**ON TAP:** Back-to-back Sun Belt champion Arkansas State will play just its second contest this season at Centennial Bank Stadium when it hosts Coastal Carolina in its Homecoming game Saturday, Oct. 14. The outing will appear on ESPN3, and every Red Wolves' football game can be heard live on 107.9 FM in the Northeast Arkansas area. The live radio broadcast can also be accessed on the official A-State Athletics web site (AStateRedWolves.com) and the A-State Athletics app.

**THE PRINCIPALS:** A-State, the only FBS team in the nation to win five conference championships over the last six seasons, opened Sun Belt Conference play Wednesday, Oct. 4, with a 43-25 road victory over Georgia Southern. The Red Wolves improved their record to 2-2, which includes a 48-3 win over UAPB in their only other home game thus far. Coastal Carolina enters the game with a 1-4 overall record and 0-2 Sun Belt Conference mark. The Chanticleers began the season with a 38-28 home victory over UMass, but have since dropped their last four games in a row.

**HEAD COACH BLAKE ANDERSON: Blake Anderson,**

a 17-year coaching veteran at the NCAA FBS level who also coached in an NJCAA National Championship game, was named the Red Wolves' 30th all-time head football coach on Dec. 19, 2013. Anderson led A-State to back-to-back Sun Belt Conference championships (2015 and 2016), as well as three straight winning seasons and bowl game appearances (2016 Cure Bowl, 2015 New Orleans Bowl and 2014 Go-Daddy Bowl) his first three years at the helm. Under his direction, the Red Wolves have also set new school records for total offense (6,174 yards in 2014), average yards total offense (476.5 yards per game in 2014), total plays (1,024 in 2014), points scored (520 in 2015), touchdowns scored (69 in 2015) and interceptions (26 in 2015). During his first three years at the helm of the program, he saw 29 of his players earn 45 All-Sun Belt Conference selections -- the most in the league over that span.

**FAST START:** Out of 30 all-time head coaches at Arkansas State, **Blake Anderson** became one of just four to win at least seven games in his first season (2014) at the school. The other head coaches to win at least seven games in their first season as head coach at A-State were Bryan Harsin (2013), Gus Malzahn (2012) and Hugh Freeze (2011).

**FOUR YEARS RUNNING:** Even with at least seven games remaining on A-State's 2017 schedule, **Blake Anderson** is already the first head coach in Arkansas State history to win 26 or more games over his first four seasons at the school. Additionally, he is the only head coach at A-State to win 26 games in 43 or fewer contests -- Bennie Ellender is the next closest, reaching 26 victories in 44 games from 1963-67.

came by double figures, and seven of its eight victories last season came by at least 10 points. Additionally, all nine of its wins during the 2015 season and six of its seven in 2014 came by a double-digit margin, meaning 24 of the Red Wolves' 26 wins under head coach **Blake Anderson** have come by 10 or more points. The only exceptions were a 21-14 overtime win over Utah State in 2014 and a 27-26 victory over Georgia Southern in 2016.

**THE ARKANSAS STATE - COASTAL CAROLINA**

**SERIES:** Arkansas State and Coastal Carolina will meet for the first time when they play Oct. 14.

**A-STATE vs. THE SUN BELT:** Arkansas State has won 41 of its last 48 Sun Belt Conference games (.854 winning percentage) to run its all-time record in the league to 74-43. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against ULM with 24. With the exception of Coastal Carolina, which it has never played, A-State has defeated every team in the conference since the football league was formed in 2001. Along with ULM and Louisiana-Lafayette, A-State is one of three teams that have been a part of the conference since its inaugural football season.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** Arkansas State has strung together 12 consecutive years (2005-16) with a winning record at Centennial Bank Stadium dating back to 2005. The Red Wolves are now

56-13 (.811 winning percentage) since the 2005 season and have won 31 of their last 37 home games, including the last five in a row. The Red Wolves actual on-field record all-time at Centennial Bank Stadium is 148-76-1 since it opened in 1974. A-State's six home wins in 2011 were its most since 1985.

**UNBUCKLE THE BELT:** With its 43-25 win over Georgia Southern this season, the Red Wolves now stand 12-5 all-time in Sun Belt Conference openers. A-State has won its last five Sun Belt openers for its longest streak ever as a member of the conference, and its longest as a member of any league since winning its first Southland Conference game five straight years from 1966-70.

**RED WOLVES OCTOBER:** Dating back to the 2010 season, Arkansas State holds a 19-2 record over its last 21 games played in the month of October. The Red Wolves went undefeated in

the month during the 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2016 seasons, 1-1 in 2013 and 2-1 in 2014. A-State has won its last eight games in the month, including a 43-28 win over Georgia Southern this year.

**HOMECOMING HISTORY:** Arkansas State is 61-27-1 all-time in Homecoming contests. The Red Wolves have won 13 of their last 14 Homecoming games, including their last six in a row, dating back to the 2003 season. A-State had a seven-game winning streak snapped in 2010 with a 34-24 setback to Louisville, but knocked off North Texas (37-14 in 2011), South Alabama (36-29 in 2012 and 17-7 in 2016), Idaho (48-24 in 2013 and 49-35 in 2015) and ULM (28-14 in 2014) in its last six Homecoming games.

**AN A-STATE VICTORY WOULD . . . :** move its all-time record versus Coastal Carolina to 1-0 and give it a victory against every Sun Belt Conference team since the football league was formed in 2001 . . . improve its record in games played in the

month of October since 2010 to 20-2 and mark its ninth consecutive win in the month . . . give it a winning record through five games played for the first time since 2014 and the sixth time (1998, 2006, 2008, 2011, 2014, 2017) since moving to FBS status in 1992 . . . improve its record to 42-7 over its last 49 Sun Belt Conference games . . . give the Red Wolves 55 victories over the last seven seasons . . . mark its seventh consecutive Homecoming victory.

**SIX-YEAR WINS TOTAL:** Including back-to-back 10-win seasons in 2011 and 2012, eight more in 2013, seven in 2014, nine in 2015, eight last year and two this season, the Red Wolves have recorded 54 victories that are the 32nd most in the nation over the last seven seasons.

**THAT'S A FIRST:** The Red Wolves have seen 13 players start their first career game as a member of the A-State program over the last four games. defensive starting lineup all four games and have used the same offensive starting lineup just twice.

