2003-04 SEASON OUTLOOK



In order to build a successful college basketball program, a solid foundation has to be set. The goals of the program have to be clearly defined and each member of the team has to be willing to work towards achieving those goals. University of New Mexico head coach Ritchie McKay has set two goals for the Lobo men's basketball program that he and the rest of his staff are making great strides to achieve.

"Our goals for the program are two-fold," stated the 38-year old McKay who is entering his eighth season as a Division I head coach and his second year at New Mexico. "First of all, we want a 100 percent graduation rate. I think anyone who does not have a commitment to a student-athlete's progress academically is doing an injustice to the student and the university. We are committed to accomplishing that."

The Lobos' work in the classroom is paying off as the men's basketball team increased its overall grade-point-average in both of McKay's first two semesters at UNM.

"Second, we want to play championship-caliber basketball. I truly believe that the University of New Mexico has a great tradition. As a result, our community, rightfully so, has an expectation to contend for conference championships. Certainly, we want to embrace that and continue to further our program to where we reach the top of the Mountain West Conference."

Looking back on the 2002-03 season, the casual observer might miss the important steps that were taken to build the University of New Mexico into one of the top programs in the Mountain West. Despite posting a 10-18 overall record, the Lobos made their mark on the league and showed promising signs of future success.

Senior guard Ruben Douglas led the nation in scoring at 28.0 points a game and was named MWC Player of the Year despite the Lobos' seventh-place league finish. Freshman Mark Walters led all MWC freshmen in scoring and rebounding and was named to honorable mention all-conference. Junior Ryan Ashcraft emerged as a team leader and committed just 12 turnovers in 435 minutes of MWC action.

"There's no doubt that losing a player like Ruben Douglas will affect us," said McKay. "You can't lose the nation's leading scorer and not be affected. However, I think this year's team will have more balance and will be much deeper. That should make us a better basketball team."

The Lobos started the season with only 10 scholarship players and were dealt a serious blow when senior guard Senque

Carey went down. Carey was lost for the season when he suffered a spinal cord injury against Northwestern State on Nov. 25 in just the second game of the season. That left New Mexico with just one player - Douglas - who had played more than one year of Div. I basketball. The undersized and out-manned Lobos refused to give up and stayed in many games against teams with more talent and a deeper bench.

"Lobo fans are certainly not used to rebuilding," stated McKay. "From the outside looking in it may have seemed like a season that was devastating. However, I was really proud of our group, the way we came together, and the foundation that was laid for Lobo basketball. No one will ever remember the contributions made by that team, but players like Ruben Douglas, Ryan Ashcraft and Mark Walters all made a tremendous impact on the future of our program."

Despite the school's first losing season in 20 years, Lobo fans continued to spin the turnstiles at The Pit. UNM's average crowd was 15,186, which ranked 12th among all NCAA Division I men's basketball programs. The loyal UNM throng was able to celebrate the biggest win of the year on March 1 when New Mexico upset No. 22 Utah 76-69, in The Pit. McKay and his staff are preparing the 2003-04 team for more outcomes like that.

The 2003-04 Lobos will have a dramatically different look with 10 new faces joining the program to go along with six players returning from last year's team.

Ashcraft and guard Javin Tindall are the lone seniors on the team, and will give McKay an experienced backcourt to guide the influx of newcomers to the program. Ashcraft has been named team captain and will be a major cog in returning the Lobos to their winning ways. "Ryan is one of my favorite players I have ever coached," said McKay. "He represents what student-athletes should be about. He is a great leader,



has an incredible heart and is a great teammate.”

The 5’11” Tindall was the team’s leading 3-point shooter from a year ago, connecting on 42.1 percent of his attempts, and is the second leading returning scorer. He averaged 9.1 points and scored in double figures in six of the last eight games. Tindall also led the team with 67 assists. “Javin had a good year getting back into Division I play,” said McKay. “I expect him to provide some leadership and play a major role for us this year.”

Four sophomores also return, including Walters, David Chiotti, Jeff Hart and Mikal Monette. Walters’ averages of 9.5 points and 5.6 rebounds are tops among the returning players. The explosive guard is recovering from a torn ACL he suffered in a mid-May pickup game, but he should be fully recovered by the beginning of practice in October. “Mark has a chance to be one of the best players in the league and I think he showed that type of ability as a freshman,” McKay said. “As he develops strength and recovers from his injury we really expect special things from him.”

