ON TAP: Arkansas State is in the midst of its only back-to-back road games this season, playing at Tulsa on Saturday after facing No. 1 Alabama in Tuscaloosa last week. Saturday's CBS Sports Network-televised game is scheduled to kickoff at 6 p.m. and can be hard live on 107.9 FM in the Northeast Arkansas area. The live radio broadcast can also be accessed on the official A-State Athletics web site (AStateRedWolves.com) and the A-State Athletics app.

THE PRINCIPALS: Arkansas State holds a 1-1 record after two games for the second consecutive year and third time in five seasons under head coach Blake Anderson. The Red Wolves entered the season receiving votes in both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches top-25 polls, but is now receiving one point in only the Coaches Poll after falling 57-7 to No. 1 Alabama last Saturday. Tulsa claimed a 38-27 season-opening victory over Central Arkansas

at H.A. Chapman Stadium, but dropped a 28-21 decision at Texas last week to even its record at 1-1. Tulsa is under the direction of fourth-year head coach Philip Montgomery, who has led the Golden Hurricane to a 19-21 overall record that includes 10-3 season in 2016.

HEAD COACH BLAKE ANDERSON: Blake Anderson, an 18-year coaching veteran at the NCAA FBS level who also coached in an NJCAA National Championship game, was named the Red Wolves' 30th all-time head football coach on Dec. 19, 2013. Anderson led the Red Wolves to Sun Belt Conference championships in 2015 and 2016, as well as four consecutive winning seasons and bowl-game appearances (2017 Camellia Bowl, 2016 Cure Bowl, 2015 New Orleans Bowl, 2014 Go-Daddy Bowl) during his first four seasons leading the program. Under his direction, the Red Wolves have set nine new single-season school records for average yards total offense (494.8 yards per game in 2017), first downs (322 in 2017), first downs passing (190 in 2017), passing yards (4,106 in 2017), passing touchdowns (38 in 2017), points scored (520 in 2015), touchdowns scored (69 in 2015), total offense (6,174 yards in 2014) and total plays (1,024 in 2014). During his first four years at the helm of the program, he has seen 41 of his players earn 64 All-Sun Belt Conference selections -- the most in the league over that span.

FAST START: Out of 30 all-time head coaches at Arkansas State, **Blake Anderson** became one of just four to win at least seven games in his first season (2014) at the school. The other head coaches to win at least seven games in their first season as head coach at A-State were Bryan Harsin (2013), Gus

FIVE YEARS RUNNING: Despite A-State being just two games into the 2018 season, **Blake Anderson** is already just the second head coach in Arkansas State history to win 32 or more games over his first five seasons at the school. He needs one more win to hold the most victories by any A-State coach over his first five seasons at the school. Additionally, he is just the third head coach at A-State to direct the program to 32 wins in 53 or fewer games -- Bennie Ellender reached 32 victories in 52 games from 1963-68, while Bill Davidson claimed 32 wins over his first 51 games between 1971-75.

DOUBLE DIGITS: Including the Red Wolves' 2018 season opener, 30 of the Red Wolves' 32 victories under head coach **Blake Anderson** have come by 10 or more points. The only exceptions were a 21-14 overtime win over Utah State in 2014 and a 27-26 victory over Georgia Southern in 2016.

CLIMBING THE LADDER: **Blake Anderson** has led the Red Wolves to a pair of Sun Belt titles and collected 26 league wins along the way, which are the fifth most ever by any of the conference's all-time head

coaches. Anderson has the opportunity to climb as high as second on that list this season.

THE ARKANSAS STATE - TULSA SERIES: Arkansas State is set to play Tulsa for the fifth

time in school history, holding a 2-2 record against the Golden Hurricane. The series dates back to 1978 and most recently saw Tulsa claim a 54-7 home win in 2003. This year's game between the two schools is the first in a home-and-home series, which will see A-State host Tulsa in 2020.