**ON THAT NOTE:** Not only did A-State have 13 players make their first start with the Red Wolves, 29 different players took their first snap ever as a member of the team. The squad's current 2-deep features 21 of 56 players (38 percent) listed who had never played a snap as an A-State player entering this season.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** Arkansas State has won 20 of its last 24 conference road games dating back to the 2011 season. A-State had won 10 consecutive conference road games, its longest streak ever as a member of any league, before falling to Western Kentucky in its 2013 regular-season finale. The Red Wolves went 4-0 in conference road games in 2011, 2012 and 2015, 2-1 in 2013, 2-2 in 2014 and 3-1 a year ago. A-State defeated Georgia Southern in its only conference road game played so far this season.

**PRESEASON PREDICTIONS:** Back-to-back league champion Arkansas State was tabbed third in the Sun Belt Conference Preseason Coaches Poll after receiving one first-place vote and 122 total points. The Red Wolves finished just five points behind Troy, while Appalachian State was chosen the favorite with 136 points. Although A-State has won five of the last six Sun Belt Conference championships, it has never been picked to win the league in the preseason coaches poll. At the same time, A-State has been picked to finish among the top three teams in the league nine of the last 12 years.

**SEVEN RED WOLVES NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SBC:** The 2017 Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team featured seven Arkansas State players, including senior defensive end **Ja'Von Rolland-Jones** as the Defensive Player of the Year. The Red Wolves had eight total selections, including senior cornerback **Blaise Taylor** as a first-team return specialist and second-team defensive back. Joining Taylor and Rolland-Jones as first-team choices were senior tight end **Blake Mack**, senior linebacker **Kyle Wilson** and junior defensive back **Justin Clifton**. Representing A-State on the second team were senior wide receiver **Dijon Paschal** and senior defensive lineman **Dee Liner**, in addition to Taylor. The Red Wolves eight total selections were the third most in the league behind Appalachian State's 12 and Troy's nine.

**SUN BELT CHAMPS:** Arkansas State claimed the 2016 Sun Belt Conference championship, giving it back-to-back titles with a combined 15-1 league record over that span. A-State also won the league title 2011-13, making it one of just two programs in league history with at least five all-time SBC titles -- Troy is the other with five as well. Arkansas State is the only FBS program in the nation to win five conference titles over the

last six seasons, and the Red Wolves hold a 40-7 Sun Belt record during that time. The Red Wolves' 7-1 Sun Belt record this season matched the 2012 squad for their third best record ever in the league -- Arkansas State went 8-0 in both 2011 and 2015.

**BOWL ELIGIBLE:** With a 7-5 regular-season record, A-State was bowl eligible for the sixth consecutive season in 2016 and ninth time over

the last 12 years. Since joining the FBS in 1992, Arkansas State became bowl eligible in 10 games or less for the sixth time (2011-16). The earliest A-State ever became bowl eligible was in 2011 when it was 6-2 through eight games.

**SIX STRAIGHT:** Arkansas State has secured six consecutive seasons (2011-16) with a winning record for the first time since 1912-17. The Red Wolves have piled up 52 victories from 2011-16 for its most over a six-year span in the program's 103-year history. A-State has never produced seven consecutive winning seasons.

**TOP 25:** Arkansas State was receiving votes in both the Associated Press (2 points) and Coaches (6 points) Top 25 polls at the end of the 2015 regular season, making it the fourth season since 2011 that A-State was included among "others receiving votes" at one point during the year. The Red Wolves also earned votes in 2011, 2012 and 2013. A-State's most ever points in the Associated Press (28) and Coaches (23) Top 25 came in the 2012 final polls.

**103RD SEASON:** Arkansas State kicked off its 103rd season of football Sept. 2 at Nebraska. A-State holds a 459-479-37 record since the inaugural season and has played in 13 bowl games. A-State did not field a team from 1942-44 due to World War II. Arkansas State also didn't have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending.

**"1" OF A KIND:** Named a William V. Campbell Trophy semifinalist and Senior CLASS Award candidate, research indicates that senior cornerback and return specialist **Blaise Taylor** is the only current FBS player in the nation to earn both his bachelor's and master's degrees before the start of his true senior season. He was recently featured in a *Sports Illustrated* article written by Bruce Feldman, drawing attention to his many accolades in the class room. He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration and received his MBA this summer.

**WATCH ME, WATCH ME:** Arkansas State has seven different players on at least one of the major watch lists for the 2017 season, including three who play on the offensive side of the ball and four on the defensive. All combined, A-State has a player on 10 different major watch lists.

**OFFENSIVE NOTES**

**300-PLUS:** Dating back to the 2010 season, Arkansas State has posted at least 300 yards of total offense in 83 of its last 94 games (.883 percentage). A-State went over 300 yards in all 13 games during head coach **Blake Anderson's** first season, while also reaching the mark 11 times in 2015, 10 times in 2016 and four times this season (38 of 43 games under Anderson).

**400-PLUS:** Arkansas State has hit the 400-yard total offense mark 26 times over its last 43 games (60 percent) since 2014, which was **Blake Anderson's** first season as head coach. The Red Wolves went over 400 yards in three of its first four games this season for the first time since 2013 (vs. UAPB, at Auburn, vs. Troy). The 2013 season was also the last time the Red Wolves recorded at least 400 yards total offense in four of their first five games.

**LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD:** Including eight of the last 10 contests, the Red Wolves have now posted at least 30 points in 49 of their last 75 regular-season games (65 percent) dating back to the 2011 season. The Red Wolves have won 37 of their last 42 games when scoring at least 30 points.

**QUICK STRIKE:** Thirteen of A-State's 22 scoring drives (59%) this season have taken less than two minutes and none have lasted longer than

3:40. A-State's latest game against Georgia Southern saw the Red Wolves score five touchdowns in 45 seconds or less.

**EXPLOSIVE OFFENSE:** A-State has recorded at least six explosive players (20+ yards) in three of its first four games, including a season-high seven against Georgia Southern. Out of its 21 total explosive plays, 11 (52%) have gone for touchdowns and almost half (10) have covered at least 30 yards.

**NOW THAT'S JUSTICE:** Junior quarterback **Justice Hansen** was named College Sports Madness' Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week following each of A-State's first two games this season. He is the only player in the league to rank among the top three players in total offense (2nd), passing yards avg. (2nd), passing touchdowns (2nd) and pass efficiency (1st).