Among the returning lettermen, Chiotti showed the most improvement over the course of the season. He started the last 15 games and led the team in field-goal accuracy at

54.9 percent. The only true inside player the Lobos had on the court last year, the 6’9” neophyte scored 92 points in his last 14 games compared to just 18 in the first half of the season. “David is really important to our success,” claimed McKay. “The stronger he gets and the more presence he can bring to our interior the better basketball team we are going to be.”

Hart and Monette came to UNM as walk-ons and were supposed to help out the team primarily in practice. Instead they became key reserves who saw plenty of action throughout the season. Hart played in all 28 games and made five starts, while Monette appeared in 20 games with two starts. “Jeff did a great job for our team last year. He has a great ability to shoot the ball and came in and gave us a lift off the bench. Mikal is a tough, hard-nosed, blue-collar guy. He embodies what we are trying to do here at New Mexico.”

The experience of these six players should mix well with the 10 new bodies that UNM welcomes this season. Lobo fans should already be familiar with three players, transfers Troy DeVries, Billy Feeney and Danny Granger. All three came to Albuquerque last season, but had to sit out after transferring. Feeney, a 6’ 10” sophomore, and DeVries, a 6’ 2” junior, transferred from Portland State while Granger, a 6’ 9”

junior, came to UNM from Bradley. Feeney will be eligible to play at the start of the season, while Granger and DeVries were both mid-season transfers and will begin their Lobo careers at the conclusion of the fall semester.

“Billy Feeney could surprise the league,” said McKay. “He is multi-talented and I think his redshirt year is going to make him a better player. Troy is an outstanding shooter who brings some maturity and toughness to our team. Danny is a talented and versatile 6’ 8” player who not only is one of our best all-around athletes, but also one of our most unselfish.”

The highly-anticipated debut of Granger in a Lobo uniform should be worth the wait. A member of the Missouri Valley Conference all-Freshman team, Granger was averaging 19.2 points and 7.9 rebounds at Bradley before his matriculation at UNM.

The Lobos also bring in two additional transfers in Alfred Neale and Collins Ferris. Neale, a 6’ 5” junior forward, comes to UNM from Northeastern Oklahoma A&M. A 7’ 3” high jumper in high school, Neale averaged 15 points and 6.5 rebounds last season at NEO. Ferris is a 6’ 1” junior walk-on who played the last two seasons at Northeastern (Colo.) Junior College. “We’re really excited about Alfred,” said McKay. “He a mature young man who is very athletic and can shoot the basketball. We were very fortunate that he was available and we were able to get him. Collins is one of those guys who is fun to root for because he plays so hard and is so unselfish.”

McKay and his staff also were able to land the services of five freshmen. Ryan Wall, Lenny Miles, Justin Benson, Sean Phaler and Kellen Walter all have the potential to make a dramatic impact on the program in the coming years.

Wall and Miles are two very talented guards who could see some time on the court this season. Like Walters, Miles is an athletic 6’ 2” guard with a 42-inch vertical leap. Wall is a floor general who always thinks pass first. “Both Lenny and

Ryan are potentially very important pieces to our puzzle,” stated McKay. “Lenny is a great athlete who has a very unique temperament for being so young. He doesn’t get rattled and is a very smooth player. Ryan is much the same in terms of his demeanor. He has as good of vision that I’ve seen in a high school guard. Both of those guys should help us right away.”

Benson is a 6’ 7” forward who was rated among the top-100 high school players in the country. He averaged 31 points and 11 rebounds as a junior and should provide a boost to the Lobos’ inside game. “Justin is a wonderful kid with an incredible personality. I am excited about his potential, and he has a confidence that I think is infectious.”

Phaler, a 6’ 9” forward, is another top-100 player who initially signed with UCLA. He was released from his national letter and has agreed to walk on at UNM. Although weighing just 195 pounds, Phaler averaged nearly 20 points and nine rebounds a game last season at Villa Park (Calif.) High School. He made 107 3-pointers and shot better than 90 percent from the line. Phaler’s biggest obstacle is getting healthy following a serious car accident on June 26 when he suffered two chipped vertebrae. He is expected to wear a back brace for several months, but could be ready for full workouts by mid-September. “Sean may be the skinniest guy in college basketball but also could be one of the most skilled. I’ve known Sean’s game for a few years and I’m so excited about his future in our program.”

