PHIL MARTELLI
Head Coach

The 2014-15 season marks the 20th for **Phil Martelli** as head coach at Saint Joseph's. During his time with the Hawks he has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial post-season participant and a key player on the national scene, while earning his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history and becoming one of the more respected coaches in the game. The 2014-15 season will be his 30th year overall at SJU, which includes 10 seasons as an assistant coach.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 364-249. He set the record with the victory over Morgan State on December 28, 2011, breaking the mark held by Bill Ferguson (309). Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories eight times in the past 19 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. He is 178-126 in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach.

He has also served the game of basketball as a Past President of the NABC's Board of Directors as well as a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition.

In 2013-14, Martelli and his veteran team turned in one of the more memorable seasons in school history, adding another A-10 Championship to his resumé. The Hawks, led by seniors Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr., won 20 of 26 games from mid-December and captured the school's third conference title and its first since 1997. SJU went 24-10 and reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time under Martelli, falling to eventual national champion Connecticut.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 362-247. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories eight times in the past 19 seasons, which is the most for any Hawks' coach. He is 178-126 in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach

The 2012-13 season saw an experienced Saint Joseph's squad reach the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals and earn a second consecutive NIT bid, for the 11th postseason berth in Martelli's career.

In 2011-12, Martelli and the Hawks became one of nine teams in the nation to win 20 games after losing 20 the previous season, and also returned to the postseason with an NIT bid. Saint Joseph's boasted a young and exciting squad, and one of the most balanced in school history, as five different players received Atlantic 10 honors, the most ever for the Hawks. SJU also scored two wins over Top 25 teams (Creighton and Temple) and Martelli became SJU's all-time leader in victories.

In 2010-11, Martelli guided the youngest squad in his career, which included three freshman starters. The Hawks made an exciting late-season run, earning a berth in the A-10 Tournament with a win in the final regular-season game, and won two games in the tourney to reach the semifinals.

Martelli faced a challenge in 2009-10 with a young and inexperienced squad that went 11-20, coming off a 2008-09 season that saw the Hawks go 17-15 for his ninth consecutive winning season. Among the highlights of '08-09 was Ahmad Nivins becoming the third Hawk in six years to garner the Atlantic 10's Player of the Year Award. Nivins was also chosen by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2009 NBA Draft, becoming the third player coached by Martelli to be drafted.

The 2007-08 Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the third time in four years and earned the program's 19th bid to the NCAA Tournament, and Martelli's fifth. The 11th-seeded Hawks fell to sixth-seeded Oklahoma in the NCAA First Round, while ending the year at 21-13.

Martelli has been at his best when it counts the most as his 17 postseason wins (6 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history, ahead of Ramsay's 12. Martelli ranks first among Hawk coaches with a .608 postseason winning percentage (17-12) and has taken SJU to the postseason in 10 of the last 14 years, and 12 times in his 19 seasons at SJU.

Martelli turned in another top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record to win eight consecutive games to reach the Atlantic 10 championship game for the second year in a row. SJU earned its sixth consecutive postseason bid in the NIT.

In 2004-05, Martelli turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04 when he was the consensus National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks, Martelli guided SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to post a 24-

12 record. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2), won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record, earned the A-10's top seed and reached the title game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career. SJU made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling on a last-second shot in the championship game.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball. The Hawks went undefeated in the regular season, reached the pinnacle as the top-ranked team in the nation and earned the school's first-ever number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the Elite Eight. Jameer Nelson was the consensus National Player of the Year and with teammate Delonte West, were both first-round selections in the NBA Draft. SJU opened the season ranked 12th in the polls and moved up throughout the year, taking the top spot on March 8, 2004, for the first time ever, while finishing fifth in the polls, for SJU's highest final ranking since 1966.

Martelli joined with Nelson to sweep the national coach and player awards, marking one of the few times in history that the top player and coach were from the same school. He was also the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the third time and a repeat winner of the Big 5 Coach of the Year award.

A 1976 graduate of Widener, Martelli began his career on Hawk Hill with SJU's 1985-86 NCAA Tournament team. After 10 years as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Martelli was named the 14th coach in school history on July 20, 1995, and just the third non-alumnus to guide SJU.

Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game. He followed that in 1996-97 with the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament titles, along with a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School and had a stint as assistant coach at Widener, helping guide the Pioneers to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four.

