WOMEN TAKE 10TH, MEN 11TH AT NCAA XC CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Lobos' nationally ranked cross country teams ran to historic performances Saturday at the NCAA Division I Cross Country Championships in Terre Haute, Ind., as the 11th-ranked women's team turned in a 10th-place finish behind All-Americans Sammy Silva and Charlotte Arter, as the men's team were paced to 11th place by two-time cross country All-American Luke Caldwell.

On the women's side, Sammy Silva and Charlotte Arter combined for a stellar one-two punch for UNM, as both placed top-20 and led the women. Silva, the reigning Mountain Region Women's Athlete of the Year, raced to 12th place overall in 20 minutes, 25.6 seconds, while Arter cross the finish line in 20:30.9 to finish 18th.

It's just the second time in program history — after Natalie Gray (15th) and Ruth Senior (33rd) in 2010 — that New Mexico recorded two All-Americans at single national championship. The pair are also just the third and fourth runners in school history to place top-20 at the NCAAs, along with Gray and Carole Roybal (19th in 1984 and 13th in 1985).

Calli Thackery covered the women's six-kilometer course in 21:04.0 to place 67th overall, while Heleene Tabet (146th place, 21:38.1) and Tamara Armoush (149th, 21:39.3) placed top-150 to round out the women's scorers. Kirsten Follett (218th, 22:15.5) and Nicole Roberts (232rd, 22:27.2) also ran for the Lobos.

The women finished 10th out of 31 teams, combining to score 301 points. The Lobos have placed top-10 at the national championships for four straight year, and recorded their second consecutive 10th-place finish. The women's team score was also their second-lowest since the number of team expanded to 31 in 1998 (227 points in 2010).

The men also ran to their own historic finish, as well, finishing in the top 15 at a national championship for the first time since 2009. Caldwell earned a second straight cross country All-American nod for his 10th-place individual performance, and finished his UNM cross-country career leading the men at nine of the 10 meets at which he has competed.

New Mexico also found solid results from Patrick Zacharias and Adam Bitchell, as both placed in the top 100. Zacharias' time of 30:55.9 came in second for the men at 53rd place overall, while Bitchell's clocking of 31:00.1 finished 61st overall.

Ross Matheson also produced a scoring run for the Lobos, finishing 132 overall in 31:35.2. Sean Stam rounded out the scorers with a 157th-place time of 31:51.2. Also running for New Mexico were Elmar Engholm (186th place, 32:10.2) and Donovan Torres (223rd, 32:34.6).

As a team, UNM produced its best showing in four year, and posted a final team score of 334 points. The Lobos were only five points out of 10th place and eight from ninth.

Of the 16 schools that sent both the men and women to this year's national championship, only New Mexico and Colorado placed both teams in the top-12 in their respective races.

RECAPING THE 2012 NCAA MEET: WOMEN 10TH, MEN 21ST

The University of New Mexico's 17th-ranked women's cross country placed 10th at the NCAA Division I Cross Country Championships in Louisville, Ky., Saturday, while the No. 21 men finished 21th.

The Lobos received outstanding performances on the women's side, including an All-American run out of Josephine Moultrie, while the men struggled to a 21th-place finish despite Luke Caldwell earning All-American status.

The women placed 10th overall, scoring 341 points. Senior Josephine Moultrie led the Lobos at E.P. "Tom" Sawyer State Park, placing 30th overall with a 20:11.1 time over the 6-kilometer course.

Junior Charlotte Arter continued her streak of second-place team finishes, placing 51st overall with a 20:23.8 time. Senior Lacey Oeding was close behind, as she crossed the finish line in 20:30.3 to place 67th. Seniors Shawna Winnegar (135th, 21:01.6) and Imogen Ainsworth (168th, 21:14.9) also scored for the Lobos, who posted a team score in the 300s for the third time in the last four years. Kirsten Follett (175th, 21:19.8) and Chloe Anderson (230th, 21:48.8) also ran for the Lobos.

On the men's side, the Lobos were paced by junior Luke Caldwell, who covered the 10K course in 29:52.9 to place 27th overall. Caldwell was followed up by Mountain West Freshman of the Year Elmar Engholm as he placed 85th with a 30:36.7 clocking. Sam Evans (126th, 30:57.2), Patrick Zacharias (133rd, 31:00.4) and Donovan Torres (223rd, 32:06.6) rounded out the Lobos' scorers. New Mexico was without junior Adam Bitchell at the finish line and leader Sean Stam worked through an off day.

Bitchell, who had been dealing with a bout of food poisoning, dropped out after the 4K mark, while Stam only managed a 32:14.1 time, placing him 227th out of the 245 runners with times.