Walter is also a 6’ 9” forward who is expected to redshirt this season. “We really felt like we got a steal with Kellen,” said McKay of the walk-on. “He is going to make a impact on our program in the future.”

The 2003-04 Lobo men’s basketball team is bigger, deeper and could be one of the most promising teams in recent history. Nine of the 16 players have had at least a semester of practice under McKay and have become familiar with his style of play. The maturity and skill of the rest of the new players should help UNM quickly reach its goal of playing championship-caliber basketball in the Mountain West Conference.



PRESEASON NOTES

SEASON NO. 101: The University of New Mexico men's basketball program begins its second century of competition when the 2003-04 season gets underway in November. The Lobos first laced up the hightops on Feb. 2, 1900, when they lost 8-6 to the Albuquerque Guards. While this season is actually the 105th anniversary of that inaugural year, UNM did not field a team for various reasons in 1900-01, 1903-04, 1917-18 and 1920-21.

The Lobos have been on the hardwoods continuously since the 1921-22 season and have compiled an all-time record of 1,192-946 (.557). New Mexico was 418-495 (.458) from 1900-62, but has gone 774-451 (.632) over the past 41 seasons, an average of nearly 19 wins per year. The Lobos have made 26 trips to the postseason during that span, including 10 appearances in the NCAA Tournament and 16 showings in the NIT.

HEAD COACH RITCHIE MCKAY: Ritchie McKay begins his second season in charge of Lobo hoops and his eighth year as a collegiate head coach. He was named UNM's school's 18th head coach on March 28, 2002.

McKay had previous stops at Portland State (1996-98), Colorado State (1998-2000) and Oregon State (2000-02). He has a career record of 93-107, 10-18 at New Mexico. While at Mountain West Conference member Colorado State, McKay led the Rams to the NIT in 1999. McKay is the son of the late Joe McKay, who was a three-year letterman at guard for the Lobos from 1961-63.

PERSONNEL PICTURE: The Lobos return six lettermen, including four starters, from last year's team that finished 10-18, the school's first losing season in 20 years. The big loss is 6-4 shooting guard Ruben Douglas, who led the nation in scoring last year by averaging 28 points a game. Returning starters include senior guards Ryan Ashcraft and Javin Tindall, sophomore post David Chiotti and sophomore guard Mark Walters. Sophomores Jeff Hart and Mikal Monette will also be back.

It will still be a young team as the only player with more than one year of experience at UNM is Ashcraft.

Lettermen not returning are 6-6 forward Jamaal Williams and 6-11 post Chad Bell, both who elected to transfer at the end of last season. Williams is now at the University of Washington, Bell at the University of Nevada at Reno.

McKay and his staff will welcome 10 new faces to the team in 2003-04, three transfers from other NCAA Div. I institutions (Troy DeVries, Billy Feeney and Danny Granger), two junior college transfers (Alfred Neale and Collins Ferris) and five freshmen (Justin Benson, Lenny Miles, Sean Phaler, Ryan Wall and Kellen Walter).

TRYING TO REVERSE A TREND: After going 10-18 last season, UNM looks to avoid consecutive losing seasons for what would be only the second time in more than 40 years. New Mexico was 6-20 in 1979-80 and 11-15 in 1980-81. The Lobos have only had four losing campaigns since Bob King arrived in Albuquerque before the 1962-63 season.

UNM has had three straight sub-.500 seasons in Mountain West Conference play, finishing 6-8 in both 2000-01 and 2001-02 and 4-10 last season. New Mexico had previously not had a losing record in league games since 1983. The Lobos have not had four straight losing seasons in conference play since 1980-83.

THE PIT: The 2003-04 season marks the 38th year of basketball in The Pit/Bob King Court, which was completed in December of 1966. UNM has an all-time mark of 522-128 (80%) in the building that resides 37 feet below street level. The Lobos have had a winning record in The Pit in 36 of their 37 years as tenants and tore off a school-record 41-game home winning streak from 1996-98. Since the beginning of the 1995-96 season, the Lobos are 123-26 (83%) at home.

POSTSEASON PERENNIALS: UNM has advanced to postseason play seven of the past eight years and 18 times in the last 20 seasons, dating to 1983-84. The Lobos participated in the NIT from 2000-02, advancing to the second round in 2000 and the quarterfinals in 2001. The Lobos have also made seven NCAA Tournament appearances since 1991, including a school-record four straight from 1996-99, moving to the second round each time.