As a point guard at Widener, he was part of the NCAA Tournament teams in 1975 and 1976, and set the school's single season and career assist marks.

Martelli and his wife, Judy, a former basketball player with the national champion Immaculata College teams in the 1970s, have three children - Phil, Jr., Jimmy and Elizabeth. Phil, Jr. is an assistant basketball coach at the University of Delaware while he and Elizabeth are both Saint Joseph's graduates. The Martelli's have five young grandchildren - Philip Stephen, Marra, Avery, Brynley, and Madalyn.

LAST TIME OUT: **DeAndre' Bemby** scored 22 points to lead Saint Joseph's over Vermont, 68-60, at Hagan Arena. Bemby tied his career-high in both points and also in rebounds with nine, while **Isaiah Miles** had 15 points. **Aaron Brown** added 13 points for his third straight game in double figures. Vermont took the early lead, 11-1, in the first three minutes of the game. The Hawks fought back, going on a 16-5 run as Bemby and **Chris Wilson** combined to score 11 points. Bemby had a dunk and a layup and then threaded a fast break pass to Wilson, who converted the layup to give SJU its first lead of the game, 17-16, with 9:28 remaining. The Hawks maintained the lead the rest of the way, holding a 32-26 margin at halftime as they forced 10 Vermont turnovers in the half, while outrebounding the visitors, 25-16. The Hawks came out firing in the second half, and a Bemby three-pointer started a 7-0 run, as SJU forced four straight Vermont turnovers. A **Javon Baumann** layup with the pass from Bemby and a jumper by Miles gave the Hawks a 39-26 lead. Vermont broke its four-minute scoreless streak at 15:10 on a three-pointer. A pair of free throws by Bemby gave SJU its biggest lead of the game, 46-32. Vermont scored six straight to cut SJU's lead to 51-45 at 8:48, but Saint Joseph's answered with five points from Miles to increase its margin back to 10, 56-46. The Catamounts made one more push, coming to within 61-56 with 3:23 left, but Bemby went 4-for-4 from the foul line to go up by 66-56 with 2:08 remaining.

BEMBRY'S BACK: After two uncharacteristic games (FDU, Gonzaga) **DeAndre' Bemby** led the way in the win over Vermont. The sophomore tied his career-highs in points with 22 and in rebounds with nine. He shot a season-best 6-for-14 from the field and 8-for-10 from the foul line. Bemby has upped his scoring average to a team-high 12.0 points.

WHAT BROWN CAN DO FOR YOU: Junior **Aaron Brown** has notched double figures off the bench in three consecutive games. He gave the Hawks a big boost at Drexel, scoring 11 points for his first double-figure game in a Hawk uniform. He hit a driving layup with 1:30 to play to break a 47-47 tie and put SJU up for good. He followed that with a season-best 14-point effort at Gonzaga and was the only Hawk in double figures in the lopsided loss. Brown followed that with a solid 13-point, five-rebound effort in the win over Vermont, Brown is in his first year playing at Saint Joseph's after transferring from West Virginia. He sat out the 2013-14 season and has two years of eligibility with the Hawks.

SJU AND THE NIT: This marks the second time that Saint Joseph's is participating in the NIT Season Tip-Off. The previous came in 2007 when the Hawks traveled to Syracuse. During that tournament, SJU defeated Fairleigh Dickinson but lost to Syracuse in the Carrier Dome.

50-50: After the Gonzaga game, **Phil Martelli** called the Hawks' lack of scoring a "grave concern". SJU scored more than 60 points for the first time all year in the 68-60 win over Vermont and is now averaging 54.8 points per game.

OFF TARGET: Saint Joseph's is shooting 34.9 percent from the floor on the season, and the best shooting effort of the year was 40 percent in the season opening loss to FDU. The Hawks have struggled from three-point range, but they hit a season-best 40 percent (6-for-15) from beyond the arc in the Vermont win.

JAMES' GAME: Highly-touted freshman **James Demery** recorded the first double-figure game of his career as he posted 12 points on 4-for-9 shooting at Drexel. The freshman got off to a slow start in his SJU debut as he had only three points in 10 minutes in the FDU loss.

BAND OF THIEVES: Saint Joseph's had 13 steals against Vermont, which was the highest number of steals since it posted 15 steals in a loss at Minnesota on Dec. 12, 2009. **Javon Baumann** led the way against Vermont with a career-high four steals. **Isaiah Miles, DeAndre' Bemby** and **Shavar Newkirk** recorded three apiece as SJU forced Vermont into committing 18 turnovers.

