CAA POSTSEASTON HISTORY NOTES

- Delaware won the CAA title and was ranked No. 7 in the AP poll at the end of regular season. It was Delaware's first trip to the NCAA's since 2007 and third overall.
- Six teams earned postseason bids in 2011-12 with Delaware getting the NCAA bid and five others being selected by the WNIT (JMU, Hofstra, UNCW, VCU and Drexel).
- This was a 7th consecutive season at least three CAA teams earned bids for postseason tournaments.
- Delaware's 31 wins were the most since ODU's 31 wins in 2008, but short of ODU's mark of 34 wins in 1996-97.
- Delaware is the third CAA team in the past four years to win the CAA tournament, following back-to-back by JMU and a win by Drexel in 2009.
- For Old Dominion in 2008, that marked a run of 17 consecutive years of winning the championship.
- Prior to ODU's run that started in 1992, Richmond had won a pair, James Madison had won four and East Carolina had won the first two CAA Championships ever played.
- Seven teams earned postseason bids in 2009-10. The CAA got three NCAA bids in 2007 (ODU, Delaware and JMU)
- The tournament site moves around. In 2010-11 and '11-12 it was held at a new venue for the CAA: The Show Place Arena in Upper Marlboro, Md., just outside Washington D.C.
- These two years in Upper Marlboro marked the first time the tournament has been held at a neutral site since 1998 when it was held at the Richmond Coliseum.

Arizona converted its free throws to hang on and post a 79-66 win over Georgia State on Sunday afternoon in front of 708 at the GSU Sports Arena.

The visiting Wildcats (2-0) from the Pac-12 made 26-of-32 free throws (81.3%) to go with 9-of-20 3-point baskets to secure their second win of the season. It was a homecoming for Georgian Candice Warthen (Warrenton/Warren County HS) and she dazzled with 36 points, including 5-of-8 outside that arc. All-Pac-12 guard Davellyn added 19 points with 11-of-12 free throws, while forward Erica Barnes had a double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds.

Host Georgia State would never give in and had the lead back down to single digits at nine points (73-64) with 55 seconds left in their season opener. Guard Kendra Long led GSU with 18 points, but was just 2-of-10 outside the arc. Forward Tiffany Anderson added 11 points, while Chan Harris had eight points, six rebounds and four blocked shots. Freshman Kayla Nolan added nine points and five rebounds.

Arizona held a slight rebounding edge, 42-36, while scrappy Georgia State kept pressure on with 17 forced turnovers, 12 steals and six blocked shots.

In the first half of hot shooting, Arizona started with 11-of-17 baskets (64.7%), but GSU fired back with 10-of-19 (52.6%) as the scored was still 29-25 with 7:47 left. Arizona closed with a 12-5 run to take a 41-30 lead at halftime.

In the second half, GSU closed back to 44-38 at 17:12 and 47-40 at 16:39, but Arizona scored 11 straight points in the key run of the game to open the lead up to 58-40 at 10:39. GSU wouldn't quit and began to whittle back into the lead to get it back to single digits by the closing minute.

Arizona shot 55.6% in the first half, but just 28% in the second half. The Wildcats did make 20-24 FT in the 2nd half. GSU shot 40.6% for the game, but just 55% on its 20 free throws attempted.

"Well, we competed hard the whole game," said head coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "Arizona is a good team, capable of scoring in a lot of ways, but we kept coming at them to try to answer. I guess I can say we didn't give up, but we didn't win, so that is what matters."

Florida State scored 55 points in the second half to pull away from visiting GSU and post a 94-74 win.

In the first half, the teams battled through seven ties and seven lead changes with Georgia State starting the game with a 5-0 lead and Florida State closing with a 10-2 run to take a 39-31 lead into the locker room at halftime.

The game was never more than four points either way in the first half as the teams traded small spurts. The score was 22-22 at seven minutes, 27-27 at five minutes, and the last time at 29-29 at 4:15. Davis scored five straight from 3:37 to 2:15 to start the FSU run. Cierra Clayton hit a big three from the corner on a forced shot with the 30-second clock expiring to make it 39-29 with 37 seconds and Chan Harris closed with the final basket of the half for GSU.

In the second half, FSU (3-2) was leading 58-50 with 12:51 left when All-CAA forward Chan Harris picked up her fourth foul and went to the bench. Florida State capitalized with a 11-0 run to up it to 69-50 with 8:30 left. When Harris returned with 7:33, she hit a basket and then picked up her fifth foul in less than a minute and was gone for the game.

Chelsea Davis came off the bench to lead FSU with 25 points, while guard Alexa Deluzio added 20 more from the backcourt in front of the home crowd of 2,092. All-American 6-foot-4 center wasn't a factor, scoring just five points through the first 35 minutes of the game, adding some late points after the margin got to 20 points and the reserves were playing to finish with 11 points on her evening.

Georgia State got 18 points and five assists from sophomore guard Kendra Long with 4-of-8 three-point baskets, while Harris had 12 points (5-of-8 field goals)and seven rebounds in her 26 minutes. GSU shot 19 fewer free throws and was whistled for 28 fouls. Georgia State's tallest player, 6-foot-3 Cody Paulk got her first two fouls within the first four minutes of the game and sat most of the first half.

GSU hit 7-of-13 treys with four by Long. Both teams shot 42% for the game with FSU making one more basket (27-of-64) to GSU's 26-of-61.

"This was a very physical game and FSU is a good, strong and physical team," said Coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "We showed a lot of hustle and played well in the first half, but everyone has to step up a little more and make more plays."

Kendra Long scored 20 points and Cody Paulk added 10 points, seven rebounds and three blocks as the Georgia State women's basketball earned its first victory of the season with a 70-56 win over Campbell in the opening game of the Starwood Hotels of Atlanta Thanksgiving Classic Friday at the GSU Sports Arena.

Long went 8-for-17 from the field with three three-pointers, missing her career high by just one point as GSU (1-2) handed Campbell (4-1) its first loss of the season. Junior point guard Jerlisa Taylor contributed nine points, seven assists, five rebounds and two steals for the Panthers, who face Appalachian State Saturday at 4 p.m. on day two of the Starwood Hotels of Atlanta Thanksgiving Classic.

