators in the ACC in any sport.
- Bourret celebrated the 1,000-game mark in 2015-16 against his alma mater, Notre Dame.

TIGERS IN THE NCAA STATISTICAL RANKINGS (2016-17)

- Clemson placed inside the top 25 of the final NCAA Division I statistics (out of 347 teams) in three different categories.
- The Tigers' highest ranking was seventh in fewest fouls per game (15.2). In fact, Clemson shot 199 more free throws than its opponents in 2016-17.
- Clemson was 18th nationally in fewest turnovers per game (10.7), its second straight year with less than 11. The Tigers set the school record in 2015-16, and followed with the No. 2 mark in program history in 2016-17.
- The Tigers were 25th nationally, and third in the ACC, in turnover margin with a +2.9 figure. It was Clemson's best since a +3.0 figure in 2007-08.

SCORING AVERAGE TOOK A BIG JUMP IN 2016-17

- Clemson amped up its scoring in 2016-17 with the return of All-ACC forward Jaron Blossomgame and addition of three talented transfers. The result was a scoring average of 74.8 points per game.
- The scoring figure was Clemson's highest point value since the 2008-09 season. In all, the Tigers scored 70+ points in 21 games.
- The Tigers jumped 12.1 points per game in scoring average from 2014-15 to 2016-17, one of the biggest turnarounds in recent memory at Clemson.

FREE THROW SHOOTING ABOVE 70 PERCENT AGAIN IN 2016-17

- Clemson took another step forward in 2016-17 from the charity stripe. The Tigers shot 73.1 percent for the season, the fourth-best single season mark in program history.
- Three of the top six single-season accuracy figures have come under the watch of Brad Brownell, who completed year No. 7 with the Tigers.
- Brownell-coached teams have shot 70 percent or better at the free throw line in four of his seven seasons. Prior to his arrival in 2010, Clemson shot over 70 percent just four seasons since 1973-74.
- Not only did Clemson shoot well, the Tigers also shot frequently. Clemson outscored its opponents 487-357 at the stripe. Clemson's 14.8 makes per game was its best figure since the 1998-99 season (14.9).
- Clemson's best performance came in the second round of the ACC Tournament against Duke. The Tigers made 24-26 attempts, 92.3 percent. That established a program record in 64 years of ACC Tourney appearances.

TIGERS RETURN TWO 40 PERCENT THREE-POINT SHOOTERS

- Clemson saw three players in its regular rotation shoot at least 40 percent from behind the three-point line, a first in 30 years.
- In 1986-87, the first full season the three-point line was used and when the line was a foot closer than it is currently, three players shot over 40 percent — Michael Tait, Anthony Jenkins and Michael Brown. As a team, the group still holds the school record with a 44.8 percent clip.
- Clemson's 2016-17 team shot 35.7 percent overall, but did see three players over 40 percent for the season in Shelton Mitchell (.453), Avry Holmes (.442) and Marcquise Reed (.402).
- Mitchell's figure was fifth-best in Clemson history for a single season.

MITCHELL WILL LOOK TO PICK UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- Shelton Mitchell played his best basketball over the last month of the 2016-17 season.
- In Clemson's final 14 games, he scored in double figures 13 times and averaged 14 points per contest. He ended the year with an 11-game streak of double-figure scoring.
- Mitchell shot 45.9 percent from the floor, the top mark by a Tiger guard since Cliff Hammonds shot 46.7 as a senior in 2007-08 (minimum of 50 attempts).

MITCHELL MADE BIG LEAP BEHIND THE ARC

- Shelton Mitchell was arguably the most improved three-point shooter in the ACC in 2016-17.
- Entering his redshirt sophomore season, Mitchell had made just seven career three-point goals in 31 attempts at Vanderbilt, a 23 percent mark. In 2016-17, he was 29-64 and led all Tigers with a 45 percent clip.

GAME NOTES

MITCHELL SCORED MOST POINTS IN ACC TOURNEY DEBUT SINCE 1985

- Shelton Mitchell posted 22 points in the win over NC State on March 7. It was the highest point total by a Clemson player making an ACC Tournament debut since 1985 when Glenn Corbit had 22, also against the Wolfpack.
- In that 1985 contest, Corbit hit 10-13 field goals. Mitchell made 8-13 against the 'Pack, tying his career high for field goals. He also was 3-5 from three.

REED MADE THE MARK FROM THE CHARITY STRIPE IN 2016-17

- Marcquise Reed challenged Clemson's single-season free throw accuracy record in 2016-17. The Robert Morris transfer, who sat out 2015-16, made 96-106 for a 90.6 percent clip.

CLEMSON RETURNED TO POSTSEASON PLAY

- Clemson advanced to the NIT for the second time in the last four years, the third postseason berth for the program under head coach Brad Brownell.
- The Tigers finished the season with their highest RPI (No. 75) since 2014 and their third top-75 finish in seven seasons under Brownell.
