WOMEN SEIZE 3RD, MEN TAKE 14TH AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The University of New Mexico women's cross country team surged to a third-place finish at the 2014 NCAA Division I Cross Country Championships as the men claimed 14th place.

Behind All-American runs by **Alice Wright** and **Charlotte Arter**, the Lobos women stormed to the highest-ever finish at the national championships in program history as the men posted a strong team performance at the LaVern Gibson Championship Cross Country Course in Terre Haute, Ind.

The women's program, which has been competing since the mid-1970s, seized its first podium finish at the national championships under eighth-year head coach **Joe Franklin**. The top four teams out of the 31 teams competing earn a trip to the podium during the post-race awards ceremonies.

The previous best for the UNM women was fifth place in 2010, but the 2014 Lobos eclipsed that by placing all five of its scorers in the top 100.

Wright and Arter led the pack, running within a second of each other throughout the entire women's six-kilometer race. Wright, a redshirt freshman, covered the course in 20 minutes, 29.1 seconds, while Arter, a senior, finished in 20:29.9.

It's the second year in a row UNM had two All-Americans, which the USTFCCA awards to the top-40 finishers of each gender. Arter and Sammy Silva were All-Americans last year. For Arter, she is just the second Lobo to claim back-to-back All-American medals since Carole Roybal from 1984-86

But, as it had been all season, UNM had tremendous team running, with the rest of their scorers finishing less than a minute behind.

Calli Thackery crossed the line third for UNM, placing 43rd overall in 20:48.8, while **Tamara Armoush's** time of 21:02.8 and **Heleene Tabet's** time of 21:10.2 merited 73rd place and 93rd place, respectively.

Nicola Hood (111th place, time of 21:16.2) and **Amber Zimmerman** (141st, 21:29.9) rounded out the Lobos competing.

The Lobo women's performance is the best in the Mountain West since 2003, when now-departed BYU took second with 128 points. As a team, New Mexico combined for 188 points, the lowest total in program history.

On the men's side, the Lobos combined for a strong team performance, racing to a 14th-place showing after taking seventh a week earlier at the 17-team NCAA Mountain Regional Championships.

Jake Shelley paced the men over the 10-kilometer course with his 50th-place time of 31:04.7. Like he did at the Mountain West Championships—where the men parlayed a ridiculous eight-second team spread en route to winning their sixth-straight title—Shelley was the first Lobo to finish.

Right behind was **Elmar Engholm**, who produced a 78th-place time of 31:20.9. **Todd Wakefield** chipped in a time of 31:30.0 for 93rd, while **Ross Matheson** (119th, 31:41.4) and **Dan Studley** (131st, 31:50.3) also scored.

Alex Cornwell (178th, 32:12.6) and **Matt Bergin** (did not finish) also ran for UNM.

The Lobo men, in spite of missing top runner **Adam Bitchell** (injury) and Bergin, combined for a team score of 394 points, just a point away from 13th place. Overall, it's the men's eighth top-20 finish at the NCAA Championships, with a program-best finish of eighth place in 2009.

THE POWER OF THREE: MOUNTAIN WEST EDITION

With UNM women's cross country taking third at the NCAA Championships (which is the program record), New Mexico is the only school in the current configuration of the Mountain West to have any team in any conference-sponsored sport place top three at any NCAA Championship in conference history.

In other words, since the founding of the Mountain West in 1999, no athletic team from any of the current conference schools have placed top three in a NCAA Championship in a sport sponsored by the conference.

A handful of former MW teams did place three at a conference-sponsored NCAA championship, and they're listed below:

- BYU women's cross country (1st in 1999, 2000 & 2003, 2nd in 2001 & 2002)
- TCU baseball (3rd in 2010)
- BYU men's golf (4th in 2005)
- BYU men's track (3rd indoors in 2011 & 4th outdoors in 2005)
- BYU women's track: 3rd outdoors in 2009 & 4th outdoors in 2000

THE POWER OF THREE: NEW MEXICO EDITION

The Lobos women's third-place finish is also significant in the history of the university, too. Only two other current athletic team at the University of New Mexico—men's soccer and skiing—can beat the third-place showing women's cross country produced. In fact, since skiing in a co-ed sport, women's cross country is the only women's program at UNM to place top three at an NCAA Championship.

UNM men's soccer was second in 2005 and tied for third in 2013, while Lobo skiing was third six times (1984, 1993, 1994, 2009, 2010, 2014), second twice (1992, 2006) and won it all once (2004).

WRIGHT AND ARTER NAMED ALL-AMERICAN

Alice Wright became the ninth cross country All-American in New Mexico history at the NCAA Championships Nov. 22, while Charlotte Arter earned her second honor in a row.

The duo—with Wright taking 20th place and Arter placing 22nd—is the second in as many years to earn All-American status. Last year Arter (18th place) and Sammy Silva (12th) were All-Americans last year. The only other time two Lobos were All-

Americans at the same championship was 2010, when Natalie Gray and Ruth Senior placed 15th and 33rd, respectively.