After a first half with six ties, GSU made its decisive run of the game early in the second half, building a 33-30 lead at 19:27 and scoring eight straight points, six of them by Taylor, to open a 41-30 advantage with 15:08 left. The host Panthers still led by 11 points at the 10:00-minute mark, when a trey by Kiera Gaines of Campbell cut it to 51-43. But, GSU answered with four quick points to make it 55-43 at 8:28 and the lead remained in double figures the rest of the game.

"We didn't play together today and I was disappointed in that, but it is a win, so that makes it pretty, I guess," said Coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "Our defense had its moments today and there was some effort involved in that, but we can still play better. Kendra Long is quicker this year and has added another dimension to her game with a variety of shots now."

The Georgia State defense forced 19 Campbell turnovers,made seven steals and blocked five shots. The Panthers held Campbell to 33 percent shooting in the second half and 36 percent for the game.

GSU, which had won 19 straight games when scoring 70 or more points before Monday's 94-74 loss at Florida State, made that 70 number work for the 20th time in the last 21 games they have scored 70.

Today, 11 different players scored for the Panthers and six different GSU players had five or more rebounds.

Georgia State committed 31 turnovers and shot 27.9 percent in helping Appalachian State earn an 82-58 win in the final game of the Starwood Hotels of Atlanta Thanksgiving Classic at the GSU Sports Arena.

Five players scored in double figures for Appalachian State (4-1), led by Classic MVP selection Chakeitha Weldon (Atlanta's Mays HS) with 15 points.

Georgia State (1-3) was led by senior forward Chan Harris with a personal-best 19 rebounds to go with 18 points and three blocked shots. Kendra Long and Brittany Johnson added nine points apiece.

The 31 turnovers by GSU were the most in more than a decade as the Panthers turned over 15 possessions in the first half and 16 possessions in the second half. Harris was one rebound shy of joining just the five others who ever had a 20-rebound game in school history.

Georgia State started the game with a 12-5 lead through seven minutes, but the visiting Mountaineers answered to tie the game at 12 with 9:57 in the first half. The teams were never more than five points apart in the first half until Appalachian State took a 30-27 lead with 1:38 and scored a basket and then a three-point basket in the closing second to take a 35-27 lead into the break.

Appalachian State took advantage of GSU's mistakes to start the second half with a 10-3 run to make it 45-30 with 15:31 to go. It was 53-42 with 9:31 to go when Appalachian State began to pull away and the final score was the largest margin of the game.

Georgia State dominated on the boards with a decisive 55-36 margin, sparked by 28 offensive rebounds. But, the 27.9% shooting compounded with the 31 turnovers did them no good with that advantage. GSU's Ashley Watson made three of four free throws in the closing two minutes to help seal the win. Watson finished with nine points, including 7-of-10 free throws.

The visiting Panthers shot 58.8% in the second half (10-of-17), getting the ball inside for layups.

We came out with a lot of energy at the start and finished with a strong effort down the finish," said coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "We showed aggressiveness by getting to the line 35 times, but we also got ourselves in foul trouble and had to played four guards a lot. Overall, we got it done on the road and that's good, but there are a lot of things I am not happy with, like the rebounding deficit."

The Panthers tried a new starting line-up this game, starting two freshmen (Nolan and Watson), GSU's defense held WCU to 29.6% shooting in the first half and 37.5% for the game.

HOFSTRA 86, GEORGIA STATE 71

With five players scoring in double figures, Hofstra (6-1) raced to a fast 86-71 win over Georgia State Sunday afternoon.

The up-tempo game included 150 field goal attempts, 43 free throw attempts, 100 rebounds, 49 turnovers, 29 steals and 11 blocked shots

Georgia State (2-4) had several early leads and the game was tied at 40 with 18:25 to go in the game. Visiting Hofstra then went on a 7-0 run that grew to a 15-3 spurt to take a 55-43 lead with 12:36 on the clock for the decisive run. Six different Hofstra players scored during the 15-3 run.

GSU got 17 points from freshman guard Kayla Nolan in her limited 22 minutes with foul trouble, with senior forward Chan Harris having a double-double day with 11 points, 11 rebounds and two blocks. Sophomore guard Kendra Long added 10 more points for the Panthers.

Hofstra, averaging 83 points per game with an average winning margin of 15 points, was led by senior guard Nicole Capurso with 20 points, including her 1,000th career point. Senior point guard Candice Bellocchio provided 16 points and eight assists. The 86 points were just the fifth highest of the seven games this year for Hofstra, which has topped 90 points three times.

GSU shot 42.3% from the field (30-71) to Hofstra's 38.0%(30-79), but GSU left 11 free points at the free throw line, making just 42% on 8-of-19, compared to Hofstra's 79% at 19-of-24. Hofstra forced 30 Georgia State turnovers and had 16 steals, while GSU forced 19 Hofstra turnovers and made 13 steals. GSU held the rebounding advantage at 52-48.

Hofstra had broken from a 30-30 tie with 2:09 in the first half with an 8-3 run to take a 38-33 lead into the halftime break.

"First, we know we have to take a lot better care of the basketball and make free throws because you can't win a game with 30 turnovers," said head coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "Hofstra is a good team as their record and scoring indicates. They have a lot of veterans and a lot of players who can score, not just one or two like some teams. We started two freshmen and a sophomore and know we will get better as the year goes on, so we think we'll be real competitive this year and start getting some wins soon."

Georgia Tech posted an 85-50 decision over Georgia State to spark Georgia State to a 65-59 win over Kennesaw State Friday night at the GSU Sports Arena, spurred by forcing GSU to 26 turnovers and holding them to 29.6% shooting.

The Jackets (7-3) broke the game open midway through the second half, building a 45-32 lead at 16:32 into a 71-36 lead at 8:47 with a 26-4 run as they held GSU to two lay-ups in that eight minutes.

Four Yellow Jackets scored in double figures, topped by 6-foot-5 center Sasha Goodlett with 16 points on 7-of-11 shooting. Guard Tyaunna Marshall added 15 points.