NERVES OF STEEL: Freshman **Shavar Newkirk** gave SJU a boost off the bench at Drexel. He went 5-for-6 from the foul line and hit a pair with :11 to play as SJU was clinging to a 51-49 lead. He had seven points, three rebounds and two assists in 25 minutes of action.

TOOTH AND NAIL: Redshirt freshman **Jai Williams** suffered a bad break in his first two minutes of collegiate action. He caught an elbow as a Drexel player was dunking and it knocked out two teeth. Williams, who had oral surgery the following day, has not played since and is out indefinitely.

RACKING UP THE MILES: Junior **Isaiah Miles** has scored double figures in two of four games. In the opener against FDU, he made the first start of his career and posted his first-ever double-double with 12 points and a career-high 14 rebounds. Miles also took a career-high 14 field goal attempts in 33 minutes of action. He scored 15 points in the win over Vermont, shooting 6-for-11 from the field.

ON BOARD: The Hawks outrebounded FDU by a 44-28 margin. **Isaiah Miles** led the way with a career-high 14 boards while **Javon Baumann** grabbed a personal best eight rebounds.

PROGRAMMING CHANGE: Due to the Philadelphia Eagles game on Thanksgiving, the Saint Joseph's-Western Kentucky game will be broadcast on audio streaming only, on SJUHawks.com. The December 20th game at Marist will be heard on WPHT 1210 AM, instead of 610 AM.

DUE FOR SOME DOWN TIME: The Hawks started the year with a stretch of six games in 13 days, but a breather is coming. After the Thanksgiving date with Western Kentucky in Madison Square Garden, SJU will be idle on the weekend. Looming ahead, however, are back-to-back Big 5 games with Temple (Dec. 3) and Villanova (Dec. 6).

TURKEY DAY: What does Saint Joseph's have in common with the Dallas Cowboys and the Detroit Lions? For consecutive years, they've had to play on Thanksgiving. Last year, the Hawks faced LSU in the Old Spice Classic in Orlando, and suffered an 82-65 loss. SJU is at it again this year at dinner time (6 p.m.) against Western Kentucky at Madison Square Garden in the revamped NIT Season Tip-Off, which will conclude the Hawks' participation in the tournament.

NEW LOW: The Hawks ran into a highly-efficient Gonzaga team in the first game of the NIT Season Tip-Off. Gonzaga reeled off the first eight points of the game and never looked back, while shooting 61.3 percent in the half. The Hawks managed just 10 points in the first half, trailing 48-10 at halftime. SJU scored 32 in the second half but still suffered the largest losing margin in school history with the 94-42 loss. Junior **Aaron Brown** was the only Hawk in double figures with 14 points, while sophomore **DeAndre' Bemby** didn't register his first point until 16:15 remaining in the second half. It was the fewest points scored by the Hawks since a 56-39 loss at Villanova on Feb. 6, 2007.

BACK IN THE FOLD: The Hawks return two starters from last year's A-10 Champion team - **DeAndre' Bemby** and **Chris Wilson**. Bemby was the A-10's Co-Rookie of the Year and the Big 5 Rookie of the Year after aver-

aging 12.1 points and 4.5 rebounds per game. Wilson was the Hawks' starting point guard and averaged a career-best 9.1 points per game.

THAT CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON: Saint Joseph's enters the year as the defending Atlantic 10 champion, having won the program's third title in 2014, which was its first since 1997. The Hawks went 24-10 and earned the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, where they lost in overtime to eventual national champion Connecticut.

PLATINUM PHIL: This is **Phil Martelli's** 20th season as Saint Joseph's head coach, and his 30th overall at the University after 10 years as an assistant. He is SJU's all-time leader in career victories with a 364-249 record and is the longest tenured current coach in the Atlantic 10. Martelli owns a 178-126 record in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach.

CROSS-COUNTRY HAWKS: After winning at Drexel on Nov. 17, the Hawks boarded a charter flight at 10 a.m. on Tuesday for the 2,100-mile trip to Spokane. The team made a quick stop in Fargo, North Dakota, to refuel and arrived in Spokane at 2 p.m. Pacific time. The Hawks got on their return flight immediately after the loss to #13 Gonzaga and were back in Philadelphia at 7 a.m. on Thursday.