A-STATE vs. AAC: Arkansas State holds an all-time record of 28-37-5 against current members of the American Athletic Conference, but the Red Wolves are set to face a team competing as a member of the league at the time of the game for just the fourth time in school history. Their only three other such games came in 2013 when they fell 31-7 at Memphis, 2016 when they defeated UCF 31-13 in the Cure Bowl and last season when they dropped a 44-21 decision at SMU. A-State has also played the following current AAC teams, although they weren't members of the league at the time of the game: Cincinnati (1-1), East Carolina (0-2), Navy (0-1) and Tulsa (2-2). The Red Wolves hold an all-time 23-29-5 record against Memphis.

OKLAHOMA RED WOLVES: The Red Wolves have six players on their roster from the state of Oklahoma, the fourth most among all states outside of Arkansas. A-State has 13 players on its roster from the state of Texas, eight from Missouri and seven from Alabama. Out of the six players from Oklahoma, three of them are listed on A-State's current depth chart.

THAT'S A FIRST: Five-time Sun Belt Conference champ Arkansas State was picked in the league's preseason Coaches' Poll as the favorite to win both the West Division and the conference's inaugural championship game. While the Red Wolves were previously picked to finish runner-up five times, including 2006, 2009, 2012, 2014 and 2016, the 2018 version of the poll marks the first time they have ever been predicted to win the Sun Belt Conference championship. A-State received nine of the 10 first-place votes to win the West Division and accumulated 49 points.

lections, named to the league’s Preseason All-Conference Football Team. A-State’s nine players earning the recognition were the second most in the conference behind only Troy, which had 10 players and 11 total selections on the lineup. Including Hansen, **Warren Wand** (Sr., RB), **Justin McInnis** (Sr., WR), **Lanard Bonner** (Sr., OL), **Ronheen Bingham** (Sr., DE) and **Justin Clifton** (Sr., DB), the Red Wolves’ six first-team picks tied Troy for the most in the conference. Earning a place on this year’s Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Second Team for A-State were **B.J. Edmonds** (Jr., DB), **Cody Grace** (Jr., P) and **Jacob Still** (So., OL).

BOWL ELIGIBLE: Arkansas State has obtained bowl-eligible status each of the last seven years (2011-17) and 10 times over the last 13 seasons. Since joining the FBS in 1992, Arkansas State has become bowl eligible in nine games or less five times (2011, '12, '14, '15, '17). The earliest A-State ever became bowl eligible was in 2011 when it was 6-2 through eight games.

SEVEN STRAIGHT: Arkansas State has secured a winning record in a school-record seven consecutive seasons (2011-17). The next longest streak was six straight seasons from 1912-17. The Red Wolves have piled up 59 victories from 2011-17 for its most over a seven-year span in the program’s 103-year history.

SUN BELT CHAMPS (5 of 7): Arkansas State is the only FBS program in the nation to win five conference championships over the last seven years. The Red Wolves most recently claimed the 2016 Sun Belt Conference championship, giving it back-to-back titles with a combined 15-1 league record over that span. A-State also won the league title 2011-13, making it one of just two programs in league history with at least five all-time SBC titles.

EIGHT-YEAR WINS TOTAL: The Red Wolves have recorded 60 victories during the last eight seasons that are tied for the 26th most in the nation over that span.

A-STATE vs. THE SUN BELT: Arkansas State has won 46 of its last 55 Sun Belt Conference games (.836 winning percentage) to run its all-time record in the league to 78-45. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against ULM with 25. A-State has defeated every team in the conference since the football league was formed in 2001. Along with ULM and Louisiana-Lafayette, A-State is one of three teams that have been a part of the conference since its inaugural

football season.

104TH SEASON: Arkansas State kicked off its 104th season of football Sept. 1 at home against Southeast Missouri State. A-State holds a 466-483-37 record since the inaugural season and has played in 15 bowl games. A-State did not field a team from 1942-44 due to World War II. Arkansas State also didn’t have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending.