**SCHOOL-RECORD PERFORMANCE:** Junior quarterback Justice Hansen recorded a school-record 46 completions for 415 yards and three touchdowns against Nebraska. He completed 67 percent of his passing attempts, while his 46 completions also tied the second most in Sun Belt Conference history and are currently the most in the nation this season. His 415 yards were the second most of his career, fourth most in school history and is currently tied for the 19th most in the nation this season.

**HITTING THE MARK:** Including the Georgia Southern game, junior quarterback Justice Hansen has now thrown multiple touchdown passes 10 times during his career, including the last six games in a row dating back to last season. He has thrown for at least 200 yards 11 times, 300 five times and 400 twice. Dating back to last season, Hansen has passed for at least 200 yards his last five games and in nine of his last 11.

**MULTIPLE WEAPONS:** At least nine different A-State players caught at least one pass in three of A-State's first four games, including six wide receivers that have set career highs for either receptions, receiving yards and/or receiving touchdowns.

**MAKING A MOVE:** Junior **Blake Mack** changed positions from wide receiver to tight end last season, and he has transitioned well with 50 receptions for a team-high 870 yards and seven touchdowns during that time. Mack has scored a touchdown in five of his last six games, including all four this season. His first two seasons combined at wide receiver, Mack posted 17 receptions for 235 yards.

**FINDING THE END ZONE:** A former walk-on and Burlsworth Trophy nominee, senior running back **Johnston White** recorded a team and career-best 14 rushing touchdowns as a sophomore and now has 25 running scores during his career. White's

25 career rushing touchdowns are the seventh most in school history.

**ABOVE AVERAGE:** Senior wide receiver *Chris Murray* recorded five receptions for a career-high 188 yards and career-best two touchdowns, averaging a Sun Belt Conference record 37.6 yards per catch to help lead Arkansas State to a 43-25 road victory over Georgia Southern. Murray's receiving yards tied the fourth most in school history and were the most by an Arkansas State player since 1999. They were also the second most by a Sun Belt Conference player this season, as well as the 17th most in the nation. He caught three passes that covered at least 51 yards, including touchdown receptions of 56 and a career-long 57 yards.

**MOVING FORWARD:** Junior running back *Warren Wand* has attempted 45 rushes this season and has yet to lose you any yards on a carry. He is averaging 6.0 yards per attempt, which is tied for the third highest in the league among its top-10 leading rushers -- only Louisiana's Trey Ragas (7.2) and South Alabama's Xavier Johnson (6.1) have a higher average. As a team, the Red Wolves are ranked 21st in the nation in tackles for loss allowed with 4.5 per game.

**APPROACHING 2,000:** Running back *Warren Wand* finished the Georgia Southern game with 61 rushing yards on 11 carries for a 5.5 average. He pushed his career rushing total to 1,864 yards, leaving him 136 away from becoming the 13th player in A-State history to post 2,000 in a career. He recorded 709 yards in 2015 for the most by a true freshman at A-State since Lamont Zachery ran for 846 in 1996. He entered the season 1,588 yards, the most over a freshman and sophomore season since Reggie Arnold ran for 2,136 combined yards in 2006 and 2007.

**NEBRASKA GAME NOTABLES:** Arkansas State scored 36 points against Nebraska, which was its most ever against a team currently in a Power 5 conference. A-State's second highest total was 34 points scored against then-ranked No. 5 Oregon in 2012 (HC Gus Malzahn) and 34 versus Indiana in 2010 (HC Steve Roberts) . . . The Red Wolves also recorded 32 first downs, which tied the sixth most in school history and were their most since posting a school-record tying 34 against New Mexico State in 2011.

**DEFENSIVE NOTES**

**A LOSS ON THE PLAY:** Dating back to the 2016 season, the Red Wolves have posted at least five stops behind the line of scrimmage in 21 consecutive games. A-State posted a season-high nine tackles for loss versus both UAPB and Georgia Southern. The Red Wolves are ranked first in the Sun Belt Conference and 31st in the nation in tackles for loss with 7.1 per game. Arkansas State led the nation in tackles for loss

per game last season with a 9.6 average.

**FORCING TURNOVERS:** While Arkansas State didn't create a turnover against Nebraska or SMU, it forced five in its game against UAPB and four against Georgia Southern. Its five total turnovers gained against the Golden Lions (3 interceptions, 2 fumble recoveries) where the Red Wolves most since the ninth game of the 2015 season (4 INT/1 FR vs. ULM). A-State's three interceptions were also its most since recording three against New Mexico State in the 11th game of the 2015 season.

**SHUTTING 'EM OUT:** The A-State defense hasn't allowed any points in the first or third quarters in two of its first four games, including the UAPB and Georgia Southern contests. The Red Wolves have allowed their fewest points in the third quarter this season, giving up just 14 so far.

**WILSON TIES CAREER HIGH:** Senior linebacker *Kyle Wilson* was responsible for a team-high 13 tackles against Georgia Southern, which also tied his personal best originally set last year against the Eagles as well. Wilson has now recorded at least 10 tackles in two of A-State's first four games this season and in three games during his career. Wilson, ranked seventh in the Sun Belt Conference in tackles, has led the team in stops two of the first four games (Nebraska and Georgia Southern).

**DOUBLE-DIGIT STOPS:** Thanks in part to 12 tackles and two pass break-ups against SMU, both of which tied his career highs, junior defensive back *Justin Clifton* is ranked third on the team in stops and leads the squad in pass break-ups. His performance against the Mustangs marked the fourth time of his career he has finished with a double-figure tackles total.

**PLAYING IN THE BACKFIELD:** Senior defensive end *Ja'Von Rolland-Jones* already holds the A-State and Sun Belt Conference records for sacks in a career with 32.5 to his credit, but is now also within 11.5 of tying the NCAA FBS record currently held by Terrell Suggs (Arizona State, 2000-02). He has also recorded at least a half TFL in 27 of his last 34 contests dating back to his freshman year, and he has 48 during his career.