Before a first-round exit in the NIT in 2002, UNM had been one of just eight schools in the nation to win at least one postseason game (NCAA or NIT) from 1996-2001: Connecticut, Cincinnati, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan State, Purdue, Stanford and New Mexico.

NCAA TOURNAMENT RETURNS: UNM will again play host to NCAA Tournament games when the 2004 women's championship comes to The Pit. The Lobos will host first- and second-round games March 20 and 22 or March 21 and 23. New Mexico is in a stretch where it will host NCAA competition for five consecutive years. The NCAA Men's First and Second Rounds were here in 2002 followed by the Women's First and Second Rounds and the Midwest Regional a season ago. UNM also hosts the Men's West Regional in 2005 and the Women's West Regional in 2006.

SENOUE CAREY UPDATE: Lobo guard Senque Carey has regained full use of his limbs following surgery on Jan. 27, 2003, to remove a bulging disc and fuse vertebrae in his neck. The procedure took place at the Stanford Medical Center. Carey was in the hospital for 15 days after the surgery.

Carey suffered a spinal cord injury Nov. 25, 2002, in a game against Northwestern (La.) State. He was injured with 7:41 remaining in the first half while attempting to draw a charge. After the seemingly innocent collision with NSU's Byron Allen, Carey lay motionless for nearly 15 minutes before being immobilized, placed on a stretcher and taken to University Hospital. He had no feeling from the neck down when he was taken from the arena. He was able to move his arms the next morning.

After 13 days of paralysis in his legs from Nov. 25-Dec. 7, Carey attended a Lobo practice on Sunday, Dec. 8, and walked with assistance from his girlfriend (now fiancée), Nadia Steed, and a student manager much to the delight of his coaches and teammates. He has really become an unofficial student coach, giving guidance and encouraging his teammates at practice and at games.

Carey has not been cleared to play by UNM doctors, however, he has been working out on his own. Carey has become an avid golfer in his spare time while finishing his coursework at UNM.



2003-04 Lobo Basketball

Head Coach Ritchie McKay



Ritchie McKay may be beginning just his second season at the University of New Mexico, but he is no stranger to the proud tradition of Lobo basketball. In fact, like many UNM fans, McKay grew up with powerful visions of Cherry and Silver glory which were fostered by his late father, Joe McKay, a standout player for New Mexico from 1960-63. While the younger McKay completed his playing days and began his promising coaching career in the Pacific Northwest, the University of New Mexico was always in his heart.

The saying, "home is where the heart is" certainly rings true for McKay, who was born and raised in the New Mexico basketball tradition. Ritchie learned about the proud legacy of Lobo basketball, beginning with his father's days playing at a packed Johnson Gymnasium under legendary head coach Bob King. Attending his first college game as a 12-year-old, Ritchie cheered on the nationally-ranked Lobos as they battled Cal-State Fullerton in an NCAA Tournament game in Tempe, Ariz. Now after 14 years of coaching, McKay is working to guide the University of New Mexico men's basketball program back to national prominence.

The 38-year-old McKay was named the 18th head men's basketball coach at the University of New Mexico on March 28, 2002. McKay's first season was all about rebuilding - rare for a program with just three losing seasons in the previous 40 years. Due to circumstances before he arrived and injuries after he took over, McKay was in command of a squad that featured just eight scholarship players for most of the year. While the 10-18 record was tough to swallow, McKay enjoyed coaching a hard-working group that featured the nation's leading scorer in Ruben Douglas and a cast of underclassmen who showed up to play every game and improved as the season progressed.

It was clear to Lobo fans that McKay instilled much-needed stability into a program that endured more than its share of issues before he took over the reins. McKay's refreshing philosophy was welcomed by his team and the result was an infusion of trust and respect between coach and player.

Because the team was so short-handed, it was not uncommon to see McKay and his staff scrimmage against the first team. The coach was sidelined for a few days, though, after spraining an ankle in one of the competitive practice sessions.

In seven years as a head coach, McKay has a career record of 93-107, including two-year stints each at Portland State, Colorado State and Oregon State.

McKay posted a 37-23 (.627) record at Colorado State, which included a 1999 National Invitational Tournament berth. The Rams defeated Mississippi State and in-state rival Colorado, before losing to eventual tournament champion California.