FOR STARTERS: The Red Wolves defeated Southeast Missouri State 48-21 to claim its first season-opening victory since picking up a 37-10 win over Montana State in 2014, **Blake Anderson's** first year at A-State. Since moving to FBS status in 1992, the Red Wolves have now posted a 6-21 record in season openers. In addition to its season-openings wins this year and in 2014, Arkansas State also began the 2013 (62-11 vs. UAPB), 2008 (18-14 at Texas A&M), 2006 (14-6 vs. Army) and 1995 (21-17 vs. Utah State) seasons with wins.

HOME OPENERS: With its win over Southeast Missouri State, Arkansas State has now won its first game at Centennial Bank Stadium 12 of the last 14 seasons dating back to 2005. The Red Wolves stand 32-13 all-time in home openers at the stadium and are also 18-8 in such games since moving to FBS status in 1992.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

JUSTICE SERVED: Senior quarterback **Justice Hansen** was named the Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 3, recognizing his record-setting performance against Southeast Missouri State. He set a school record with six touchdown passes and finished the night 26-of-36 passing with 423 yards. All six touchdowns went to different receivers, and he became the first Sun Belt quarterback to toss six or more touchdown passes since Giovanni Vizza of North Texas had eight against Navy on Nov. 10, 2007.

300-PLUS: Dating back to the 2010 season, Arkansas State has posted at least 300 yards of total offense in 93 of its last 104 games (.894 percentage). A-State has produced 300 yards in 48 of 53 games under head coach **Blake Anderson**, including the last 14 in a row.

400-PLUS: Arkansas State has hit the 400-yard total offense mark 34 times over its last 53 games (64 percent) since 2014, which was **Blake Anderson's** first season as head coach. The Red Wolves went over 400 yards in nine of its 12 games last season. A-State averaged a school-record 494.8 yards per game, which ranked 10th in the nation last season.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: Including 14 of the last 19 contests, the Red Wolves have now posted at least 30 points in 55 of their last 84 regular-season games (65 percent) dating back to the 2011 season. The Red Wolves have won 43 of their last 48 games when scoring at least 30 points.

HITTING THE MARK: Junior quarterback **Justice Hansen** has thrown at least one passing touchdown in 19 consecutive games and two or more touchdown passes in 14 of his last 16 outings. He has thrown multiple scoring passes in 19 career games. The former Oklahoma transfer has thrown for at least 200 yards 20 times, 300 ten times and 400 five times during his three-year career at A-State. Dating back to the 2015 season, Hansen has passed for at least 200 yards in 18 of his last 21 games.

ECLIPSING 2,000: Running back **Warren Wand** has pushed his career rushing total to 2,395 yards, making him one of 14 players in A-State history to post 2,000 in a career. He recorded 709 yards in 2015 for the most by a true freshman at A-State since Lamont Zachery ran for 846 in 1996.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

A LOSS ON THE PLAY: Dating back to the 2015 season, the Red Wolves have posted at least five stops behind the line of scrimmage in 29 of its last 31 games. A-State posted a season-high 13 tackles for loss in 2017 versus Texas State and has now recorded at least 10 in five of the last nine games.

TOP 25: For the first time since moving to FBS status in 1992, Arkansas State entered a season receiving votes in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' top-25 polls. However, A-State did receive votes in the FINAL version of both 2012 polls (28 pts AP, 13 pts Coaches). The Red Wolves earned 19 points in the 2018 preseason Coaches' Poll, matching Troy's total to give both programs the highest amount of points by a Sun Belt Conference team in a preseason poll. A-State also received one point in the 2018 USA Today Preseason Poll. FORCING TURNOVERS: Arkansas State has recorded at least one turnover gained in 44 of 53 games (83 percent) under defensive coordinator **Joe Cauthen**. The Red Wolves have ranked among the top 29 teams in turnovers gained three of the previous four years as well (2014-17), and their combined 108 forced turnovers over that span were the fifth most in the nation.

In fact, the 2015 season saw the Red Wolves record an FBS-high eight touchdowns. The Red Wolves had 19 total defensive touchdowns over the previous four seasons (2014-17).

DOUBLE-FIGURE STOPS: Senior safety **Darreon Jackson** recorded a season-high 10 tackles against Alabama, which are also the most this year by an A-State player through two games. Jackson has now posted double-figure stops in two career games, both coming over the Red Wolves' last three outings.