**MORE ON ROLLAND-JONES:** Senior defensive end *Ja'Von Rolland-Jones* recorded season-high totals for tackles (6), tackles for loss (2), sacks (2) and forced fumbles (1) during Arkansas State's 43-25 road victory against Georgia Southern. He increased his career sacks total to 32.5, moving him into a tie for the 14th most in NCAA history. His forced fumble was recovered by teammate Caleb Caston to end a Georgia Southern drive that reached the Arkansas State 31-yard line.

**CASTON STEPPING UP:** Just four games into the season, senior defensive end **Caleb Caston** has already put up his single-season best numbers for tackles (13), tackles for loss (4.5), sacks (3.0) and forced fumbles (1). His previous highs were 12 tackles (2015), 3.0 TFL (2016) and 2.0 sacks (2014, 2016). He currently leads the Red Wolves in sacks and TFL, while also ranking among the top 12 players in the Sun Belt Conference in both statistical categories. His path thus far is similar to that of former A-State defensive end Chris Odom, whose production exploded his senior season in 2016. Through four games last year, Odom had 23 tackles, 3.0 TFL and 2.0 sacks. Odom was named a First Team All-Sun Belt pick last season and is now a member of the Green Bay Packers.

**TURNAGE TURNS IT UP:** Junior linebacker **Antwon Turnage** entered the Georgia Southern game without any career tackles, but changed that in a big way with nine stops and 1.5 tackles for loss in his most extended playing time since transferring to A-State last season as a sophomore. At the same time, his opportunities have been limited after suffering a season-ending injury in the second game of the 2016 season.

**DEFENSE IS THE BEST OFFENSE:** Arkansas State has ranked among the top 15 teams in the nation in defensive touchdowns each of the last three seasons (2014-16) under defensive coordinator **Joe Cauthen**. In fact, the 2015 season saw the Red Wolves record an FBS-high eight touchdowns. A-State posted four defensive touchdowns in 2014 to rank No. 14, while also recording four in 2016 that ranked eighth. The Red Wolves have 16 total defensive touchdowns over the last three seasons (2014-16).

**SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES**

**PUNT/RETURN GAME:** The Red Wolves are currently ranked among the top 28 teams in the nation in both punt return defense and punt returns. A-State's punting unit is allowing just 2.7 yard per return to rank 21st in the nation, while its own 16.6 average per return ranks ninth. Sophomore punter **Cody Grace** enjoyed the best game of his young career against SMU with career highs for punting yards (289), average (46.5) and punts inside the 20 (3). **Blaise Taylor** has accounted for every A-State return, ranking him seventh in the nation individually.

**ELITE KICKOFF COVERAGE:** While Arkansas State ranks 116th in the nation in kickoff return defense at 26.2 yards per return, that average is an aberration from the previous three years and is skewed with a 99-yard return by Nebraska. Take out the 99-yard return, and A-State's average allowed drops to 18.1 yards per return, which would rank 32nd in the country. Arkansas State has ranked among the top four teams in the nation in kickoff return defense two of the

last three years (2014-16) and among the top 18 teams all three seasons under special teams coordinator **Luke Paschall**. A-State allowed just a 16.1 average last season to rank 3rd in the nation, while the 2015 squad ranked 18th (18.7 avg.) and the 2014 team No. 4 (16.3 avg.).

**BLOCK THAT KICK:** Arkansas State has recorded nine blocked kicks over the past two seasons (2015-16), including five last year that ranked as the fifth most in the nation and four in 2015 to rank the Red Wolves No. 7. The totals over the last two seasons include two blocked punts (both last season) and seven blocked field goals/extra points.

**ON THE RETURN:** Senior cornerback Blaise Taylor has become one of the most prolific punt return men in both Arkansas State and Sun Belt Conference history, ranking No. 1 at A-State in career punt return yards and No. 2 among all-time Sun Belt players. He has four punt returns for a touchdown and has gone over 100 return yards twice, including a career-high 111 yards against New Mexico State in 2015.



Blake Anderson, a 15-year coaching veteran at the NCAA FBS level who also coached in an NJCAA National Championship game, was named the Red Wolves' 30th all-time head football coach on Dec. 19, 2013.

Anderson led A-State to three consecutive winning seasons, a trio of bowl game appearances (2016 Cure Bowl, 2015 New Orleans Bowl and 2014 GoDaddy Bowl) and back-to-back Sun Belt Conference championships in 2015 and 2016 his initial three seasons at the helm. During that time, the Red Wolves also broke the school records for total offense (6,174 yards in 2014), average yards total offense (476.5 yards per game in 2014), total plays (1,024 in 2014), points scored (520 in 2015), touchdowns scored (69 in 2015) and interceptions (26 in 2015).

Out of 30 all-time head coaches, Anderson became just the fourth to win at least seven games in his first season at A-State. Now with 24 career victories leading the Red Wolves, he is the first head coach in A-State history to win 15 or more games his first three seasons at the school. Additionally, Anderson is just the second head coach at A-State to direct the program to 24 wins in 39 or fewer games -- Bennie Ellender reached 24 victories in 37 games from 1963-67.

A-State won the league title for the second consecutive year under Anderson in 2016 with a 7-1 record, making it the only program in the nation to win five conference titles over the last six seasons. The Red Wolves won the 2015 league championship with an unblemished 8-0 record, in the process becoming the only SBC program to ever go 8-0 in league play during multiple seasons (2015 and 2011).

Seven of A-State's eight wins in 2016 came by at least 10 points, and the Red Wolves average margin of victory in its seven Sun Belt wins was 20.0 points. Additionally, all nine of its victories the previous season and six of its seven wins in 2014 came by a double-figure margin, meaning 22 of the Red Wolves' 24 wins under Anderson have come by 10 or more points.

Each of Anderson's first three squads ranked among the top 45 teams in the nation in at least 23 combined offensive, defensive and special teams categories, including 2016 when the Red Wolves led the nation in tackles for loss (9.6 per game) and 2015 when they ranked No. 1 in both defensive touchdowns (8) and passes intercepted (26). Along the way, he saw 11 of his players earn All-Sun Belt recognition in 2014, followed by a school-record 16 in both 2015 and 2016.

Anderson has led the Red Wolves to a 14-4 home record, which includes a 2014 overtime win over a Utah State team that won 10 games and received votes in the final Associated Press Top-25 Poll.