The 1999-2000 season featured the first year of play for CSU in the Mountain West Conference, and the Rams logged an 18-12 record and a fourth-place finish. A pair of victories over nationally-ranked opponents - the first time that had happened at CSU in a decade - and capturing the title of the second annual Pearl Harbor Classic in Hawaii were some of the highlights of the season. *College Hoops Insider* magazine noticed the success of the 2000 Rams and tabbed McKay as its MWC Coach of the Year.

Before arriving on the Colorado State campus in 1998, McKay served as the head coach at Portland State University. He was actually at PSU for three years. The first season of 1995-96 was spent developing a program that had been dormant for 15 years. McKay led the program to nine victories in the school's first season

(1996-97) since the early 1980s.

After that initial season at Portland State, McKay was named one of six finalists for the Clair Bee Award, given annually to the coach with the most influence and innovation on the game of basketball. The other two finalists were Dean Smith of North Carolina and Mike Krzyzewski of Duke. The 1997-98 PSU team followed with a 15-12 mark and a third-place finish in the Big Sky Conference.

McKay's coaching career began in 1988 as a graduate assistant at the University of Washington. He then made stops as an assistant at Queens College in North Carolina (1989-90) where he worked for current Colorado State head coach Dale Layer, Seattle Pacific (1990-91), Bradley (1991-93), and back to Washington (1993-95). His coaching stints also include serving as an assistant to Jim Molinari at the 1997 World University Games in Italy where the USA captured the gold medal.

Now at the helm of the team he adored as a child, McKay has high hopes for the future success of New Mexico basketball. Armed with an intense work ethic and unwavering devotion to the well-being of the program, McKay is eager to once again show the people of Albuquerque and the nation the power of Lobo pride.

"I'm very confident in myself and my staff, and what we can do with a basketball program." said McKay. "Having grown up with the tradition of Lobo basketball and knowing the success that former coaches have had with this program, I think we have a blueprint that will lead to success. Everyone will be proud to see the program where hopefully we'll get it, and that's the NCAA Tournament. I think fans are going to be really proud of what they see from Lobo basketball."

McKay earned his bachelor of arts degree in Athletic Administration from Seattle Pacific in 1987. A stellar player for the Falcons, McKay left the program as the school's single-season and career recordholder for steals, and he was third in career assists. He still holds the school record with 10 steals in a 1987 game against Pacific Lutheran.

McKay is married to the former Julie Summers. The couple has two sons, Luke and Gabriel, and a daughter, Ellie.

ASSISTANT COACHES

Brad Soucie (Christian Heritage '89)

Brad Soucie has been a part of Ritchie McKay's staff since 1995 when the two helped resurrect the Portland State University program. Soucie followed McKay to Colorado State and Oregon State, and is in his second year as an assistant at New Mexico. At all three previous stops, Soucie has been the recruiting coordinator as well as an on-floor coach. Soucie played a big role in the development of Ruben Douglas, who led the nation in scoring in 2002-03.

Soucie played college basketball at Eastern Michigan for two seasons before transferring to Christian Heritage College in El Cajon, Calif. While at EMU, Soucie helped lead the Eagles to the 1986 NCAA Tournament where he set a first-round record with eight three-pointers against Pitt. Soucie played his final two years at CHC, where he earned his bachelor's degree in Business Administration and later served as an assistant coach for two years.

The 35-year old Soucie played in the NBA summer league with the Cleveland Cavaliers and the Dallas Mavericks. He was also a member of the Athletes-in-Action traveling team. Soucie and his wife Kendra have two children: daughter Mikayla (4) and son Levi (3).



Scott Didrickson (Washington '95)

Didrickson begins his second season on the Lobo staff. He played at the University of Washington when Ritchie McKay was an assistant there from 1993-95. Didrickson joined McKay's staff as an assistant at Colorado State in 1998-99, then moved to Corvallis where he spent two years at Oregon State. Didrickson began his coaching career at Gonzaga in 1997-98. Prior to that, he was an assistant at Mercer Island HS in Washington.

Didrickson completed his playing career at UW in 1995, when he was named team captain. As a junior, he finished fourth in the Pac-10 in three-point field goal percentage (41.2%), and he ranks among the top-10 at UW for career three-pointers made (55) and career three-point FG percentage (36.2%). He was also named to the Pac-10 all-academic team in 1994 and graduated in 1995 with a degree in History.

Didrickson and his wife, Tiffany, have a son, Cade (1).



Duane Broussard (Bradley '93)

Broussard is entering his second year on Ritchie McKay's staff, after spending the previous nine seasons at Bradley University in Peoria, Ill., where he was an assistant to head coach Jim Molinari. Since 1996 his responsibilities for the Braves included recruiting, budget planning and floor coaching.