Blake Anderson, a 17-year coaching veteran at the NCAA FBS level who also coached in an NJCAA National Championship game, was named the Red Wolves' 30th all-time head football coach on Dec. 19, 2013.

Anderson led A-State to four consecutive winning seasons, four straight bowl game appearances (2017 Camellia Bowl, 2016 Cure Bowl, 2015 New Orleans Bowl and 2014 GoDaddy Bowl) and back-to-back Sun Belt Conference championships in 2015 and 2016 his initial four seasons at the helm. During that time, the Red Wolves also broke nine school records for average yards total offense (494.8 yards per game in 2017), first downs (322 in 2017), first downs passing (190 in 2017), passing yards (4,106 in 2017), passing touchdowns (38 in 2017), points scored (520 in 2015), touchdowns scored (69 in 2015), total offense (6,174 yards in 2014) and total plays (1,024 in 2014).

Out of 30 all-time head coaches, Anderson became just the fourth to win at least seven games in his first season at A-State. Now with 31 career victories leading the Red Wolves, he is the first head coach in A-State history to win more than 22 games his first four seasons at the school. Additionally, Anderson is just the third head coach at A-State to direct the program to 31 wins in 51 or fewer games -- Bennie Ellender reached 31 victories in 50 games from 1963-68, as did Bill Davidson from 1971-75.

A-State won the league title for the second consecutive year under Anderson in 2016 with a 7-1 record, making it the only program in the nation at the time to win five conference titles over the previous six seasons. The Red Wolves won the 2015 league championship with an unblemished 8-0 record, in the process becoming the only SBC program to ever go 8-0 in league play during multiple seasons (2015 and 2011).

The Red Wolves have won at least seven games every season under Anderson, including a 9-victory campaign in 2015 and eight-win year in 2016. A-State has also compiled a 26-6 (.813 winning percentage) Sun Belt Conference record under Anderson's watch, and its average margin of victory in those 26 wins is 22.9 points.

Including all seven A-State wins in 2017, 29 of the Red Wolves' 31 victories under Anderson have come by 10 or more points. The only exceptions were a 21-14 overtime win against Utah State in 2014 and a 27-26 victory over Georgia Southern in 2016.

Each of Anderson's first four squads ranked among the top 45 teams in the nation in at least 23 combined offensive, defensive and special teams categories, including 2016 when the Red Wolves led the nation in tackles for loss (9.6 per game) and 2015 when they ranked No. 1 in both defensive touchdowns (8) and passes intercepted (26).

Along the way, he saw 11 of his players earn All-Sun Belt recognition in 2014, followed by 16 in both 2015 and 2016 and, most recently, a school-record 18 in 2017. All four seasons combined, Anderson has coached 41 different players to 64 all-conference selections -- the most in the league over that span.

Anderson has led the Red Wolves to an 18-5 home record, which includes a 2014 overtime win over a Utah State team that won 10 games and

received votes in the final Associated Press Top-25 Poll. A-State has also compiled a 12-4 Sun Belt road record, including a 35-3 victory over then-ranked No. 25 Troy in 2016 for the Red Wolves first road win over a top-25 team since joining the FBS in 1992.

Upon his arrival at A-State, Anderson assembled a well-respected coaching staff and began working to put together his first recruiting class in an abbreviated time period. Not only did he sign the Sun Belt's No. 1 ranked class by Rivals.com, all five of his recruiting classes have ranked among the top three teams in the league by at least two of the major recruiting services.

Before joining A-State, Anderson worked on head coach Larry Fedora's staff as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at both North Carolina and Southern Miss the previous four seasons. His dynamic offense helped lead the two programs to 34 victories, three bowl game appearances and two conference or divisional titles. Along the way, his potent offense was responsible for breaking both schools' total offense records while also ranking among the most productive teams in the nation.