Upon his arrival at A-State, he assembled a well-respected coaching staff and began working to put together his first recruiting class in an abbreviated time period. Not only did he sign the Sun Belt's No. 1 ranked class by Rivals.com, all four of his recruiting classes have ranked among

the top three teams in the league by at least two of the major recruiting services.

Before joining A-State, Anderson worked on head coach Larry Fedora's staff as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at both North Carolina and Southern Miss the previous four seasons. His dynamic offense helped lead the two programs to 34 victories, three bowl game appearances and two conference or divisional titles. Along the way, his potent offense was responsible for breaking both school's total offense records while also ranking among the most productive teams in the nation.

The Hubbard, Texas, native came to A-State after spending the previous two seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at North Carolina, where he helped lead the Tar Heels to an Atlantic Coast Conference Coastal Division title in 2012 and the Belk Bowl in 2013. Under Anderson's direction, North Carolina averaged 432.4 total yards per game in 2013 after setting the school record the previous year with 485.6 yards per contest. Prior to his arrival in Chapel Hill, the Tar Heels had not averaged 400 yards in a season since 1993.

North Carolina's offense posted more than 500 yards of total offense seven times during Anderson's two seasons at the school, including a school-record 721 versus Old Dominion his last season, and scored 40 or more points in nine games. The Tar Heels averaged 44.2 points per game at Kenan Stadium (14 games) and 25.4 on the road (10 games) with Anderson as their offensive coordinator.

Anderson led a passing offense during the 2013 season ranked 23rd in the nation, averaging 286.3 yards per game. North Carolina posted 27 passing touchdowns, which were the second most in school history and just two behind the 29 recorded in 2012. The Tar Heels ranked among the top 44 teams in the nation in total offense, completion percentage, passing offense, red zone offense, scoring offense, passing efficiency, fourth down conversions and turnovers lost in 2013.

North Carolina's offensive success was just a continuation from Anderson's initial season, which saw the Tar Heels establish more than 35 school records. The Tar Heels finished eighth in the country in scoring, averaging 40.6 points per game, and were 14th nationally with 485.6 yards per game. Their passing attack was 26th nationally with 291.8 yards per contest, and the Tar Heels also rushed for 193.8 yards per game, their highest average since 1994.

Individuals excelled in Anderson's system at every position. During his time at the school, six offensive players received All-ACC recognition, including First Team All-America selection Eric Ebron at tight end. As quarterbacks coach, Anderson tutored standouts Bryn Renner and Marquise Williams. Renner set the single-season school record for touchdowns passes with 28 in 2012, while Williams provided a spark to the UNC offense in 2013 with his mobility outside the pocket. Williams finished the regular season with 1,058 yards of total offense in the last three games alone, which was the most in any three-game stretch in Tar Heels history. He was also the first quarterback to lead North Carolina in rushing since 1968.

Anderson went to Chapel Hill after a record-setting run as Southern Miss' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. The Golden Eagles set school records for total offense in each of Anderson's last two years. He was part of a Southern Miss staff under Fedora that won a school-record 12 games in 2012, including the Conference USA championship over previously unbeaten Houston and the Hawaii Bowl over Nevada.

Anderson spent his first two seasons as USM's quarterbacks coach and run game coordinator and developed Austin Davis into one of the nation's top signal callers. Davis broke nearly every school record in an outstanding four-year career.

Under the eye of Anderson, the Golden Eagles were one of 14 teams in the country that averaged more than 200 yards per game in both rushing and passing in 2011. The Golden Eagles had nearly 6,500 yards of total offense and set a school record with 461.4 yards per game. In addition, USM was 15th nationally in scoring offense, 16th in total offense and 21st in rushing offense. Anderson's offense posted 30-or-more points in 10 of 14 games in 2011, including a season-high 63 in a win over Navy.

In 2010, Southern Miss was 18th in total offense, 20th in rushing offense and 35th in passing offense. The Golden Eagles also averaged 36.9 points per game to rank 15th in the nation. That season, Anderson's quarterbacks were among the most efficient in the nation with only eight interceptions thrown – including one by a wide receiver – to 24 touch-





downs. Davis accounted for 10 of the team's 28 rushing touchdowns, more than any other back.

In his first year in Hattiesburg in 2008, Anderson mentored then red-shirt freshman and first-year starter Davis, who responded by having the best season ever for a freshman QB at the school, while also putting together one of the better years that any signal caller has had at the university.

Davis, who was the first freshman to start in his opening game since 1991, notched 15 school records, including six season marks – passing yards (3,128), completions (261), attempts (454), total offense (3,636) and touchdowns responsible for (30).

Anderson came to Southern Miss after spending the 2007 campaign at Louisiana-Lafayette as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. The Ragin' Cajuns posted the No. 6-rated rushing offense nationally (251.6) in 2007 and became the Sun Belt's first ever 3,000-yard rushing team (3,019).

Anderson, who was in private business from 2004-06, previously worked at Middle Tennessee, where he helped direct an offensive unit as co-offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach from 2002-04.

He spent three seasons at New Mexico before landing at MTSU. He served as the wide receivers coach in 2001 and running backs coach from 1999-2000. The UNM rushing attack was responsible for a major share of the Lobo offense in 2000. The Lobos averaged 148 yards per game on the ground, which accounted for 56 percent of the team's total offense.

Anderson worked at Trinity Valley Community College (1995-98) before joining the Division I FBS ranks at New Mexico. In 1998, he was the offensive coordinator and the Cardinals went 7-3. He helped lead the Cardinals to the 1997 NJCAA National Championship.

He began his coaching career at Eastern New Mexico in 1992 (graduate assistant) and 1993 (full-time), where he tutored the wide receivers. He then moved on to Howard Payne University in Brownwood, Texas, to coach wide receivers in 1994. HPU won the Texas IAA conference title.

A two-year letterwinner at wide receiver for Sam Houston State from 1989-91, Anderson was named Southland Conference All-Academic as a senior. He also played for two years as a quarterback and receiver at Baylor (1987-89) before transferring. Anderson graduated with his bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Sam Houston State in 1992. He also attained his master's degree in sports administration from Eastern New Mexico in 1994. Anderson and his wife Wendy have one daughter, Callie, and two sons, Coleton and Cason.