The 32-year-old Broussard played at Bradley from 1989 to 1993 and served as the program's co-captain as a junior and senior. In addition, his final two years he played for McKay, who was an assistant at Bradley. Broussard capped his collegiate playing career in 1993 by earning the inaugural Downtown Peoria Kiwanis Club Leadership Award in recognition of his positive role-model approach to academics and community service.

The Braves won nearly 59 percent of their games while Broussard was on the coaching staff, an average of almost 18 victories per season. Bradley played in postseason in six of nine years he was on the staff, and the program graduated 19 of 22 seniors who played during his tenure.

Broussard is a native of Sugarland, Texas, and earned degrees in Criminal Justice and Sociology from Bradley in 1993. He continued his education by successfully completing a master's degree program in Public Service Administration from BU in 1997. Broussard and his wife, Holly, have a daughter, McKenzie (3) and a son, McKel (2).

PRESEASON NOTES

SEASON RECAP: The New Mexico Lobos completed their 100th season of basketball in 2002-03 by bowing out of the Mountain West Conference Tournament in the first round. UNM fell to BYU 71-56, in a quarterfinal game.

A thin New Mexico squad finished 10-18 overall, its first losing record in 20 years and only the fourth losing campaign by the Lobos since 1962-63. It's the fewest wins and most losses for UNM since the 1979-80 team went 6-20.

The Lobos were picked to finish seventh in the MWC and that's where they ended up with a 4-10 record. UNM has had three straight losing records in conference play, a string not observed since a four-year slide between 1980-83.

New Mexico failed to complete in postseason (NCAA or NIT) for only the second time since 1983-84. The 1994-95 team did not qualify, finishing 15-15. Prior to 2002-03, UNM had advanced to postseason seven straight years and 18 times in the previous 19 seasons.

A first for the program is that a Lobo led the nation in scoring. Senior guard Ruben Douglas finished with a scoring average of 27.96, nipping Eastern Illinois' Henry Domercant by a single point. Domercant finished at 27.93 ppg.

The Lobos failed to win a road game for the first time since 1979-80 and for only the second time since 1960-61. New Mexico has lost 17 straight road games, it's longest skid since a 37-game drought between 1956-57 and 1959-60.

After sophomore Michael McCowan left the team on Feb. 26, UNM played the last four games with just nine players, seven on scholarship, plus two walk-ons.

Two players departed the team following the 2002-03 season. Sophomores Jamaal Williams and Chad Bell elected to transfer at the end of the 2003 spring semester.

100TH SEASON OF LOBO BASKETBALL: The year-long celebration of the 100th season of men's basketball got underway on Sept. 13, 2002, when more than 60 former players and coaches attended the Lobo Legend Gala at The Pit. Additional highlights included:

- As a culmination of the 100th Season Celebration, the University of New Mexico announced on March 1 the results of more than 2,000 votes cast for the school's all-time coach and all-time team. The final tally:

All-Time Coach: Bob King (1962-72)

MWC TOURNAMENT RECAP

The Lobos had their 100th season of basketball end in the quarterfinals of the Mountain West Conference Tournament in Las Vegas. No. 7 seed UNM was beaten by No. 2 seed BYU, 71-56. Scoring its fewest points of the season, New Mexico was eliminated from the MWC Tournament in the first round for the third time in the past four years.

- Ruben Douglas scored 18 points to become the first New Mexico player to lead the nation in scoring. He finished the season with 783 points in 28 games, a scoring average of 27.96. Douglas recorded his seventh career double-double by adding 11 rebounds, but he was just 5 of 19 from the floor.

- Down 29-23 early in the second half, the Lobos scored seven straight points - five by junior guard Ryan Ashcraft - to regain the lead at 30-29. UNM hit four of its first five shots to start the second period.

- Douglas made two free throws to give UNM a 32-31 edge with 15 minutes left, but the Lobos went cold and BYU responded with a 14-0 burst to grab a 45-32 advantage. The Lobos went more than six minutes without scoring and 8:15 without a basket and were never able to recover.

- Getting solid defensive play and rebounding to start the game, the Lobos held an 18-13 advantage when freshman David Chiotti scored on a great drive to the basket with 4:52 left before halftime.