HONORING A LEGEND: Saint Joseph's is wearing a "JR" patch on its uniforms this season to honor Hall of Fame coach Dr. Jack Ramsay, who passed away in April. "Dr. Jack" compiled a 234-72 record and guided the Hawks to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances and nine consecutive postseason bids from 1955-66. He went on to amass 864 wins in the NBA and helped the Philadelphia 76ers to the 1967 championship as general manager and coached the Portland Trailblazers to the 1977 NBA title. He was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1992.

FROM THE START: **James Demery** became the second freshman in two years to own a spot in the starting lineup on opening day. **DeAndre' Bemby** started all 34 games as a freshman for the Hawks last season and went on to earn Atlantic 10 Co-Rookie of the Year honors. Demery, a 6-6 wing, averaged 18.0 points last season at Northside Christian Academy in North Carolina.

WINNING WITH WILSON: **Chris Wilson** is the Hawks' starting point guard for the second year in a row. Last season, the 6-3 guard averaged a career-best 9.1 points per game and handed out 2.7 assists while scoring double figures in 14 games.

FEAR THE 'FRO: **DeAndre' Bemby** made a tremendous impact in his freshman year and the expectations are high for a successful sophomore season. Bemby was voted onto the Preseason Atlantic 10 All-Conference First Team and is the only sophomore to earn that distinction. The 6-6 wing player averaged 12.1 points last season and shot 45.8 percent from the field en route to being named the Atlantic 10 Co-Rookie of the Year.

RARING TO GO: Junior **Aaron Brown** made his Saint Joseph's debut after sitting out last season due to the transfer rule. The 6-5 guard transferred to SJU from West Virginia, where he played two years for the Mountaineers. Brown, from Darby, Pa., starred locally at Penn Wood High School, where he was an All-State selection and the Player of the Year by the *Delaware County Daily Times*. He averaged 20 points per game as a senior and helped his team to the state title.

ROOKIE STARTERS: Junior **Isaiah Miles** and redshirt sophomore **Javon Baumann** are in the starting lineup for the first time in their careers.

Miles has played 40 career games, and hit for a career-high 17 points last season against Loyola. Baumann, who redshirted the 2012-13 season, appeared in 15 games last year and was a co-recipient of the team's Most Improved Player Award.

WILLIAMS' WAIT: Also making his Hawk debut this season is redshirt freshman **Jai Williams**, who sat out last year to develop his game. Williams, a 6-9 forward from Philadelphia Electrical and Technical Charter School, has lost close to 45 pounds since arriving at SJU in the fall of 2013, and is now down to 257 pounds.

SIDELINED SENIOR: **Papa Ndao** will sit out this season due to undisclosed medical reasons. Ndao, originally from Dakar, Senegal, is one of three seniors on SJU's squad this year. He played in 31 games in 2013-14 for the A-10 champion Hawks, while making two starts and scored a career-high 13 points in SJU's win over George Mason last year. He has played in a total of 85 career games for the Hawks, starting eight contests. Ndao, who has played three years, is on track to graduate from Saint Joseph's in May with his degree in interdisciplinary health studies.

HOLES TO FILL: Graduation hit the Hawks hard as Saint Joseph's lost three senior starters from last year's 24-10 team. The trio of Langston Galloway, Ronald Roberts, Jr., and Halil Kanacevic combined for 1,429 points, 681 rebounds, and 243 assists in last season alone. Those three were also 1,000-point scorers in their college careers and were Atlantic 10 All-Conference performers.

CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP: Senior **Chris Wilson** and sophomore **DeAndre' Bemby** were voted co-captains by their teammates. Bemby becomes the first sophomore to be chosen a captain in **Phil Martelli's** 20 seasons as head coach of the Hawks, and only the second in school history. The

previous sophomore captain was Joe Oakes, who captained the famed "Mighty Mites" team in 1936-37.

WELCOME TO HAWK HILL: Newcomers on the squad this year are **James Demery**, **Shavar Newkirk** and **Obi Romeo**. Demery is a 6-6 wing from Northside Christian Academy (N.C.); Newkirk is a 5-11 point guard from Cardinal Hayes (N.Y.); and Romeo is a 6-10 forward from Greenbrier East (W. Va.). **Markell Lodge**, a 6-7 forward from Pace Academy (N.C.), will be sitting out this season to concentrate on academics. Also new to the program are walk-ons **Mike Booth** and **Kyle Thompson**. Booth, the grandson of former SJU head and assistant coach Harry Booth, averaged 18.0 points at Bishop Shanahan High School. Thompson was an All-Catholic League selection at St. Joseph's Prep.