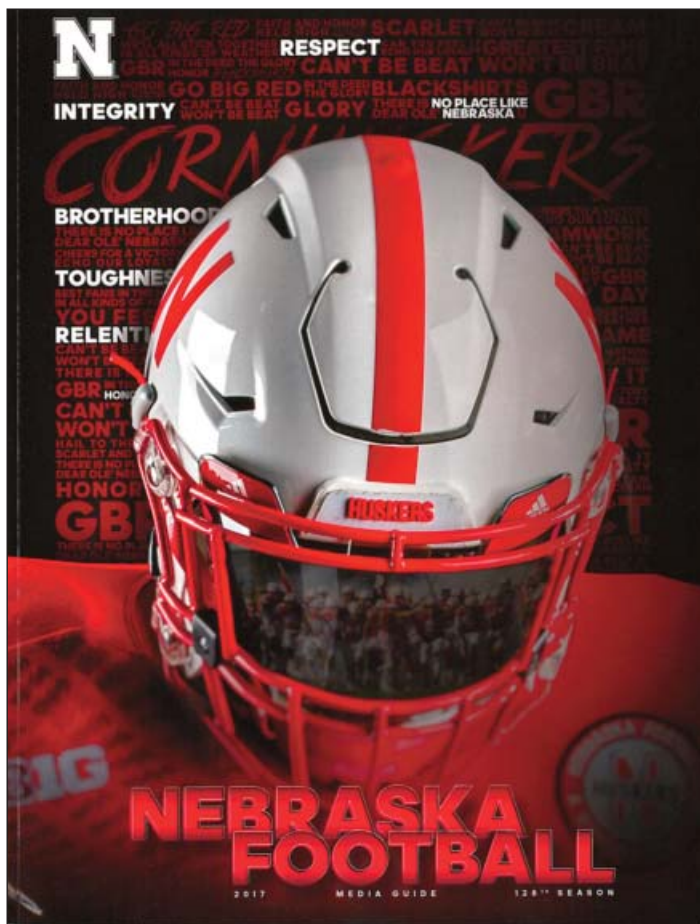

GAME 1

SEPT. 2, 2017 | MEMORIAL STADIUM: 90,171 | Nebraska 43, A-State 36



LINCOLN, Neb. (9/2/17) – Arkansas State took two shots at the end zone from 11 yards out in the final seconds of its season-opening game at Nebraska, but the Huskers held off the Red Wolves 43-36 in front of 90,171 fans at Memorial Stadium.

Quarterback Justice Hansen completed 46-of-68 passes for 415 yards and three touchdowns. His 46 completions established a single-game school record and he connected with nine different receivers. Chris Murray had nine catches for 90 yards and a touchdown while Kendrick Edwards hauled in eight passes for 100 yards and a touchdown. Christian Booker (7-72), Omar Bayless (7-42) and Blake Mack (5-50) each had over five receptions.

The Red Wolves out-gained Nebraska 497-463 on the game with 415 of the 497 total yards coming via the passing game. The Huskers churned 225 rushing yards while quarterback Tanner Lee was 19-of-32 passing for 238 yards. Kyle Wilson led the A-State defense with 10 tackles while B.J. Edmonds added career-high nine total tackles, six solo.

Trailing 43-29 with 4:18 to play, A-State used a 12-play, 63-yard drive to get within one score. Hansen completed 7-of-9 attempts on the drive, hitting six different receivers along the way. Edwards snagged his first career touchdown reception with a 3-yard grab with 47 seconds remaining to set the stage for a potential game-tying score.

A-State lined up for the onside kick and Murray batted the ball away from an awaiting Nebraska hands team member and recovered at the Nebraska 44-yard line. Hansen connected with Mack on first down for 12 yards, but back-to-back incompletions saw A-State face 3rd-and-10 at the 32-yard line. Hansen spotted Edwards on the left side of the field for an 11-yard gain and a penalty moved A-State to the Nebraska 11-yard line.

Nine seconds was showing on the clock and the Red Wolves targeted Justin McInnis in the end zone on first down, but the pass was deflected setting up one more chance at a tie score. Hansen elected to target Edwards in the back of the end zone on the next play, but the pass was just out of his reach setting the final score.

Nebraska opened the scoring on the night with a 21-yard field goal, but the A-State defense held strong inside the 10-yard line to keep the Cornhuskers to

the three points. The Red Wolves would respond in a big way as Blaise Taylor returned a punt 63-yards for a score to give A-State a 7-3 lead with 4:53 on the first quarter clock. It was Taylor's fourth career punt return touchdown.

The Cornhuskers answered right back with a 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown to lead 10-7. A-State worked a nine-play, 87-yard drive to retake the lead at 14-10 with 2:12 remaining in the first quarter. Hansen was 8-for-8 covering 83 yards on the drive and found Chris Murray for a 29-yard touchdown strike.

After Nebraska scored on each of their next two possessions to lead 24-14 five minutes into the second quarter, A-State drove deep inside Nebraska territory. The Cornhuskers came up with the first turnover of the game as a defensive lineman batted a pass by Hansen and the Huskers came up with the interception at the one yard line. The Red Wolves defense swarmed on the first play and Kyle Wilson came away with safety to make it a one possession game again at 24-16 with 6:54 left in the first half.