PUTTING SIX STRAIGHT NCAA QUALIFICATIONS IN PERSPECTIVE

The Lobos have qualified both the men and women to six straight NCAA Championships, dating back to 2009. It's one of three active streaks in the NCAA, along with Colorado and Stanford.

However, New Mexico's NCAA qualification streak is historic. There have been 21 distinct instances of a school qualifying both its men's and women's team for five straight years, and only 14 instances of streaks extending to six year.

UNM's streak is tied for the eighth longest streak in Division I history, tied with Colorado's current streak. Consequently, New Mexico's run of qualifications is tied for the second-longest current streak.

Other highlights from this info includes:

- Only seven streaks have started in the last decade; UNM is one of them.
- Only four times in Division I history has school simultaneously swept their conference championships and qualified both teams to the NCAAs (Arkansas, Colorado, UNM and Stanford)
- 10 of the 15 institutions with dual-qualification streaks of longer than five years won at least one national championship during their streak. Only Florida State, Michigan, Minnesota, New Mexico and North Carolina State have not.
- BYU (WCC) and New Mexico (MW) are the only two institutions of the 15 that are not from a BCS conference (i.e., American/Big East, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, PAC 12, SEC)

LOBOS' CONFERENCE-TITLE SWEEP STREAK IS IN HISTORIC COMPANY

New Mexico's six straight sweeps of the Mountain West Cross Country Championships is an impressive — and almost unparalleled — feat in its own right. But when viewed in an historical context, the Lobos' six-sweep is one of the best all-time. In fact, New Mexico's six-sweep of the MW Championships is the second-longest active streak and tied for the fourth-longest in the Division I history.

NEW MEXICO CONTINUE ITS PRESENCE IN NATIONAL POLLS

The Lobos check in as ranked teams in the post-regional championships edition of the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association national rankings released Nov. 17. The UNM women ranked ninth and the men ranked 26th.

New Mexico is one of 17 Division I institutions with both teams ranked in the nation's top 30, but is one of just two schools (along with Iona) not from a power conference.

For the women, it's the third straight poll (and seventh in the last two years) that they're ranked top-10. For the men, it's the first time since week 4 in 2012 that they were ranked outside the top 25. In the last decade, the UNM have been ranked lower than 25th just four times.

However, it is ninth poll in a row that UNM had both the men and women ranked in the top 30, dating back to Oct. 22, 2013.

New Mexico is also the only Mountain West institutions to place both its teams in the national rankings. The Colorado State men are ranked 27th, while the Boise State women are ranked 11th.

POLL SITTING

As previously noted, the Lobos have both their men and women ranked in the national polls. But with that simple statistic lie some interesting trends.

In the preseason USTFCCA rankings, both the UNM men and women were ranked. It was the seventh straight year that the women have been ranked or receiving votes in the preseason poll, while the men have been ranked in the preseason poll for seven straight years.

However, the men are riding another impressive streak: the Lobo men have been ranked in 24 consecutive polls dating back to the final rankings of the 2011 season. It's a streak unmatched in the MW, with only 15 other schools in all of Division I bettering that streak (BYU, Colorado, Eastern Kentucky, Indiana, Iona, Michigan, Northern Arizona, Oklahoma State, Portland, Princeton, Stanford, Syracuse, Texas, Tulsa and Wisconsin).

LOBO CROSS COUNTRY AND TRACK RACKING UP THE TITLES

So we all know that UNM cross country has done pretty well for itself at the conference championships, sweeping the last six Mountain West Championships. However, the Lobos have dominated the conference in track & field, too.

Since the 2009-10 season, New Mexico has won 16 of a possible 30 Mountain West titles between cross country and track & field. By comparison, only one other FBS schools, Arkansas, has won more conference championships in the same span (17).

2014 CROSS COUNTRY

WRIGHT NAMED MOUNTAIN REGION WOMEN'S ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) has named University of New Mexico women's cross country athlete **Alice Wright** as the NCAA Division I Mountain Region Women's Athlete of the Year.

Wright, a redshirt freshman from Worcester, England, won in the individual race at the NCAA Mountain Region Championships Nov. 14, completing the six-kilometer course at the UNM North Golf Course in Albuquerque, in 20:51.1. She finished over five seconds faster than runner-up Erin Clark of Colorado.

The award, as voted on by the Division I coaches, is the second received by any Lobo athlete in program history after Sammy Silva earned the accolade last year. Before last year, the last women to win a women's region race was Lisa Mitchell in 1981.

New Mexico head coach Joe Franklin has been named Mountain Region Men's Coach of the Year once (2010) and twice as the Mountain Region Women's Coach of the Year (2010-11).

SIX LOBO HARRIERS NAMED ALL-REGION

Along with earning Mountain Region Women's Athlete of the Year, **Alice Wright** also earned All-Region honors for her victory at the NCAA Mountain Region Championships. Wright's teammates **Charlotte Arter** (second place at regionals), **Calli Thackery** (10th), **Anna Burton** (18th) and **Nicola Hood** (24th) also earned All-Region certificates.

On the men's side, **Ross Matheson** earned all-region honors, as he placed 24th overall.