The Hubbard, Texas, native came to A-State after spending the previous two seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at North Carolina, where he helped lead the Tar Heels to an Atlantic Coast Conference Coastal Division title in 2012 and the Belk Bowl in 2013. Under Anderson's direction, North Carolina averaged 432.4 total yards per game in 2013 after setting the school record the previous year with 485.6 yards per contest. Prior to his arrival in Chapel Hill, the Tar Heels had not averaged 400 yards in a season since 1993.

North Carolina's offense posted more than 500 yards of total offense seven times during Anderson's two seasons at the school, including a school-record 721 versus Old Dominion his last season, and scored 40 or more points in nine games. The Tar Heels averaged 44.2 points per game at Kenan Stadium (14 games) and 25.4 on the road (10 games) with Anderson as their offensive coordinator.

Anderson led a passing offense during the 2013 season ranked 23rd in the nation, averaging 286.3 yards per game. North Carolina posted 27 passing touchdowns, which were the second most in school history and just two behind the 29 recorded in 2012. The Tar Heels ranked among the top 44 teams in the nation in total offense, completion percentage, passing offense, red zone offense, scoring offense, passing efficiency, fourth down conversions and turnovers lost in 2013.

North Carolina's offensive success was just a continuation from Anderson's initial season, which saw the Tar Heels establish more than 35 school records. The Tar Heels finished eighth in the country in scoring, averaging 40.6 points per game, and were 14th nationally with 485.6 yards per game. Their passing attack was 26th nationally with 291.8 yards per contest, and the Tar Heels also rushed for 193.8 yards per game, their highest average since 1994.

Individuals excelled in Anderson's system at every position. During his time at the school, six offensive players received All-ACC recognition, including First Team All-America selection Eric Ebron at tight end. As quarterbacks coach, Anderson tutored standouts Bryn Renner and Marquise Williams. Renner set the single-season school record for touchdowns passes with 28 in 2012, while Williams provided a spark to the UNC offense in 2013 with his mobility outside the pocket. Williams finished the regular season with 1,058 yards of total offense in the last three games alone, which was the most in any three-game stretch in Tar Heels history. He was also the first quarterback to lead North Carolina in rushing since 1968.

Anderson went to Chapel Hill after a record-setting run as Southern Miss' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. The Golden Eagles set school records for total offense in each of Anderson's last two years. He was part of a Southern Miss staff under Fedora that won a school-record 12 games in 2012, including the Conference USA championship over previously unbeaten Houston and the Hawaii Bowl over Nevada.

Anderson spent his first two seasons as USM's quarterbacks coach and run game coordinator and developed Austin Davis into one of the nation's top signal callers. Davis broke nearly every school record in an outstanding four-year career.

Under the eye of Anderson, the Golden Eagles were one of 14 teams in the country that averaged more than 200 yards per game in both rushing and passing in 2011. The Golden Eagles had nearly 6,500 yards of total offense and set a school record with 461.4 yards per game. In addition, USM was 15th nationally in scoring offense, 16th in total offense and 21st in rushing offense. Anderson's offense posted 30-or-more points in 10 of 14 games in 2011, including a season-high 63 in a win over Navy.

In 2010, Southern Miss was 18th in total offense, 20th in rushing offense and 35th in passing offense. The Golden Eagles also averaged 36.9 points



per game to rank 15th in the nation. That season, Anderson’s quarterbacks were among the most efficient in the nation with only eight interceptions thrown – including one by a wide receiver – to 24 touchdowns. Davis accounted for 10 of the team’s 28 rushing touchdowns, more than any other back.

In his first year in Hattiesburg in 2008, Anderson mentored then redshirt freshman and first-year starter Davis, who responded by having the best season ever for a freshman QB at the school, while also putting together one of the better years that any signal caller has had at the university.

Davis, who was the first freshman to start in his opening game since 1991, notched 15 school records, including six season marks – passing yards (3,128), completions (261), attempts (454), total offense (3,636) and touchdowns responsible for (30).

Anderson came to Southern Miss after spending the 2007 campaign at Louisiana-Lafayette as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. The Ragin’ Cajuns posted the No. 6-rated rushing offense nationally (251.6) in 2007 and became the Sun Belt’s first ever 3,000-yard rushing team (3,019).