- BYU ended the half with an 8-0 spurt - capped by Jeff Bower's 3-point basket - and a 25-20 lead at the break. New Mexico's 20 points were a season-low for the first half and tied for a season low in any half in 2002-03. The Lobos were just 9 of 27 from the floor in the first half and missed their last five attempts.

- Douglas was one of four Lobos in double figures. Mark Walters finished with 11 points while Chiotti and Javin Tindall and chipped in with 10 points apiece. The Lobos had no answer for BYU's 6-11 post Rafael Araujo. The 260-pound Brazilian dominated the inside with 19 points and 13 rebounds.

MORE FROM BYU

- Douglas finished his UNM career 5th all-time with 1,782 points in just 86 games...he passed Luc Longley (1,769) in his final game...Douglas ended his collegiate career with 1,998 points, including a year at Arizona

- Douglas fell 2 points short of breaking Kenny Page's school record for single-season scoring average...Page scored 784 points in 28 games in 1979-80, an average of 28.00 points...Douglas had 783 points in 28 games, an average of 27.96

- Mark Walters finished the season with 265 points, the 9th-best total by a Lobo freshman...his 157 rebounds are second only to Kenny Thomas among UNM freshmen...Thomas had 256 in 1995-96



RECAPPING RUBEN DOUGLAS: Senior guard Ruben Douglas enjoyed one of the most prolific offensive seasons in school history. The first Lobo to lead the nation in scoring at 27.96 ppg, Douglas surprisingly became the first Lobo to average more than 20 points a game for an entire season since Hunter Greene did so in 1986-87. Greene averaged 21.1 points during a 35-game campaign 16 years ago. The school record for highest season average is 28.0 ppg, set by Kenny Page in 1979-80. Page finished 4th in the nation in scoring that season.

In less than three full seasons, Douglas became the Mountain West Conference's career scoring leader with 1,782 points. Amazingly, it took him just 22 games to become the MWC single-season scoring recordholder for all games and only nine league tilts to establish a new scoring standard in conference games. Former Lobo Lamont Long held the previous records in both categories (598 and 285 points) set during the 1999-2000 season.

In just 86 games at New Mexico, Douglas finished 3rd in career FT percentage (83.0), 3rd in career 3-pointers made (218), 6th in career 3-point percentage (41.3) and 6th in scoring (1,782 points).

Douglas scored 30 or more points in five straight games between Jan. 27-Feb. 15, tying Page's school record established during the 1979-80 season. Douglas holds school records for most points in three straight games (111) and four consecutive games (143). Douglas tied Marvin Johnson's record by scoring 82 points in consecutive games: 43 at San Diego State and 39 vs. Utah.

Douglas' 43 points against Wyoming on Feb. 15 and at San Diego State on Feb. 24 rank as the 7th-best performances in school history. It's the highest output by a Lobo since Page had 44 against BYU on Jan. 15, 1981. His 43 points at SDSU are the most by a Lobo away from Albuquerque. Willie Long scored 41 at BYU on Jan. 29, 1970.

In conference games, Douglas averaged 32.1 ppg and shot 45.7% (59-129) from 3-point range. He scored 44.5% (449 of 1,008) of the Lobos' total points in MWC affairs.

Douglas also led the team in rebounding, averaging 6.6 a game, including 7.2 in MWC contests. A double-double in four of his last six games, he became the first Lobo to have a double-double in three straight games since 6-7, 260-pound power forward Kenny Thomas did so in 1998-99.

The last Lobo to lead the team in both scoring and rebounding was Thomas in 1998-99. The last time a guard or small forward led the team in rebounding was Hunter Greene in 1986-87. Greene played at 6-foot-7.

Douglas established a school and MWC record by scoring 20 or more points in 16 consecutive games. He scored 20 or more points 49 times in his Lobo career and reached 30 or more points on 15 occasions, including 11 times as a senior. He also had a school-record three 40-point explosions in 2002-03.

Douglas was named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week for his performances in Lobo victories over Northeastern and Indiana-Purdue-Fort Wayne. It's the third player of the week honor of Douglas' career. He averaged 26.5 points and 4.5 rebounds, while making 17-of-34 FGs and 18-of-22 FTs. He converted a three-point play with 5.7 seconds remaining in the game to give the Lobos a 90-88 victory over Northeastern. Twenty-four of his 30 points came in the second half. Against IPFW, Douglas posted 23 points on 7-of-13 FGs, 3-of-6 treys and 6-of-7 FTs.