Georgia State got 12 points from point guard Jerlisa Taylor, along with 11 points from guard Kendra Long, to go with 10 rebounds and nine points from forward Chan Harris. The Panthers were just 1-for-8 outside the three-point arc, while visiting Tech knocked down 6-of-18 three-pointers.

Georgia Tech held a 48-34 rebound advantage thanks to Georgia State's many misses (45 field goal attempts missed and 18 free throw misses).

Georgia State struggled with a 19.2% percent first half, advantage into halftime.

"Obviously, the first half was flat-out horrible and you can't win shooting like that," said head coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener.

"We couldn't even make free throws standing still (17-of-35, 48.6%) so we will continue to focus on shot selection and

"We played with some energy, forced some turnovers (18), blocked some shots (7) and got ourselves to the free throw line by being aggressive (35 free throws)," Baldwin-Tener added. "But, you have to make shots and score points to win, so that is our priority to get better at that right now."

This was the 35th meeting in the city series as Tech extended their advantage to 24-11 all-time.

Georgia State will leave less than 12 hours from the end of this game on Saturday morning for the Bahamas for the SunSplash Shootout with games on Monday and Tuesday nights in Nassau.

Georgia State shot 57.7% in the second half and 52.9% for the game in racing to a 79-68 win over High Point University in their opening game of the SunSplash Shootout Monday night at Kendal Isaacs National Gymnasium.

The Panthers balanced scoring sheet had eight players score eight or more points, topped by 11 points in 13 minutes off the bench from junior guard Sade Means. Senior forward Chan Harris scored 10 points, grabbed six rebounds, made four steals, created four assists and had two blocks. Freshman center Alana Beroth, in just her second game as a Panther, scored 10 points and pulled down six rebounds in 17 minutes. Center Cody Paulk had eight points, six boards and two blocks.

GSU (4-5) got started with a 12-0 run in the first half that helped them turn a 7-3 deficit into a 15-7 lead just over 10 minutes into the game. When High Point closed to 23-22 at 3:53, Georgia State had another 11-4 run to end the first half and take a 34-25 lead into the locker room.

In the second half, Georgia State had the final strong run with the score at 58-49 with 7:19 to play. At that point, GSU had another 11-0 run to open a 20-point lead at 69-49 with 5:09 left to play.

The Panthers of GSU held a 44-38 rebounding advantage with five different players having five or more rebounds tonight, GSU's defense had 10 steals and forced 21 High Point turnovers as they held those Panthers to 21.2% shooting in the first half and 29.7% for the game.

"I was pleased with our energy level tonight," head coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener said. "Our defense was pretty solid tonight and we took it strong inside the paint tonight on offense. I think our roster being deeper really helped us as we got a lot of good things from a lot of people."

High Point entered the game with a RPI rating of No. 86 and these Panthers fall to 4-4 on the young season. Guard Erin Reynolds led them with 20 points.

GSU's 79 points were a season high and the fourth game with 70 or more points scored. They've won 21 of the last 23 games when scoring 70 or more. Tonight's game included 54 fouls whistled, with High Point shooting 38 free throws and Georgia State shooting 35 from the charity line.

Southern Illinois Edwardsville used nine three-point baskets to pull away from Georgia State for a 63-49 win in the second day of the SunSplash Shootout.

The Cougars (6-5) from the Ohio Valley Conference edged ahead at halftime, 31-25, with five treys.

In the second half, they made four-of-their-first seven three-point attempts to open a 50-33 advantage with 11 minutes left. At that point, SIU Edwardsville had made more three-point baskets (9-of-18, 50%) than two-point baskets

Georgia State (4-6) led several times early, including 13-9 with 14:16 on the clock, and even held a rebound advantage for the game (35-32).

But, 27 turnovers slowed the offensive progress to go against SIUE's hot outside shooting.

SIUE scored 33 points off Georgia State's 27 turnovers, while GSU managed just 14 points from SIUE's turnovers. SIUE had 10 fast-break points compared to a single breakaway basket by the Panthers.

GSU got a double-double senior forward Chan Harris with 10 points and 10 rebounds. Kendra Long added 3-of-5 outside the arc for nine more points for the Panthers.

SIUE got its outside spark from Jazmin Hill, who made 4-of-5 treys, for 12 points. Inside Raven Berry finished with her double-double of 10 points and 10 rebounds.

The key stretch proved to be the first nine minutes of the second half when the Cougars went on a 19-6 run, sparked by the four of seven three-point baskets.

GSU played 12 players and all 12 scored, with 10 grabbing at least one rebound, as Coach Baldwin-Tener sought a spark from anyone to ignite a rally.

Georgia State will return to Atlanta and take a few days of holiday break time before returning to practice on Dec. 26.

GEORGIA STATE 68 JACKSONVILLE STATE 60

With four players scoring in double figures, Georgia State claimed a 68-60 win over Jacksonville State Wednesday night at Pete Mathews Arena.

Trailing 33-30 at the half, GSU outscored the host Gamecocks 38-27 in the second half to improve to 5-6.

"We came back out and played the second half tonight like we wanted to win," coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener said, "We were lackadaisical on defense in the first half, but picked up the intensity and got some turnovers, steals and blocks to get us started. We are figuring out how to win on the road, so with this young team and new players, every building block helps."

GSU had fallen behind early by 10 points at 19-9 at 11:45 and were down their largest margin at 24-13 with 7:45. But, a rally closed the gap back to 33-30 at halftime with eight points from the paint.

In the first four minutes of the second half, GSU claimed a 43-39 lead with a 13-6 start to the second half. Jacksonville State's final rally tied the game at 49 and 51 with 6:21 to go But, a quick 6-0 run pushed it back up to 57-51 with 5:11. JSU closed to 63-59 with 42 seconds, but Jerlisa Taylor made one of two free throws Kendra Long nailed her two free throws to help seal the win.

GSU held a 50-42 rebound advantage, forced 23 turnovers, made 10 steals and blocked seven shots. But, the Panthers hurt themselves by making just 10-of-23 free throws (43.5%). That meant GSU shot better from the field (44.3%) than from the free throw line.