Anderson, who was in private business from 2004-06, previously worked at Middle Tennessee, where he helped direct an offensive unit as co-offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach from 2002-04.

He spent three seasons at New Mexico before landing at MTSU. He served as the wide receivers coach in 2001 and running backs coach from 1999-2000. The UNM rushing attack was responsible for a major share of the Lobo offense in 2000. The Lobos averaged 148 yards per game on the ground, which accounted for 56 percent of the team’s total offense.

Anderson worked at Trinity Valley Community College (1995-98) before joining the Division I FBS ranks at New Mexico. In 1998, he was the offensive coordinator and the Cardinals went 7-3. He helped lead the Cardinals to the 1997 NJCAA National Championship.

He began his coaching career at Eastern New Mexico in 1992 (graduate assistant) and 1993 (full-time), where he tutored the wide receivers. He then moved on to Howard Payne University in Brownwood, Texas, to coach wide receivers in 1994. HPU won the Texas IAA conference title.

A two-year letterwinner at wide receiver for Sam Houston State from 1989-91, Anderson was named Southland Conference All-Academic as a senior. He also played for two years as a quarterback and receiver at Baylor (1987-89) before transferring. Anderson graduated with his bachelor’s degree in kinesiology from Sam Houston State in 1992. He also attained his master’s degree in sports administration from Eastern New Mexico in 1994. Anderson and his wife Wendy have one daughter, Callie, and two sons, Coletton and Cason.

JONESBORO, Ark. (9/1/18) – Senior quarterback Justice Hansen passed for a single-game school record six touchdowns and the Red Wolves had seven passing touchdowns as a team for a school record as Arkansas State opened the 2018 season with a 48-21 victory over Southeast Missouri at Allison Field inside Centennial Bank Stadium.

“I am obviously excited to get the win,” said head coach Blake Anderson. “It wasn’t pretty at times, but it is hard to be upset with a 48-21 win when a lot of folks did not get it done this weekend. I was excited for some of the new guys that stepped up and made some plays that hadn’t had some snaps. It was even good to get (Logan) Bonner out there and have some snaps when the game was still kind of in question and the same thing for Marcel Murray.

“All of that is kind of clouded by the fact that we had 12 penalties for 119 yards, we turned the ball over a couple of times, and we missed a couple of tackles that turned into explosive plays for them. Those are just things that when we play teams that are better equipped and match up with us better are going to be things that cause you to lose a game. It was an eye-opening experience, love the win, but it is a chance to learn and we have to improve quickly before we go play the No. 1 team in the country. It’s not so much that we are playing Alabama it is just that we have to improve overall and play the way we are capable.”

Hansen finished the night 26-of-36 passing for 423 yards and

six touchdowns to six different receivers. Hansen became the first Sun Belt Conference quarterback to throw for six or more touchdowns in a game since Giovanni Vizza of North Texas had eight against Navy on Nov. 10, 2007. Sophomore quarterback Logan Bonner was 2-of-3 for 74 yards and a touchdown to give A-State seven scores through the air to seven different receivers.

A-State (1-0) struck first with Hansen connecting with Jonathan Adams Jr. for a 26-yard touchdown. Southeast Missouri (0-1) evened the game at 7-7, but Hansen connected on a 15-yard pass and catch with Justin McInnis to make it 14-7 in the second quarter. After the Redhawks knotted the score at 14-14, Hansen tossed his third touchdown pass finding Kendrick Edwards on the 36-yard connection as A-State led 21-14 at the break.