FRANKLIN'S GOING TO NEED ANOTHER OFFICE TO FIT ALL OF HIS TROPHIES

If your team keeps winning championships, it's completely understandable if you keep racking up the honors yourself. For UNM head coach Joe Franklin, that's the reality.

Since he arrived at UNM in 2007, Franklin has claimed 12 (of a possible 16) Mountain West Cross Country Coach of the Year honors, with seven straight Women's Coach of the Year and five Men's Coach of

the Year plaudits. He swept both in 2014.

However, since 2009, Franklin has earned every MW CoY honor available, save the men's honor in 2010 (which went to Air Force's Juli Benson).

ALMOST AS LOW AS THEY COULD GO

Men's cross country scored 26 points at the Mountain West Championships on Halloween, the second-lowest team score in conference history. The Lobos have the lowest, a 22-point tally in 2012.

THE BRITISH ARE COMING, THE BRITISH ARE COMING

For a school in the United States, the University of the New Mexico certainly has a lot of talented runners that aren't American. In fact, a good chunk of that talent is very British.

Nine of the 10 conference scorers for UNM at the Mountain West Championships are from the United Kingdom.

For the men, it was **Jake Shelley** (London), **Alex Cornwell** (London), **Ross Matheson** (Edinburgh), **Matt Bergin** (Bedford, England) and **Dan Studley** (Bristol, England).

On the women's side, it was **Alice Wright** (Worcester, England), **Calli Thackery** (Yorkshire, England), **Charlotte Arter** (Carlisle, England) and **Nicole Roberts** (Northamptonshire, England).

Amber Zimmerman, from Knoxville, Tenn., was the only American to score for UNM. (In case you were wondering, all but one of the other four women's runners were British, too.)

SCORING FASTER THAN A 100-METER DASH

The men's team registered an eight-second team spread among the runners at the Mountain West Championships on Halloween. It is the smallest ever by a New Mexico squad at the conference championships. In fact, it's the smallest spread by the Lobos in the last decade.

The women didn't do too bad either, registering a 28-second spread. It's their smallest spread 1-to-5 since the 2009 MW Championships (coincidentally on Halloween) when they finished with a 24-second spread.

2014 CROSS COUNTRY

10 IN THE TOP 10

Both the men's and women's teams had all five scorers place in the top 10 at the Mountain West Championships on Halloween, marking just the third time in conference history that the men's champion and women's champion managed that feat at the conference meet (New Mexico in 2009 and BYU in 2005).

ARTER NAMED USTFCCCA NATIONAL ATHLETE OF THE WEEK

Charlotte Arter was named the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) National Athlete of the Week on Oct. 6.

Arter, a 2013 cross-country All-American from Carlisle, England, won the University Division race at the Notre Dame Invitational Oct. 3 with a time of 16 minutes, 9.3 seconds. She led the No. 12 New Mexico women to a dominating team title, as the Lobos placed all five scorers in the top 20.

After placing 10th at the same meet last fall, Arter won this year's five-kilometer race (which was shortened by about 150 meters due to poor conditions) with a new meet record, besting the former Notre Dame Invitational standard of 16:21 set by North Carolina's Brie Feinagle in 2008.

Her time was also over eight seconds faster than the next finisher, SMU's Agnes Sjostrom, and is the fastest five-kilometer time in Mountain West by over 66 seconds.

It's the first time—and just the second in her three years as a Lobo—that Arter was New Mexico's top finisher. She led UNM at the Wisconsin Invitational last year.

Her award is also the first-ever national-level weekly award for a New Mexico cross-country runner in program history.

ARTER, BITCHELL CLAIM WEEKLY CONFERENCE HONORS

Charlotte Arter was selected for her first Mountain West Women's Cross Country Athlete of the Week honor Oct. 7, while Adam Bitchell claimed MW Men's Cross Country Athlete of the Week, the first in his career.

Arter, a senior from Carlisle, England, won the University Division race at the Notre Dame Invitational Friday with a time of 16 minutes, 9.3 seconds over five kilometers.

She led the now 11th-ranked New Mexico women to a dominating team title, as the Lobos placed all five scorers in the top 20. She was named the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) National Athlete of the Week and set a new Notre Dame Invitational meet record, besting the former standard of 16:21 set by North Carolina's Brie Feinagle in 2008.

Bitchell, a senior out of Aberystwyth, Wales, led now 16th-ranked New Mexico to a third-place team showing at the Notre Dame Invitational with an 11th-place time of 23:35.8 over the five-mile course.

It was Bitchell's first-ever team-leading performance in three years with the Lobos. He also bettered his performance from the 2013 Notre Dame Invitational, when he finished 29th.

The pair's honors are the first MW athlete of the week selection for New Mexico since Luke Caldwell tallied back-to-back honors last October. Arter's honor is the first for the women—and the first time that New Mexico swept the honors—since Josephine Moultrie on Oct. 16, 2012.

LOBOS RANK NO. 1 IN PRE-CHAMPIONSHIP CONFERENCE COACHES' POLL