Georgia State defeated Jacksonville State for the sixth straight time and improved the series record to 22-5 all-time vs. the Gamecocks. This game included eight lead changes.

The Panthers used their bench again, playing 12 players, with the bench players providing 27 of the 68 points to go with 18 rebounds.

With four players scoring in double figures, Georgia State Georgia State opened the new year with a 66-50 win over Bethune-Cookman Monday night at the GSU Sports Arena.

The Panthers (6-6 overall) built their largest lead of 27 points with five minutes to go in the game and was able to use all 13 players extensively today.

"Our press forced turnovers and got us some scoring opportunities," said Coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "It helped to play all the young kids and help them gain some confidence for the CAA season."

That GSU defense forced 27 turnovers, made 15 steals and blocked 7 shots, while holding Bethune-Cookman to 39% shooting. GSU has five freshmen and two transfers.

GSU got exactly half its points from the bench (33) as 12 of the 13 players scored, while the bench played 102 of the total 200 player minutes logged.

GSU took early control with an 11-0 run to gain control at 19-12 with 8:15 left in the half. The Panthers built that on to a 30-19 margin at halftime.

In the second half, a big 12-0 run increased the margin to 49-23 at 10:48 as everyone was contributing for the Panthers. GSU's largest lead was 60-33 of 27 points with at 4:53.

Bethune-Cookman University saw its two-game win

Georgia State finishes 6-5 in non-conference games and is 0-1 in Colonial Athletic Association play as it now heads into the exclusive CAA games for the remainder of the season.

"This non-conference season was a step in the right direction as our schedule was in the top 75 toughest in the country, so we got some good experience and gained a little confidence to head into the tough CAA (7th rated of the 32 Division I conferences)," said Baldwin-Tener.

Old Dominion's senior forward Tia Lewis, a Georgia native, scored a career-high 30 points to lead her team to a 68-59 Colonial Athletic Association victory over Georgia State.

ODU opened a 13-point halftime lead and grew the advantage to 18 points at 50-32 with 14:48 to go. But, GSU's bench rallied and closed that gap down to just four points, 59-55, with five minutes to play and possession of the ball. ODU made free throws down the stretch to close out the win.

Head coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener elected to go with young players in the second half as four freshmen all logged 20 or more minutes.

The Panthers bench scored 33 of the 59 points this evening, Junior forward Nicole Hargraves led with 10 points in 11 minutes, while junior Tiffany Anderson added nine points and a team-best seven rebounds. Freshman Kayla Nolan had six points, six rebounds, six assists and four steals. Freshman Miranda Smith had six points, five rebounds and three assists, while freshman Ashley Watson also added six points. Leading second-leading scorer Chan Harris had two points in her 11 minutes, starting center Cody Paulk had two points in her nine minutes and leading assist-leader Jerlisa Taylor had two points and two assist in her 15 minutes.

"We came out flat at the start and I was not pleased with the effort, and certainly tried to let the team know that at halftime," Baldwin-Tener said.

"The group of kids that played the second half competed, fought and played with a lot of energy. I am proud of the way they tried to win and outscored ODU in the second half."

In the second half, GSU basically played with four guards, using 5-foot-9 Tiffany Anderson as the post player. It actually worked as GSU held a 20-14 rebound advantage in the second half and 36-35 margin for the game. The Panthers got more aggressive in the second half and outscored ODU, 33-29, while holding ODU to 39 percent shooting in the second half.

"We gave up way too many easy shots and uncontested baskets in that first half," Baldwin-Tener repeated. "We never got to the foul line in the first half and that speaks loudly of what kind of effort we were giving. We have to learn from this, be ready to play a full 40 minutes, and be prepared from the opening tip."

James Madison ran its winning streak to four games as the Dukes posted a 62-50 win over Georgia State in a defensive battle Sunday afternoon at the GSU Sports Arena.

The Dukes (11-3, 2-1, No. 32 RPI) forced GSU into 19 turnovers and held the Panthers to 30.2% shooting. But, host GSU (6-8, 0-3) actually forced JMU into more turnovers (22), while holding JMU to 31.7% shooting as the Panthers also had 16 steals and blocked 9 shots to match the defensive tempo. This was a fourth straight opponent JMU held to 50 or fewer points as they allow just 56 a game on the season.

GSU started four freshmen today and one of them led the Panthers in scoring. Guard Miranda Smith had 11 points (4-for-5), while freshman center Alana Beroth added six points and five rebounds. Nine Panthers scored as Sade Means and Chan Harris added seven points, while Kendra Long and Cody Paulk each added six points.

A huge key also in today's game was James Madison's 50-34 rebound advantage that saw the Dukes grab 24 offensive rebounds and score 16 second-chance points, pretty much the amount of difference in the game.

That rebounding wasn't lost on head coach Sharon Baldwin- Tener. "Boxing out for rebounds is always an emphasis from day one. Obviously, we did a poor job of that today. But, overall our defense to that point was pretty good effort as we forced the 22 turnovers and hindered their shooting percentage. But, we didn't finish the defensive stop by boxing out and getting the rebound."

"You won't win many games scoring 50 points and our shooting today was inexcusable," she added. "The number of chippies and close-in shots we missed was staggering. But, I guess the kids played with some intensity and are learning as they play at the college level after being high school stars."

James Madison got control early with a 9-0 run to take a 4-4 tie into a 13-4 lead in the first five minutes. GSU started just 4-for-20 from the field and that led to a 24-10 deficit with eight minutes left in the first half. The defense kept GSU close as it was just 34-25 at the halftime break.

In the second half, JMU grew the 36-27 lead with an 8-0 run to make it 44-27 at 17:18. The Dukes had the largest lead of 20 points at 60-40 with 5:17 as Gill scored 10 straight points. GSU then scored 10 straight to close to 60-50 with 1:05 left.

HOFSTRA 80 GEORGIA STATE 67

Georgia State dropped an 80-67 Colonial Athletic Association decision to Hofstra Thursday evening at the Mack Sports Complex.

Hofstra, the nation's No. 12 scoring team and No. 33 in RPI, got an early lead that the Panthers could never overcome, even though GSU outscored the Pride in the second half.