Despite that, New Mexico nearly halved its team score from last year, going from a last-place 885 points in 2011 to 473 this year. This is the Lobos best finish since placing 16th in 2010. New Mexico finished 31st in 2011 and posted a program-best tie for eighth in 2009.

PUTTING FIVE STRAIGHT NCAA QUALIFICATIONS IN PERSPECTIVE

The Lobos have qualified both the men and women to five straight NCAA Championships, dating back to 2009. It's one of four active streaks in the NCAA, along with Colorado, Stanford and Villanova. Coincidentally, all four institutions have both teams ranked in the top 15 nationally heading into the NCAA Championships.

However, New Mexico's NCAA qualification streak is historic. There have been 21 distinct instances of a school qualifying both its men's and women's team for five straight years. Of those 21 streaks, UNM's streak is tied for the 10th longest streak in Division I history and makes UNM one of just 15 schools in the records of Division I to accomplish dual-qualifications five years in a row.

Other highlights from this information include

- Only eight streaks have started in the last decade; UNM is one of them.
- Only four time in Division I history has a school simultaneously swept their conference championships and qualified both teams to the NCAA Championships (Arkansas, Colorado, New Mexico and Stanford)
- 10 of the 15 institutions with dual-qualification streaks of longer than five years won at least one national championship during their streak. Only Florida State, Michigan, Minnesota, New Mexico and North Carolina State have not.
- BYU (WCC) and New Mexico (MW) are the only two institutions of the 15 that are not from a BCS conference (i.e., AAC/Big East, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, PAC 12, SEC)

LOBOS 1 OF 6 TEAMS RANKED IN NATION'S TOP 15

The University of New Mexico men's and women's cross country teams check in as top-15 teams in the most recent edition of the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association national rankings released November 18.

After placing top-three at the NCAA Mountain Region Cross Country Championships, the Lobos are just one of six Division I institutions with both teams ranked in the nation's top 15. Joining UNM with both teams in the top 15 are Colorado (No. 1 men, No. 10 women), Oregon (No. 4 men, No. 15 women), Michigan, Villanova and Arkansas (No. 9 men, No. 3 women).

This week marks the third week in a row that New Mexico had both the men and women ranked in the top 15. In the last poll, the men were 11th and the women 8th. Two polls ago, both teams were ranked ninth in the nation.

The last time both the men and women harriers were ranked top-15 in back-to-back-to-back weeks was the final three regular-season poll in 2010. Both teams occupied the top 10 simultaneously five weeks in 2010, which was the only time in program history both teams ranked top-10.

For the women, it's the first time in two years that they were ranked in the top 10 in four consecutive polls. The last time UNM did that were the first six weeks of 2011.

New Mexico is also the only Mountain West institutions to place both its teams in the national rankings. The men's side of the polls is packed with three MW teams (including No. 14 Air Force and No. 27 Colorado State).

SILVA NAMED MOUNTAIN REGION WOMEN'S ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) has named University of New Mexico women's cross country athlete Sammy Silva as the NCAA Division I Mountain Region Women's Athlete of the Year.

Silva, a junior from La Mesa, Calif., won in the individual race at the NCAA Mountain Region Championships this past Friday, completing the six-kilometer course at Schneider's Riverside Golf Course in Riverside, Utah, in 20 minutes, 29.3 seconds.

Silva finished two seconds faster than runner-up Shalaya Kipp of Colorado, a 2012 Olympian in the steeplechase. She is the first UNM harrier to win a women's region race since Lisa Mitchell did it in 1981.

Silva also finished runner-up at the Mountain West Championships and third at the Notre Dame Invitational.

The award, as voted on by the Division I coaches, is the first received by any Lobo athlete in program history. New Mexico head coach Joe Franklin has been named Mountain Region Men's Coach of the Year once (2010) and twice as the Mountain Region Women's Coach of the Year (2010-11).

EIGHT LOBO HARRIERS NAMED ALL-REGION

Along with earning Mountain Region Women's Athlete of the Year, Silva also earned All-Region honors for her victory at the NCAA Mountain Region Championships. Silva's teammates Charlotte Arter (third place at regionals), Calli Thackery (13th) and Tamara Armoush (18th).

On the men's side, all five scorers earned all-region honors, including Luke Caldwell (sixth place), Adam Bitchell (eighth), Patrick Zacharias (17th), Sean Stam (23rd) and Elmar Engholm (25th).