IF NOT FOR BAD LUCK: The tough times for first-year head coach Ritchie McKay and his staff began back in the summer of 2002 when Shelton Colwell, a 6-9 junior college transfer and a much-needed inside presence, did not qualify academically.

Ashcraft suffered a severely sprained ankle at the Lobo Howl on Oct. 12. He reinjured the ankle later that month and missed UNM's first two exhibition games.

During tryouts in mid-October, the Lobos were excited about the ability of 6-8 junior walk-on post player Zach Volek from Albuquerque La Cueva HS. Volek tore his Achilles' tendon less than a week into practice and never played.

Co-captain Senque Carey had his UNM career end less than two games into his senior season when he suffered a spinal cord injury in the first half against Northwestern State.

Junior guard Javin Tindall missed three games (Dec. 18-28) with the flu and a stress fracture in his ribs.

While going after a loose ball in practice on Jan. 1, Ashcraft took a blow to the head and received a concussion. He did not make the trip to Tennessee.

THIN RANKS IN 2002-03: Carey's absence left the Lobos with just 10 players, including two walk-ons. One of the eight players on scholarship - Ryan Ashcraft - is also a former walk-on. Seven of the 10 players were in their first year at UNM.

Minus Carey, the scholarship players combined for a scant eight years of NCAA Div. I experience when the season began, three of those coming from Ruben Douglas. Two of those years were credited to Ashcraft, who had played a grand total of 27 minutes in his first two seasons. Entering the season, Douglas was the only Lobo who had played more than one year at UNM.

For what is believed to be the first time in school history, the Lobos started four freshmen - David Chiotti, Jeff Hart, Mikal Monette and Mark Walters - in a game. The neophyte quartet was joined by Douglas in a Dec. 21 game against Southern Utah.

THE 3-POINT STORY

- The Lobos averaged 7.9 treys in 2002-03 (222 in 28 games), the third-highest season average in school history...only the 1993-94 team (9.7, 300 in 31 games) and the 1997-98 team (9.4, 301 in 32 games) made more per game ...the most they made in three seasons under Fran Fraschilla was 183 in 2000-01
- New Mexico made 11-23 (48%) shots against Colorado State and a season-high 15-26 (57.7%) attempts against Wyoming
- The last 20 games, the Lobos converted 40.1% (160-399) of their shots from 3-point compared to 29% (62-214) the first 8 games
- UNM has made a 3-pointer in 396 straight games, the 11th-longest streak in NCAA Div. I history...the last time the Lobos failed to connect was Jan. 3, 1991 at Colorado State when they missed on eight attempts...UNLV, which has never failed to make a 3 since the shot became rule in 1986-87, is the all-time leader at 539 straight

- The Lobos made 40 of 53 FTs in the 76-69 victory over No. 22 Utah on March 1...the last time New Mexico made and attempted more free throws in a game was against Boston University on Dec. 30, 1980...the Lobos were 45 of 55 from the line in a 107-87 victory

- In what appears to be a first in the history of Lobo basketball, a New Mexico team had 9 or fewer turnovers in four straight games: 7 at Utah, 6 against Air Force, 9 against Wyoming and 9 against Colorado State...turnovers have been charted since the 1969-70 season, although team totals are official only since 1975-76

- UNM committed just 174 turnovers the last 17 games (10.2 a game) compared to 157 in the first 11 games (14.3 a game)...for the season, the Lobos were guilty of 331 errors, or 11.82 a game, which is the second-lowest average in school history...the lowest average for one season is 11.70 (398 in 34 games) in 2000-01

- The Lobos were 8-3 when allowing less than 70 points, but 2-15 when the opponent reached 70 or more

- Jamaal Williams' 25 points at UNLV are the most by a Lobo reserve since Brian Hayden canned 26 against Cal State Northridge on Dec. 28, 1994...Williams' 15 rebounds at UNLV are the most since Patrick Dennehy had 17 last year against Alcorn State

- Freshman David Chiotti came into the Western New Mexico

game having scored just 18 career points in his first 14 games as a Lobo...he surpassed that total in the first half against WNMU, tallying 20 points on his way to a career-best 21...that's the most points by a Lobo freshman since John Robinson II scored 24 at Fresno State on Jan. 4, 1999...Chiotti also tied a career-high with 9 rebounds against WNMU

- Four of the Lobos' 10 wins were by four points or less

- UNM gathered more assists than turnovers in a game 12 times...the Lobos were 7-5 in those games