All-America power forward Shante Evans led co-first place Hofstra (12-3, 4-0) with 26 points (10-of-21 field goals) and 12 rebounds.

Georgia State (6-9, 0-4) got 19 points on 9-for-12 shooting from sophomore guard Kendra Long. Tiffany Anderson had 10 points, 7 rebounds and 5 steals in a good effort for the Panthers. Point guard Jerlisa Taylor added 10 more points and four assists.

The visiting Panthers fell behind by 43-27 at halftime but didn't quit as they outscored the fast-pace offense Pride, 40-37 in the second half. Hofstra had built a lead as big as 21 points, but GSU kept fighting back and had the margin down to 10 points at 74-64 with 3:18 to go.

"We settled down in the second half and played a little better," said head coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "But, we did guard anyone in the first half and we should have been more ready to play better at the start of the game."

"With this young team, we will continue working on the basics of basketball, trying to eliminate turnovers and doing a better job of boxing out for rebounds."

GSU actually got off more shots than Hofstra, 78-76, making 29 to Hofstra's 30. But, the difference came at the free throw line where the host Pride nailed 16-of-26, while GSU only got to the line 15 times, making 8.

The Panther defense improved in the second half to finish with 20 forced turnovers on the Pride, while making 12 steals and blocking six shots. GSU had 18 turnovers and Hofstra had 10 steals. Hofstra held a 58-44 rebound advantage and had 22 offensive rebounds, while GSU battled for 15 offensive rebounds.

Both teams used their full rosters as 10 players scored for each team.

Six of Georgia State's nine losses this year have been to team's in the top 50 RPI of the 343 Division I schools.

Georgia State dropped an 80-67 Colonial Athletic Associa Drexel defeated Georgia State, 65-38, Sunday in a Colonial Athletic Association game at the Daskalakis Center.

With a temperature of 26 degrees outside, the visiting Panthers were equally as cold shooting indoors. The Panthers shot just 24% from the field in the first half, 26.9% for the second half and 25.5% for the game (13 of 51 attempts). GSU shot only 55 percent standing still at the free throw line (10-of-18).

The 38 points were a season low by 11 points for the Panthers, who fall to 6-10 overall and 0-5 in the CAA.

Host Drexel won its third straight and moves to 4-1 in the CAA and 8-7 overall.

Georgia State did not have a player reach double figures in scoring, with Kendra Long's eight points, on 3-for-12 shooting, topping the cold offense. Sade Means had seven points off the bench. Chan Harris led with seven rebounds.

Drexel got 20 points from All-CAA star Kamile Nacickaite and 16 points from guard Hollie Mershon on 7-for-9 shooting, to go with her team-best nine rebounds.

Host Drexel shot 60 percent in the second half and 49 percent for the game. Drexel held a 42-30 rebound advantage, thanks to Georgia State's steady barrage of missed shots. The 30 by GSU marked a season low total, influenced by Drexel making its shots and not allowing many opportunities to even get a rebound. Drexel shot just 45 times, a season-low attempts

Georgia State had a season-best with just 12 turnovers, improving over the 15 from the season-opening game vs. Arizona. It marked a fourth straight game the turnovers have gone down.

Drexel jumped out early to an 18-4 lead as GSU hit just two baskets in the first seven minutes. It was 30-15 Drexel at the half. GSU went until 14:09 of the second half without a basket and were down 41-20 by that point. The final margin was Drexel's largest lead of the game.

OLD DOMINION 71 GEORGIA STATE 60

Mairi Buchan came off the bench to score a career-best 16 points to spark Old Dominion to a 71-60 win over Georgia State in Colonial Athletic Association women's basketball at the GSU Sports Arena.

With the game tied at 46-46 with 12:50 to go, Buchan nailed back-to-back three-point baskets to put ODU in the lead for good. And, when GSU closed back to 61-55 with 6:51, ODU got a lay-up and then Buchan swished her fourth three-pointer of the game at 4:52 to make it a double-digit lead for the first time of the evening. Buchan, a junior 6-foot-2 center from Scotland, had never made more than one three-point basket in a game before and was 2-for-21 on the season before making her 4-of-6 treys tonight.

Georgia State (6-11, 0-6) was led by freshman center Alana Beroth, who scored 15 points on a perfect 7-for-7 in the paint. Senior forward Chan Harris was solid with 13 points on 6-for-9 field goals to go with 12 rebounds for her 20th career double-double game.

ODU (6-12, 3-3) had three other players in double figures besides Buchan. Jackie Cook and Tia Lewis each had 12 points, while JoNiquia Guilford added 11 more points.

Georgia State won the rebound battle, 44-41, but ODU had an important 17 offensive rebounds to help its cause for second-chance points (14 on the evening). The Panthers had 27 turnovers, which helped lead to 30 ODU points off of those miscues. GSU, who leads the CAA in blocked shots with 5.3 a game, added six more tonight with Beroth swatting away four shots.

"Our three big people did some good things inside tonight (scoring 37 points, making 17 of 22 shots and getting 21 rebounds), but we couldn't shoot it from the outside and our guards probably didn't even hit 20% of their shots this evening," said coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "The kids played hard, but we didn't help ourselves at all with the turnovers and allowing the second-chance attempts by not getting more rebounds than we did."

Towson guard Krystal Parnell hit six-of-six free throws in the final 1:09 to lead the visitors to a 56-52 win over GSU.

Towson, who has gotten to the free throw more than its opponents in 17 of its 18 games this year, accomplished that again today, making 21-of-36 free throws. Over the final five minutes of the game, the Tigers made 8-of-12 free throws and made just one basket (2:42 on the clock). GSU shot 13-of-18 from the charity stripe, exactly one half of what Towson at-

Georgia State closed the gap to two points three different times in the final five minutes, but each time Towson got to the line and upped the margin. The crucial play came when GSU's Brittany Johnson made a steal with 33 seconds left and the score 52-50, giving GSU a chance to tie or take the lead. But, a double-dribble call with 16 seconds wasted that golden opportunity.

Towson (12-6, 3-4) was led by Parnell's 16 points (7-10 FT) and guard Tanisha McTiller's 16 points (despite 5-for-20 field goal shooting).