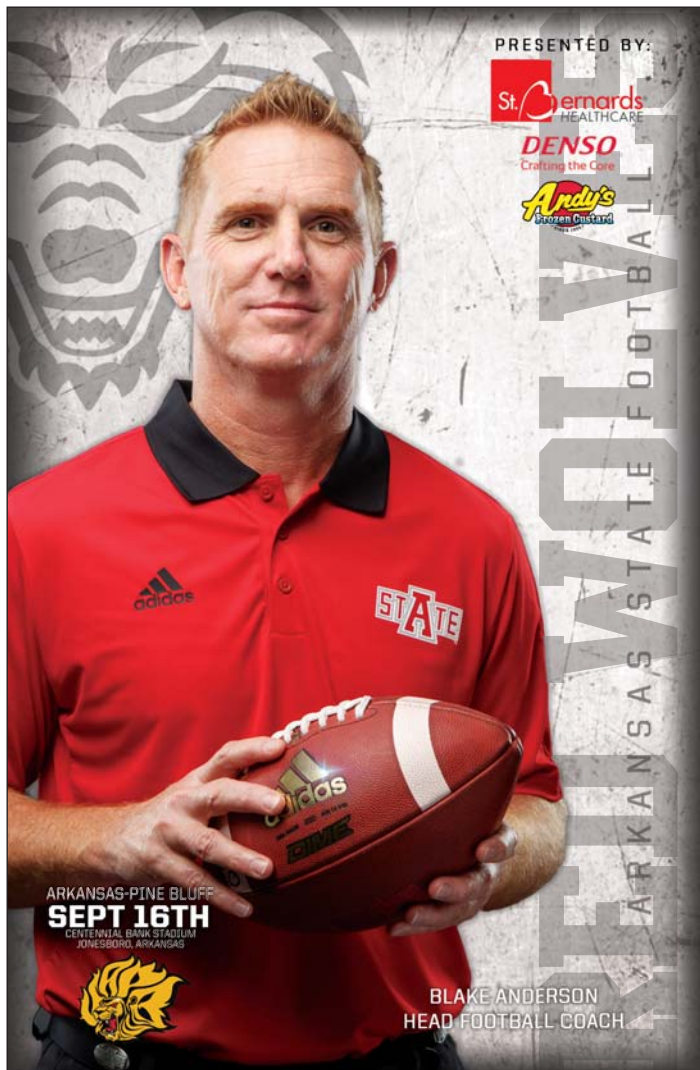
The Red Wolves used a 10-play, 61-yard drive following the free kick trimming the deficit to 24-23. Hansen completed 6-of-8 on the drive for 36 yards and he connected with Blake Mack for a three-yard touchdown pass.

Despite Nebraska advancing 41 yards on the ensuing drive, the A-State defense held the Huskers to a field goal. Trailing 27-23 approaching halftime, the Red Wolves had one final attempt at scoring. Hansen added 30 more yards to his passing total and his final pass of the first half, an 11-yard completion to Mack, set up the Red Wolves with a look at a field goal as time expired in the first half. Sawyer Williams lined up a 39-yard field goal and split the uprights to send the game to halftime with A-State trailing 27-26.

Nebraska scored a pair of touchdowns before A-State found the scoring column in the second half. Trailing 41-26, A-State took over at the 25-yardline looking to drive the field to make it a one possession game. Hansen added five more completions to reach a new-single game school record of 38, but replay overturned a second touchdown for Murray and A-State settled for a field goal. Williams booted the field through from 31 yards to make it 41-29 with under 10 minutes to play.

SEPT. 16, 2017 | CENTENNIAL BANK STADIUM: 24,371 | A-State 48, UAPB 3



JONESBORO, Ark. (9/16/17) – Quarterback Justice Hansen tied the school record with five passing touchdowns and Arkansas State set a single-game record with six passing touchdowns in a 48-3 victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff at Centennial Bank Stadium.

Hansen finished 24-of-31 passing for 336 yards and five touchdowns while Logan Bonner was 2-for-3 for 20 yards and a touchdown. Eleven different receivers hauled in receptions for the Red Wolves with Christian Booker (4-76) and Dijon Paschal (4-29) leading the team with four receptions each. Booker had two receiving touchdowns while Omar Bayless, Blake Mack, Justin McInnis and Jonathan Adams Jr. also put six points on the board.

Warren Wand led A-State (1-1) on the ground with nine rushes for 62 yards, including a touchdown. Johnston White added 10 carries for 37 yards as the Red Wolves had 137 yards rushing. A-State finished with 493 total offense and was 5-for-12 on third down.

Defensively, A-State limited UAPB (1-2) to 280 yards of total offense and forced five turnovers. Kyle Wilson had a sack and interception while Hunter Moreton led with six tackles. Jarrod Chandler, Christian Howard and Ronheen Bingham also recorded sacks for the Red Wolves.

“Overall just excited to get the win,” said A-State head coach Blake Anderson. “Any way you can get a ‘W’, you need to be excited about it. I thought the crowd was great and anytime you can win at home, you need to be excited about it. Overall, just frustrated with sloppy play. We had missed kicks, missed tackles and missed assignments and a lot of times where we could have moved the chains and didn’t. I told the guys we

have to continue to improve.”

“We have a lot of inexperienced guys playing and you could see that tonight where there were times I thought we could have stretched this thing out and we weren’t able to do it early enough. That would have allowed us to get a lot of young guys on the field and we kept that in question longer than we wanted to. It will be a great teaching tape and we got to get it fixed because we have a very tough football game next week against a very good football team in SMU. Just looking at the guys eyes in the locker room, they realize it and weren’t making excuses for it. We had a lot of heads shaking ‘Yes Sir’ and that correction starts tomorrow tonight.”

After Blaise Taylor logged his fifth career interception, the Red Wolves used just 2:15 to march down the field for a touchdown. Wand and White combined for 43 yards on the ground, but two completions by Hansen proved the difference. Hansen connected with Christian Booker for a 38-yard scoring play.

A missed field goal by the Golden Lions gave the ball back to A-State and the Red Wolves took advantage. Hansen completed 6-of-7 passes on the drive, capping the 11-play scoring drive with a three-yard strike to Mack.

UAPB got on the board with a 30-yard field goal midway through the second quarter, but A-State quickly responded. Hansen completed five-straight passes spanning 53 yards. The ground game got A-State into the end zone as Wand rushed 12 yards for the score and a 20-3 lead for the Red Wolves.

Hansen tossed three more touchdown passes in the third quarter as he helped the Red Wolves expand the lead to 41-3. Hansen hooked up with McInnis for a 73-yard touchdown pass and catch on the second play of the quarter and later targeted Bayless for a 23-yard score. Hansen closed his night with a 23-yard touchdown pass to freshman Adams Jr. Bonner entered the game at the start of the fourth quarter and connected on 2-of-3 attempts, including a nine-yard touchdown pass to Booker.

DALLAS, Texas (9/23/17) – Arkansas State racked up over 400 yards of total offense, but it was not enough as Southern Methodist University defeated the Red Wolves 44-21 at Gerald J. Ford Stadium.

“We couldn’t get anything going throughout the night,” A-State head coach Blake Anderson said. “We couldn’t tackle well and struggled getting them off the field, while offensively we had several miscues that hurt us. In the end SMU just played better than we did, and there were several things that were very critical to allowing them to stretch this thing out and those things have to get fixed.”