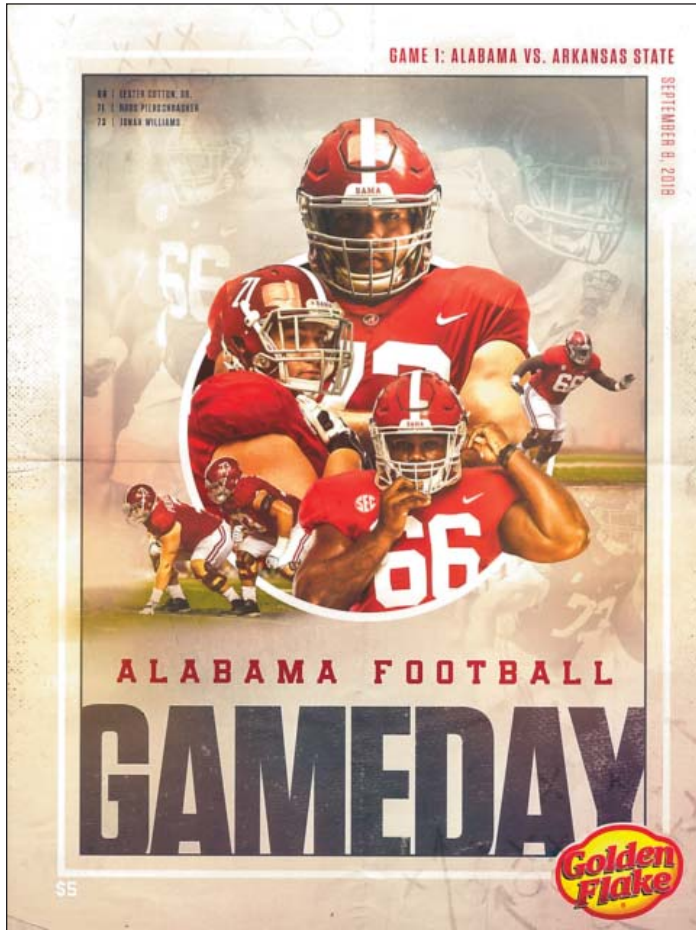
The Red Wolves added four more scores in the third quarter, with three of the four touchdown grabs covering 50 or more yards, to lead 48-14. Hansen connected with Javonis Isaac for a 57-yard strike to open the second half and followed with a six-yard pass and catch to Bubba Ogbebor. Bonner came in on the next series and it took just one play, a 54-yard pass to Omar Bayless to make it 41-14. Hansen re-entered the game and eclipsed the school record with a 67-yard pass to a wide open Marcel Murray to make it 48-14.

A-State finished the night outgaining the Redhawks 685-285 with a 497-163 edge through the air. The 685 total yards rank third in single-game history, while the 8.7 yards per play ranks the effort seventh. Murray led A-State on the ground with 10 rushes for 54 yards, while adding two catches for 75 yards and a score.

Defensively, A-State was led by Justin Clifton and Tajhea Chambers who logged six tackles each. The unit posted 11 tackles for loss, including three sacks.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (9/8/18) – No. 1 Alabama raced out to a 19-0 first quarter lead and went on to defeat Arkansas State 57-7 at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

Quarterback Justice Hansen was 15-of-36 passing for 140 yards and a touchdown while Warren Wand had 11 rushes for 60 yards. Armond Weh-Weh had four carries for 45 yards and A-State finished with 173 rushing yards on 31 carries. Kirk Merritt and Brandon Bowling led A-State with five receptions each with Merritt covering 29 yards and Bowling gaining 25 yards. Omar Bayless had a game-high 36 yards receiving for A-State on his three catches.

Darreon Jackson had a game-high 10 tackles, including six solo stops, and had a forced fumble near the Alabama goal line in the first half. Dojon Emory had the lone sack for the A-

State defense and the unit combined for four tackles for loss on the game.

Alabama out-gained the Red Wolves 599-391 for the game. The Crimson Tide had 321 yards through the air with another 278 yards coming on the ground. A-State had 173 yards rushing and 218 passing yards.

The Crimson Tide scored 33 points offensively and an interception return for a touchdown saw Alabama lead 40-0 at halftime. A-State used the opening possession of the second half to get on the board as Hansen hooked up with Kendrick Edwards for a 23-yard touchdown.

Following the Red Wolves score, Alabama scored 17 more points to set the final score. A-State moved inside the red zone in the fourth quarter, but two false start penalties and a missed field goal kept A-State from scoring.