CAROLINA ON MY MIND: The Hawks' roster features three players in the starting lineup from the state of North Carolina - **Chris Wilson** (Fayetteville), **DeAndre' Bemby** (Charlotte) and **James Demery** (Williamston). **Markell Lodge** (Washington) is the fourth player but he is sitting out this season to concentrate on academics.

WAITING IN THE WINGS: Newcomer **Skylar Scrivano** is sitting out this season due to the transfer rule. A 6-10 forward from Doylestown, Pa., Scrivano transferred to Saint Joseph's from Rider University. He started his career at Columbia University, where he played the 2012-13 season.

HOME SWEET HOME: This marks the sixth season of Michael J. Hagan '85 Arena. The arena was dedicated in October 2009 after a two-year expansion and renovation of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, which was the home of the Hawks since 1949. Saint Joseph's owns a 46-24 record in the six seasons of Hagan Arena, but a 365-106 overall record in 63 years of Hagan Arena/Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. SJU went 11-4 on its home court during the 2013-14 season.

NEW LOOK: Hagan Arena has a new look this season with the addition of a new LED centerhung video display system, which was supported by alumnus Mike Hagan '85. These displays will light up the arena with their ability to highlight live video and instant replays. They can show one large image or can be divided into separate windows to show a variety of vivid graphics, colorful animations, up-to-the-minute statistics, scoring information and sponsor advertisements.

HAWKS IN THE PROS: Three key members of last year's championship team - Langston Galloway, Halil Kanacevic and Ronald Roberts, Jr. - are playing professionally. Galloway and Roberts are in the NBA D League playing for the New York and Philadelphia teams, respectively. Kanacevic is currently playing in Slovenia.

CRADLE OF COACHES: The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien was the most recent NBA head coach, and his last year with the Indiana Pacers was in 2010-11. PRESEASON PICK: Saint Joseph's was picked to finish eighth in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, as voted on by media and the league's coaches. The Hawks went 11-5 in the conference last season to finish in a tie for third place, but captured the Atlantic 10 Championship, the third in school history.

HELPING OUT: **Kyle Molock** had career-ending knee surgery in February, 2014, and will serve as a student assistant this year. Molock came to SJU in August 2012, but injured the ACL of his right knee in preseason workouts. That was the third knee injury for Molock, as he previously had two knee injuries which shortened his high school career at Dublin Coffman High School in Ohio. Molock is a junior accounting major at Saint Joseph's.

KEEPING IT IN THE FAMILY: **Phil Martelli's** staff consists of three former Hawk players. Assistant coach **Mark Bass**, now in his 16th year, was a junior on Martelli's first team in 1995-96, and as a senior, helped the Hawks reach the NIT Final in 1997. Assistant coach **Geoff Arnold** played for the Hawks from 1982 to 1986, and was a member of the 1986 Atlantic 10 championship team. Arnold was a member of Martelli's coaching staff for one season in 1995-96, and then returned to Hawk Hill at the start of the 2008-09 season. Director of basketball operations **Rob Sullivan** was a member of the 2004 Elite Eight team.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Hawks will conclude play in the NIT on Thanksgiving when they take on Western Kentucky at Madison Square Garden. After the holiday, Saint Joseph's will host Temple on Dec. 3 in the first Big 5 game of the season.

THE HAWK

The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for 58 years.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.



In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a tuition scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

Brian Lafferty becomes the 36th student to wear the wings in 2014-15. He is a senior criminal justice major from Springfield, Pa.