Georgia State (6-12, 0-7) got a double-double game from Chan Harris with 13 points and 10 rebounds, while guard Kendra Long added 13 points. Guard Jerlisa Taylor added nine rebounds, six assists and five points.

Georgia State held Towson to 25 percent field goal shooting, but the Tigers made up for that with a 51-43 rebound advantage that included 26 offensive rebounds, leading to 19 second-chance points.

The game had four lead changes and two ties in the first half as Towson built a 25-19 halftime lead. They grew the lead to 32-19 at the start of the second half (17:02) before GSU climbed back into it at 39-38 with 10:25 to play and 41-40

"They didn't shoot free throws all that well today, but No. 1 made them when they needed them at the end," said coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "We didn't make our lay-ups today, or that many other shots for that matter, and we have to do a better job and take what they're giving us. The team played with intensity those final 5-10 minutes and if we learn to play like that for all 40 minutes, we might be OK."

Host James Madison (15-4, 6-2) defeated Georgia State 76-45 in a Colonial Athletic Association game Thursday night.

In one sense, the game was close as JMU got off 73 shots and GSU got off 71 shots, while GSU shot 16 free throws, two more than JMU. But, the big difference was Georgia State couldn't get the ball in the basket, making just 17 of those 71 for a 23.9 shooting percentage. Meanwhile, JMU was knocking their shots down, including 6-of-10 three-point shots in the first half alone as they made 28 shots.

Georgia State (7-13, 0-7) got 11 points and 11 rebounds but freshman center Alana Beroth, even though she made just 4-of-11 shots under the bucket. Senior forward Chan Harris added 11 points and four rebounds. Junior guard Jerlisa Taylor added eight rebounds, five points and three assists.

James Madison, a top 30 RPI team, has won 18 of its last 19 on its home court. Tonight, guard Kirby Burkholder led with 22 points, including 6-of-8 three-point shots from a variety of spots on the court. Guard Tarik Hislop added 16 more points on 7-of-15 field goals.

The board battle was even most of the night until late when JMU ended with a 57-45 advantage because of Georgia State's 54 missed shots. Georgia State got 24 offensive rebounds. The Panthers, who lead the league with five blocked shots a game, added six more rejections tonight.

"We did pay more attention to taking care of the basket-ball tonight and we crashed the glass hard most of the time," said coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "But, we sure had a hard time getting the ball in the basket no matter where we shot it from. A whole lot of those misses were easy and makeable shots, so that was disappointing."

Sophomore Victoria Smith started the game and scored the first basket as she became the 12th different player to start a game this season for GSU. No player has started every game.

JMU broke from a 13-9 lead at 11:54 to open a 23-9 advantage at 9:21, sparked by a pair of treys from Burkholder. Then at 29-16 at 4:33, the Dukes went on a 14-4 run to finish the half and take a 43-20 lead into halftime.

Towson came from behind to defeat GSU, 63-59, in OT. Georgia State had a three-point lead with a minute to play, but made just one free throw on three-one-and-one opportunities to allow Towson to get the ball back and tie the game for the 13th time at 49 with seven seconds left on a lay-up. GSU did have a final attempt in regulation at the buzzer on an extralong, off-balance attempt.

In overtime, the teams traded baskets for the 14th tie at 51 when Towson got a basket from Deree Fooks and then a basket and free throw from Krystal Parnell to open a 56-51 advantage. GSU closed to 56-54 with 1:51, but the hosts got a basket from Sheree Ledbetter and free throws from Parnell to claim the win.

Georgia State (7-14, 1-10) got a career-best 21 points, 13 rebounds, 5 steals and 3 blocks from junior center Cody Paulk. Senior forward Chan Harris contributed 12 rebounds and 10 points.

In the first half, the teams changed the lead seven times and were tied four times before Georgia State scored the final five points of the half to take a three-point lead into the break. In the see-saw first half, GSU scored six straight from 8:48 to 7:50 to open a five-point lead. But, the host Tigers responded with a 7-0 burst to retake the lead at 20-18 with 2:00 to play. The visiting Panther then made their final run to gain the halftime advantage, 23-20.

"We didn't take care of the basketball, especially in the second half (25 total turnovers) and we didn't make our free throws at the end, so we didn't get the win we had a chance to on the road," said coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "We did some good things, played hard, and all that, but we did not finish the game.

The Panthers defense today held Towson to just 28.4% shootsing, forced 20 turnovers, had 15 steals and blocked five shots, but the Panthers turnovers (25) were a key. Perhaps the biggets stat was GSU shooting just 7-of-14 from the free throw line (50%) and not getting the second shot on the one-and-one opportunities.

Andrews, a 5-2 guard from Redan High in Stone Mountain, scored a game-high 22 points and had seven assists for the Seahawks (15-8, 8-4 CAA, No. 72 RPI). UNCW's game-winner was the Seahawks ninth three-point basket of the game (9of-20, 45%) with four by Tawanna Lee (16 points) and three by Andrews.

Tonight's game included eight ties and eight lead changes. The host Panthers had a commanding 51-28 rebounding advantage, including 19 offensive boards. GSU made 16 steals and blocked five shots. The Panthers powered inside to score

Delle Donne made both of her three-point attempts. Delaware shot 55% for the game (33-of-60), including 5-of-9 outside the three-point line.

The Blue Hens (22-1, 13-0) made 8 of their first 11 shots today to open a 20-6 lead in six and a half minutes. GSU rallied back to 21-15 at the 10-minute mark and that was as close as the Panthers would come all day. It was 30-19 with 7:00 left in the first half.

Delaware held a 42-27 rebounding advantage with the Panthers shooting 36% and making just 22-of-61 shots. The Panthers committed 25 turnovers, but also forced 21 Delaware turnovers and made 14 steals.

The win was the 300th in Delaware Coach Tina Martin's 16-year coaching career with the Blue Hens.

"Delaware is a good all-around team with plenty of players that can score," said Coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "Elena Delle Donne gets her teammates involved and makes them even better, which is why they are ranked where they are. Everyone knows how special she is because we have been watching her for a couple years show us all. I think I am most disappointed that we did not give a better defensive effort than we did today because we are capable of playing defense better than we showed today."