The Red Wolves held a 14-10 lead at the end of the first quarter thanks to a pair of touchdown passes from Justice Hansen. The junior from Edmond, Okla., connected with Omar Bayless on a 32-yard strike to go up 7-3 early in the quarter.

The scoring play was setup on the previous play when Hansen found Bayless for a 30-yard completion as the Red Wolves marched down the field for a nine-play, 89-yard scoring drive.

SMU responded quickly with a 55-yard touchdown pass and catch, but the Red Wolves answered right back. Hansen completed all three pass attempts on a five play drive, hooking up with Blake Mack for a 19-yard touchdown pass to take a 14-10 lead. It marked the fifth consecutive game that Hansen passed for multiple touchdowns in a game.

Hansen finished the first quarter 10-of-14 for 148 yards passing and two touchdowns.

Despite the solid effort in the first quarter, SMU took advantage of a number of Arkansas State miscues and outscored the squad

20-0 in the second quarter.

On the opening drive of the second quarter, the Red Wolves held the Mustangs to a field goal attempt, but were whistled for a roughing the kicker call that allowed the drive to continue. SMU cashed in two plays on a two-yard touchdown from Courtland Sutton to take a 17-14 lead.

Later in the quarter Hansen found Mack for a 36-yard reception and Mack looked to have a path into the end zone but was tripped up in front of the goal line and fumbled the ball that resulted in an SMU recovery. The Mustangs added two more touchdowns to close out the first half with a 30-14 advantage. SMU tallied 402 yards of total offense in the first half compared to 306 for the Red Wolves.

SMU added two more touchdowns in the second half, while Warren Wand scored his second rushing touchdown of the season on a five yard in the fourth quarter to get Arkansas State with 37-21 with 12:32 to go in the game. SMU answered on the following drive, however with a seven-yard scoring run from Ben Hicks to go up 44-21 with 9:52 remaining.

Despite racking up over 400-yards of offense for the 26th time in the Anderson era, A-State surrendered 580 yards of total offense to the Mustangs. Hansen finished the night 16-of-26 for 234 yards and two scores, while Logan Bonner went 7-of-17 for 50 yards.

Mack had five receptions for 102 yards and one touchdown, while Bayless hauled in four catches for 72 yards and a score. On the ground, Wand led the way for A-State with 75 yards on 13 carries and a touchdown.

Defensively, Justin Clifton tied a career-high with 12 tackles and two pass breakups, while Clifford Thomas added two tackles including a sack.

**GAME 4**

OCT. 4, 2017 | PAULSON STADIUM: 13,781 | A-State 43, Georgia Southern 25



STATESBORO, Ga. (10/4/17) – The Arkansas State offense scored five of its six touchdowns from 25 or more yards out as the Red Wolves won their Sun Belt Conference opener by a score of 43-25 against Georgia Southern at Allen E. Paulson Stadium in Statesboro in a game that was broadcast on ESPN2.

A-State (2-2, 1-0 SBC) won its fifth straight conference opener and improved to 19-2 in the month of October since 2010. Additionally, the win moved the team to 20-4 over its last 24 road SBC games as head coach Blake Anderson became the fastest coach in school history to reach 26 career victories.

Chris Murray was the receiving star of the night with 188 yards on five catches to tie Chet Douthit (1970 vs. Louisiana Tech) for the fourth-most in a single game in school history and the 188 yards was also the fourth most by a player in the nation this season. Justice Hansen threw for 316 yards on just 12 completions, but tossed four touchdowns passes along with four interceptions. All four of Hansen’s scoring passes went for 29 yards or more with two going for 56 and 57 yards to Murray.

Georgia Southern (0-4, 0-1 SBC) outgained A-State 493-381 and forced five A-State turnovers, but was only able to score seven points off those turnovers. Meanwhile, the Red Wolves forced four turnovers of their own and scored 13 points off of them while holding the Eagles to 3-for-15 on third-down conversions.

Neither team was able to get much offense working in the first quarter, but the Red Wolves did get on the board late in the period when Sawyer Williams connected on a career-long 43-yard field goal. However, the Eagles were able to respond with a field goal of their own early in the second quarter to tie the game 3-3.

Two big plays for both teams highlighted the next couple of drives with Hansen connecting with Murray for a 56-yard score to put A-State on top 9-3 after the extra point from Williams hit the upright. Georgia Southern wasted little time responding with Monteo Garrett taking an option pitch 74 yards to pay dirt to put the home team in front 10-9 after a successful

Both teams turned the ball over on their next drives with A-State’s Caleb Caston forcing a fumble on a sack that was recovered by Hunter Moreton after the Eagles had taken over on an interception of a Hansen pass. The drive for the Red Wolves started on the Georgia Southern 25-yard line and Warren Wand scampered to the end zone on the first play, but another missed extra point set the score at 15-10.

The Eagles regained the lead on an eight-yard touchdown run by Wesley Fields late in the quarter after a Hansen interception and appeared poised to take the lead into the halftime break. The Red Wolves had other plans as Hansen found Murray on a 57-yard touchdown after two runs by Jamal Jones to push the Red Wolves in front 22-17 at the break.

The Red Wolves wasted little time out of the gates in the second half when Hansen found Blake Mack for a 29-yard score just 45 seconds in to make the score 29-17. Safety Michael Johnson picked off a pass on the Eagles’ next drive for his first career interception and set up another Wand touchdown run, this time from 12 yards out, to push the A-State advantage to 36-17 less than four minutes into the third period.

Georgia Southern climbed within 36-25 on a 50-yard strike to Obe Fortune early in the fourth quarter and had a chance to cut into the A-State edge more, but turned the ball over on downs with just over six minutes left in the contest. The Red Wolves scored on the second play after that when Omar Bayless hauled in a one-handed 37-yard strike in spite of defensive pass interference to put the score at 43-25.

Wand was the leading rusher for the Red Wolves with 61 yards on 11 carries, while Mack was the only receiver other than Murray with more than one catch as the Lonoke, Ark., native registered three catches for 54 yards.

Defensively, Kyle Wilson led the team with 13 tackles, while BJ Edmonds had a career-high 11. Ja’Von Rolland-Jones picked up two sacks to give him 32.5 for his career, while Christian Howard notched his first career sack. Trent Ellis-Brewer ended the Eagles’ last scoring threat with his first career interception with six seconds remaining in the game.