ON THE AIR

TV: Saint Joseph's will again have a strong presence on television in 2014-15, with a total of 28 games scheduled for coverage either on television or digital networks. The Hawks will appear on national tv 13 times. (Complete schedule on page 2)

RADIO: Saint Joseph's University and Sports Radio 610 AM (WIP) are in the fourth year of the partnership to broadcast the Hawks for all but two games. The Nov. 27 game with Western Kentucky will be heard on audio streaming only, while the Dec. 20 game at Marist will be carried by 1210 AM (WPHT). The Hawks suffered just their second loss in 10 season openers as FDU hit a three-pointer with 3.3 seconds to play to gain the 58-57 win. The Hawks had taken a 57-53 lead with 1:13 remaining after back-to-back three-pointers from **DeAndre' Bembry** and **Chris Wilson**. FDU answered with a layup with 50 seconds to play and then rebounded a Hawks' miss on the next possession. FDU inbounded with :09 to play after a Saint Joseph's foul and **Mustaafa Jones**, a Philadelphia native, hit the gamewinner from the right side. **Isaiah Miles** made the first start of his career and had his first career double-double with 12 points and a personal best 14 rebounds. Wilson added 12 points as the only other Hawk in double figures. **Aaron Brown** scored nine points in his SJU debut while **Javon Baumann** grabbed a career-high eight rebounds. FDU held a 28-25 lead at halftime and by as much as 34-28 two minutes into the second half. A dunk by Bembry started a 9-3 run for the Hawks, with four points from Brown, as SJU opened its biggest lead of the second half, 44-39, with 6:47 remaining. FDU pulled within 46-45, but Miles countered with a three-point play to up the Hawks' lead to 49-45. Despite another layup by Brown, FDU would tie the score, 51-51, with 2:32 to play. The Hawks committed 16 turnovers in the game.

Aaron Brown hit a driving layup with 1:30 to play to break a 47-47 tie, and **Isaiah Miles** and **Shavar Newkirk** hit late free throws to help Saint Joseph's defeat Drexel, 52-49, at the Daskalakis Center. **DeAndre' Bembry** had 13 points and eight rebounds for the Hawks, while freshman **James Demery** scored 12 for the first double-figure game of his career and Brown scored 11 points off the bench. The Hawks trailed at halftime, 25-24, and by as much as 36-29 with over 12 minutes to play in the second half. The opened play in the 2014 NIT Season Tip-Off with a 94-42 defeat at 13th-ranked Gonzaga at the McCarthy Athletic Center. Junior **Aaron Brown** led the Hawks with a season-high 14 points. Gonzaga scored the first eight points of the game and made its first eight field goal attempts and held the Hawks to 2-of-10 from the floor en route to a 16-2 advantage at the 15:02 mark. After a three-pointer by **Chris Wilson** made it 16-5, the Bulldogs reeled off 12 straight, keeping the Hawks off the scoreboard for a six-and-a-half-minute stretch. Saint Joseph's cut the deficit to 31-10 on a free throw by **Javon Baumann** with 6:23 to go in the half, but Gonzaga scored the final 17 points of the period to take a 48-10 margin into halftime. The Bulldogs extended the run to 29-1 to start the second half, leading 60-11 with 17:46 to go. The 52-point margin of defeat was the largest in school history, and the Hawks' 42 points scored was their lowest total since a 56-39 loss at Villanova on February 6, 2007.

DeAndre' Bemby scored 22 points to lead Saint Joseph's over Vermont, 68-60, at Hagan Arena. Bemby tied his career-high in both points and rebounds with nine, while **Isaiah Miles** had 15 points. **Aaron Brown** added 13 points for his third straight game in double figures. Vermont took the early lead, 11-1, on the Hawks in the first three minutes of the game. The Hawks fought back, going on a 16-5 run as Bemby and Wilson combined to score 11 points. Bemby had a dunk and a layup and then threaded a fast break pass to **Chris Wilson**, who converted the layup to give SJU its first lead of the game, 17-16, with 9:28 remaining. The Hawks maintained the lead the rest of the way, holding a 32-26 margin at halftime as they forced 10 Vermont turnovers in the half, while outrebounding the visitors, 25-16. The Hawks came out firing in the second half, and a Bemby three-pointer started a 7-0 run, as SJU forced four straight Vermont turnovers. A **Javon Baumann** layup with the pass from Bemby and a jumper by Miles gave the Hawks a 39-26 lead. Vermont broke its four-minute scoreless streak at 15:10 on a three-pointer. But another Bemby three-pointer pushed the Hawks' lead to 42-29. A pair of free throws by Bemby gave SJU its biggest lead of the game, 46-32. Vermont scored six straight to cut SJU's lead to 51-45 at 8:48, but Saint Joseph's answered with five points from Miles to increase its margin back to 10, 56-46. The Catamounts made one more push, coming to within 61-56 with 3:23 left, but Bemby went 4-for-4 from the foul line to go up by 66-56 with 2:08 remaining.