Georgia State welcomed back its former letterwinners today and honored the 10-year anniversary of the 2002 conference champion and NCAA Tournament team.

Northeastern knocked down 13 three-point baskets to pace the host Huskies to a 76-51 win over Georgia State Thursday night in a Colonial Athletic Association game.

The Huskies (5-20, 3-11), who were No. 18 in the nation averaging 7.2 three's per game, made 13 of their 31 attempts tonight. They made seven of the 13 three-point baskets in the second half.

Guard Deanna Kerkoff co-led the hosts with 19 points and five three-pointers, while forward Christine Huber also scored 19 points

The Huskies were also hot at the free throw line, making 17-of-20 charity tosses at an 85 per cent rate.

Georgia State (7-18, 1-13) got 12 points off the bench from freshman center Alana Beroth on 5-of-8 field goals, while Chan Harris added eight rebounds, five points and five steals. Cody Paulk added eight more points, but got in early foul trouble.

Northeastern gained the lead in the first half, holding a 26-21 advantage at 7:35 and it was still 31-27 with 5:21 to play in the opening stanza. But, host Northeastern closed the first half with a 12-2 run in those five minutes to take a 43-29 lead into the halftime break.

The key run in the game came with Northeastern leading 51-44 with 12:19 left. The Huskies knocked down three straight treys and went on a 13-0 run over the next three minutes to make it 64-44 with 9:33 left.

Northeastern made five three-pointers to start the second half before getting a lay-up at the 10-minute mark for their first two-point basket of the second half.

Georgia State averages 21 turnovers a game and hurt themselves again to night with 20 turnovers.

The rebounding totals were an even 38 per team, with Georgia State grabbing 17 offensive boards.

The visiting Panthers shot just 29 per cent in the second half and 32.8 per cent for the game.

Georgia State stays on the road to play at George Mason on Sunday afternoon in a TV game on Comcast at 12 noon.

George Mason made two free throws with 0.2 seconds left in overtime to secure a 70-68 win over Georgia State.

In a game with 12 ties and 8 lead changes, the teams were tied at 68 in overtime. Georgia State had a chance for the win on a drive to the basket with 17 seconds left, but a no-call on a block got Mason the ball back. Taleia Moton dribbled out the clock, did a final spin just inside the three-point line, was falling away from the basket and heaved a desperation attempt that was whistled as a foul with the 0.2 left. Moton, the No. 12 scorer in the country at 20 points today, finished with a game-high 31 points, including seven in the overtime to lead Mason (13-13, 7-8).

Georgia State (7-19, 1-14) had four players in double figures, even though two fouled out. Junior center Cody Paulk, one of those who fouled out, had 18 points, seven rebounds and three blocked shots. Senior forward Chan Harris had a double-double with 13 points and 14 rebounds. Guard Kendra Long added 15 points with three treys and Sade Means added 12 points, six rebounds and three steals.

The Panthers had fought back from a 10-point halftime deficit, 38-28, to re-gain the lead, 41-40 early in the second half. The visiting Panthers built a five-point lead at 49-44 with 7:35 to go. GSU led 57-55 in regulation after a basket by Means, but Moton made two free throws to tie the game at 57 with 1:32. GSU had several chances for the winning basket in regulation, but missed.

In the OT, GSU again built a five-point lead at 66-61 with two minutes left. GSU led 68-66 with 1:10 left, but Joyous Tharrington made two free throws with 41 seconds to tie. That set up GSU's final miss and Moton's heroics.

Mason shot 37 fouls, making 27, compared to 19 attempts by GSU (none in the first half), with 15 made as GSU was whistled for 23 fouls.

Georgia State dominated the rebounding by a 54-41 margin, including 20 offensive rebounds. The Panthers scored 34 points in the paint.

This is GSU's second road OT loss in two weeks, losing at Towson earlier.

"We fought hard, did a good job on the glass, and played to win this afternoon," said Coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "I guess we can be proud we didn't quit, but it's tough to lose one like this."

Georgia State led VCU by eight points at halftime and 12 points early in the second half, but the veteran Rams and their All-AmericanCourtney Hurt roared back for a 73-61 win.

The host Panthers (7-20, 1-15) opened a 33-25 halftime lead by holding VCU to 35% shoting, by owning a 26-16 rebound advantage and shooting 41% themselves.

GSU surged to a 12-point lead twice to start the second half, holding a 45-33 lead at with 16:36 left to play.

But, from that point on it was all VCU (16-11, 9-7). The

But, from that point on it was all VCU (16-11, 9-7). The Rams made 15 of their first 19 shots in the second half. VCU turned that 12-point deficit into a 10-point lead at 7:35, 61-51, with that 28-6 run over those nine minutes.

Leading the way was Atlanta-grown (Conyers, Salem HS) Hurt, VCU's senior star who leads the nation in rebounding and is number eight in the nation in scoring. Hurt poured in 22 points in the second half to finish with 31 points for the game. She had just six rebounds, seven below her 13-per game average.

Georgia State got its leads and stayed in the game for a long time thanks to junior center Cody Paulk's 23 points, six rebounds, three blocks and three assists. That was two points above her previous best game of 21 points just five games ago. Over the past six games, Paulk has poured in 91 points. GSU also got 11 points and five assists from point guard Jerlisa Taylor. Kendra Long and Sade Means each added 10 points to give GSU four players in double figures.

GSU scored the first six points of the game and never trailed in the first half. After leading for the first 26 minutes, the Panthers saw VCU gain its first lead at 46-45 with 13:50 to play. But, GSU regained the lead, 49-48 with 12:20 to go. When VCU broke a 51-51 tie with 11:28 to play, the Rams would never lose the lead.

VCU shot 57.1 per cent in the second half from the field and 6-for-6 from the line. They opened the second half with a full-court press and made seven of their 11 steals in the second half.

Georgia State finished with a 36-35 rebounding advantage, while blocking eight shots on the evening. The game offered similarities from the Jan. 29 game between the two teams in Richmond. GSU led at the halftime in that game, 37-33, but VCU came back to post a 75-70 win..