LOBOS' FIVE-SWEEP IN HISTORIC COMPANY

New Mexico's five straight sweeps of the Mountain West Cross Country Championships is an impressive feat in it's own right. But when viewed in an historical context, the Lobos' five-sweep is one of the best all-time. In fact, courtesy data from the USTFCCCA's Kyle Terwilligar, New Mexico's five-sweep of the MW Championships is the second-longest active streak and tied for the fourth-longest in the Division I history.

CONFERENCE POLL STRANGLEHOLD

The Lobo men's and women's cross-country teams were selected as the favorites to win their respective 2013 Mountain West cross-country titles as voted by the league's coaches in the MW Pre-Championship poll (see poll, below).

Additionally, both teams claimed the top spots in the Aug. 22 preseason poll (see poll, top right) and both of the conference midseason coaches' polls (see polls, to right), which were released Sept. 25 and Oct. 18. The women's squad have won five consecutive MW titles, while the men have won four years in a row.

In the men's poll, the Lobos received five first-place votes and a total of 47 points and were followed by No. 22 Colorado State with two first-place votes and a total of 42 points. No. 20 Boise State was third with 36 points, Air Force was fourth with one first-place vote and 34 points. Wyoming were next with 22 points, followed by Utah State (21 points), Fresno State (14 points) and San José State (8 points).

On the women's side, the Lobos tallied nine first-place votes and a total of 99 points to claim top spot. No. 25 Boise State was second with two first-place votes and a total of 89 points for second spot. Air Force was next with 81 points, followed in fourth place by Colorado State with 62 points. Utah State were fifth with 61 points, and Wyoming sixth with 52 points were followed by Nevada (50 points), Fresno State (48 points), San Diego State (24 points), San José State (20 points) and UNLV (19 points).

FUN WITH RANKINGS, MOUNTAIN WEST EDITION

In the most recent USTFCCA National Coaches' Poll, the Mountain West had four men's teams ranked. New Mexico was ninth, Boise State 20th, Colorado State 22nd and Air Force 28th. But this is a fairly uncommon occurrence, as it's only happened on four other occasions. .

The last time the MW had four men's teams ranked in a regular-season poll was week 6 of the 2004 season (Nov. 1, 2004). Then-MW member BYU was ranked eighth, Air Force 14th, New Mexico 19th and Colorado State 24th. The two weeks prior in 2004 (Oct. 11 and Oct. 18) also had the same four teams ranked. (Air Force was 12th/14th; BYU was 10th/9th; Colorado State was 17th/24th; New Mexico was 23rd/20th.)

The only other time in conference history four men's teams were ranked in one poll was week 5 (Oct. 29) in 2001. Air Force was 15th, BYU was 12th, Colorado State was 23rd and Utah was 25th. (Coincidentally, Utah State was ranked 21st in that poll, as well.)

The women's poll also presented some intrigue, as the No. 9 UNM women were joined by the No. 25 Boise State women in the national rankings. The last time two MW women teams were ranked in one poll were Weeks 4 and 5 of 2011. (The week 5 poll was a repeat of week 4.) The BYU women were 27th and the UNM women were 7th.

This was also the last time two MW school had both teams ranked, with the No. 6 BYU men and No. 25 UNM men joining the group.

And according to research done by UNM sports information director Mike Mulcahy, this is the first time two current MW institutions had both their men's and women's teams ranked in the same poll. Prior to this year, only two schools out of the current conference alignment have had both teams ranked in their program's history: Colorado State and New Mexico. However, neither of the instances of both schools ranking both teams coincided. Subsequently, this situation with Boise State and UNM unprecedented.

CALDWELL GOES BACK-TO-BACK IN WEEKLY HONORS

UNM senior Luke Caldwell has been named Mountain West Men's Cross Country Athlete of the Week twice in the 2013 season, once for meets contested from Sept. 30 through Oct 6 and a second time for meets contested Oct. 9 through Oct. 20.

For his first accolade, Caldwell, a senior from Betchworth, England, handled the competition at the Notre Dame Invitational on Oct. 4 in South Bend, Ind. He raced to second place and led No. 25 New Mexico to a team finish of sixth. He posted a time of 24 minutes, 22.3 seconds to pace New Mexico with his fifth team-leading in the last year.

At the time, his clocking was the fastest five-mile (or eight-kilometer) time in the Mountain West.

However, Caldwell wasn't finished, as he placed seventh at the recent Wisconsin adidas Invitational in Madison, Wis. He covered the 8-kilometer course in a time of 23 minutes, 30 seconds, turning in his sixth team-leading performance out of the last seven meets.

His time is also the fastest in the Mountain West so far this season.

Caldwell earned his first MW Cross Country Athlete of the Week honor after the 2012 Notre Dame Invitational, which he shared with Air Force runner Isaiah Bragg. He now has collected three during his time as a Lobo.