On Senior Day for Chan Harris, the Panthers followed script with a 74-62 victory over William and Mary as Harris led the way with a career-high 23 points.

Junior point guard Jerlisa Taylor also had a personal-best day with 17 points, 10 rebounds and six assists for the Panthers (8-20, 2-15). Kendra Long also added 10 points and five assists to give GSU three players in double figures.

GSU's swarming defense made 16 steals, blocked 5 shots and forced 20 Tribe turnovers, while holding William and Mary to 31 percent shooting for the game. In particular, the GSU defense held the CAA's top three-point scorer Jeanine Aldridge (85 three-pointers at a 40.3 rate) to just one lay-up and 0-for-4 outside the three-point arc. GSU's defense leads the CAA in both steals (10.5) and blocks (136, 5.0) and added to those today with the 16 and five.

Harris, a 6-foot-2 forward and the lone senior on the GSU team, poured in 20 of her 23 points in the second half as she played only seven minutes of the first half with three fouls. So, she finished her 23 points in just 24 minutes of action. This was her 56th career double-figure game and her fourth game of 20 or more points, but one more than her previous best of 22 points versus Kennesaw State. Harris shot 8-10 from the field (80%) and 7-8 from the free throw line (.875).

The key stretch for Georgia State in the first half was when they saw William and Mary close to 21-20 with 9:03 left on a basket by Correal and then responded with a 12-0 run. The run was sparked by seven points by Taylor and opened a 33-20 GSU lead at 4:55. GSU led 39-29 at halftime.

In the second half, two spurts by the senior Harris kept the game under control. With the score 43-33 at 15:54, Harris scored six straight to open a 16-point margin at 49-33 with 14:45. When William and Mary closed it back to eight points at 51-43 with 9:24, Harris again responded with four quick to get it back to 12 points at 55-41 with 8:26 and it was never under double digits again.

GSU's biggest lead was 17 points on five occasions in the final seven minutes as the Panthers ended a six-game losing skid that saw them bow twice in overtime and once on a buzzer-beater in regulation.

UNCW 64 GEORGIA STATE 54

Trask Coliseum • Wilmington, N.C.

In the regular season final game between two teams who knew they would be playing next week in the opening game of the Colonial Athletic Association tournament, host UNC Wilmington claimed a 64-54 win over Georgia State. UNCW (18-11, 11-7) will be the No. 5 seed and tangle for

the third time this season with Georgia State (8-21, 2-16) on Thursday in the 2:30 p.m. opening day game.

Tonight, the two differences were UNCW's 8 three-point baskets, six by point guard Alisha Andrews, and Georgia Ŝtate's poor free throw shooting, 14-of-25, including front ends of one-and-one opportunities.

UNCW got 22 points and six assists from the smallest player on the court, 5-foot-2 Andrews from Stone Mountain, Ga. in metro Atlanta. Forward Karneshia Garrett added 18 points and 10 rebounds.

Georgia State got its points inside with six-foot-three junior center Cody Paulk scoring 16 points, grabbing seven rebounds and blocking six shots. Six-foot-two senior forward Chan Harris added 14 points and eight rebounds.

The key stretch of the game was early in the second half. When GSU closed to 25-23 with 18:18 left in the game, Andrews made three three-point baskets to spark a 15-4 run to open a 40-27 lead. GSU, sparked by Paulk, closed it back to five points at 42-37 with 9:50 when Andrews hit another trev. Moments later, Andrews followed with a sixth trey, the fifth of the second half, to make it 48-38 at 9:08.

GSU kept it a two-possession game several times, the last at 56-50 with 3:50 left. With UNCW leading 61-54 with 1:35, GSU missed an open three-pointer than could have started a finaly rally, but it missed.

"We lost to them on a buzzer-beater in Atlanta, and hurt ourselves tonight with the missed free throws, so we'll make some adjustments and try to be ready to get a win next week in the tournament," said head coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "Andrews is hard to defend because she is quick to go by people and able to hit the three-point shot if left open outside Cody Paulk is starting to make a big impact on both ends of the court for us and that opens other things up.

Georgia State bowed out of the Colonial Athletic Association tournament with a 66-59 loss to UNC Wilmington on Thurs-

day afternoon at The Show Place Arena.

The 12th-seeded Panthers surprised fifth-seeded UNCW early, taking a seven-point lead through the first 12 minutes of the game with an 11-0 run before the higher-seed began its rally, UNCW went on a 21-9 over the final seven minutes of the first half to open a 30-23 halftime margin.

In the second half, Georgia State closed back to three points at 40-37 with 12:30 to go, but UNCW grew the lead to 10, its largest of the game at 8:00. GSU again closed back to five points, five more times over the next four minutes.

With 1:45 to play, GSU had cut the gap to 61-57 and then closed to three points at 62-59 with 40 seconds to play on a Chan Harris basket. UNCW's Abria Trice made two free throws with 33 seconds and then Karneshia Garrett hit two more with 20 seconds to enable UNCW to move on to the quarterfinals.

A difference-maker in the game was UNCW making seventhree-point baskets in 17 attempts, while GSU tried four treys without success. UNCW also held a 51-38 rebound advantage that included 17 offensive rebounds.

The Panthers kept the game close with its defense early and late, forcing 19 turnovers, making eight steals and blocking four shots, while holding the Seahawks to 31 percent shooting in the first half and 33 percent for the game.

Georgia State (8-22) was led by senior forward Chan Harris

with 18 points, 10 rebounds and three blocked shots. Junior point guard Jerlisa Taylor added 10 points, seven rebounds and five assists.

"It was a hard-fought game, but from our side, we just didn't make enough baskets and missed a whole lot of wide-open shots today," said Coach Sharon Baldwin-Tener. "We came out ready to play and got the lead early with our defense, but our offense wasn't taking advantage of the defense stopping them. We played to win, but our glaring weakness is our jump

"UNCW made some key three-point baskets to open an advantage because we kept their overall shooting percentage real low in the area where you can usually win games," Baldwin-Tener added. "But, we didn't do a good job of boxing out and getting as many rebounds as we should have today."
