This Week

The Omaha hockey team concludes the 2018 portion of its schedule by hosting Alaska Anchorage in a rare split series this weekend. The two teams will faceoff on Saturday, Dec. 29 at 7:07 p.m. and again on Monday, Dec. 31 at 12:07 p.m. Both games will be played at Baxter Arena. This is Omaha's final non-conference series of the season.

The Teams

Omaha is 4-10-2 overall and 2-5-1-0/1 in the NCHC, good for seventh place. The Mavericks are winless in their last four after dropping 2-0 and 7-1 decisions at No. 2/1 St. Cloud State on Dec. 7-8. All time, the Mavericks are 6-2-1 against Alaska Anchorage including a mark of 2-0-0 at home. The Mavericks are 3-4-1 at home this year and 4-5-1 in the last 10 games.

Alaska Anchorage is 2-13-1 overall and 1-10-1-0/0 in the WCHA, putting it in 10th place. The Seawolves are coming off a split of a two-game series at Bemidji State on Dec. 14-15, losing 5-1 before prevailing 2-1 in overtime the next night. UAA is 1-9-0 on the road this season and 1-8-1 in its last 10 games. These two games against the Mavericks will conclude a 10-game road trip for the Seawolves.

Last Time Out

The Mavericks fell to St. Cloud State, 2-0 and 7-1, in their final series before the holiday break. On Friday, SCSU got a goal from Jack Poehling 1:38 into the game and added a power play tally from Jimmy Schuldtt in the second period, handing the Mavericks their first shutout of the season. Evan Weninger made a game-high 36 saves.

The next night, the Mavericks again spotted the Huskies an early lead when Blake Lizotte scored unassisted at 1:19. Zach Jordan tied the game at 5:03 of the second period, burying a pass from Tyler Weiss. SCSU responded just 35 seconds later with a goal from Robby Jackson. In all, the Huskies would score six unanswered goals to pull away for the sweep. Weninger stopped 30 in the finale.

The Coaches

Mike Gabinet is in his second season as head coach of the Mavericks, posting a 21-27-4 record all-time at his alma mater. The 2004 graduate of Omaha served as an associate head coach during the 2016-17 season before being elevated to the head coach position last season.

Gabinet returned to Omaha after four seasons at NAIT in Edmonton, Alberta, the last as its head coach.

MIKE GABINET - HEAD COACH

Hometown: Edmonton, Alberta
 Alma Mater: Omaha (2004)
 Career Record: 21-27-4 (Second Season)



Mike Gabinet became the third head coach in Omaha hockey history on April 5, 2017 after serving as associate head coach during the 2016-17 season, his first with his alma mater. Gabinet is the first former UNO player to serve as the team's head coach.

Before joining the Mavericks, Gabinet was the head coach of the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology in 2015-16. He led the Oaks to the Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference Championship with a 36-0 record, only the second time in 51 years that a team had finished undefeated in the conference. He was named ACAC Coach of the Year and became the first rookie head coach to guide his team to an undefeated season in Canadian college hockey history.

Prior to that, he was an associate coach at NAIT for three seasons.

A native of Edmonton, Alberta, Gabinet played defense for the Mavericks from 2000-04 and was an alternate captain as a senior. In 130 career games, he scored six goals and 41 assists for 47 points. He still ranks 10th all-time in points by a UNO defenseman.

Gabinet was a draft pick of the Los Angeles Kings in 2001 and played professionally in the American Hockey League, the ECHL and in Europe before turning to coaching in 2012.

Gabinet comes from an outstanding hockey family. He is the grandson of Canadian hockey coaching legend Clare Drake who in enjoyed success in both college and international coaching. His grandfather was inducted into the Canadian Sports Hall of Fame in 1989 and the Hockey Hall of Fame in November 2017.

That season, he led the Oaks to a 36-0-0 record and the ACAC Championship. He was named the conference Coach of the Year and became the first rookie head coach in Canadian college hockey to guide his team to an undefeated record.

Gabinet, a standout defenseman for the Mavericks from 2000-04, is assisted by Dave Noel-Bernier (Omaha, 2001) and Paul Jerrard (Lake Superior State, 1987).

Matt Curley is in his first season as the head coach at Alaska Anchorage. The 2007 graduate of Clarkson is 2-13-1 in his short career at UAA. He is assisted by Mark Phalon (SUNY-Potsdam, 2007) and Omaha native Matt Bruneteau (Lake Superior State, 2014).

Briefly

- Junior Zach Jordan had Omaha's only goal in its series at St. Cloud State on Dec. 7-8.
- Freshman Tyler Weiss earned his first career point with an assist on Jordan's goal in game two at SCSU.
- Friday's shutout loss at St. Cloud State ended the scoring streaks of Fredrik Olofsson (seven games), Mason Morelli (four games), Riley Alferd (four games) and Taylor Ward (four games).
- Coming out of the holiday break, the Mavericks rank fourth in the country with an average of 16.7 penalty minutes per game. They already have accumulated six game misconducts, more than halfway to surpassing the school record of 11 assessed in 42 games during the 1999-2000 season.
- The Mavericks went 0-for-5 on the power play at St. Cloud State while going 5-for-7 on the penalty kill.
- The Mavericks have scored first in a game just three times in the first 16 games. Of the first goals allowed, the Mavericks have given up one in the first two minutes of the game in four of the last six games.
- Nineteen out of 23 UNO skaters and goaltender Evan Weninger have registered at least a point this

season while 13 of those players have earned goals. Five players already have reached double digits in points.

All-Time vs. Alaska Anchorage

Omaha is 6-2-1 all-time against Alaska Anchorage including a mark of 2-0-0 at home, 3-1-1 on the road and 1-1-0 at a neutral site (see series results on page six). The Mavericks have won five straight meetings with the Seawolves.

As this is a non-conference series, the two schools have not faced each other in more than two years. The last meeting was Oct. 14, 2016 when the Mavericks beat UAA, 3-1, in the opening game of the Brice Alaska Goal Rush at Alaska.

While the Mavericks were members of the WCHA from 2010-13, they posted a conference record of 5-1-0 against UAA.

Ten members of this year's team played in the game against the Seawolves in 2016. Both Ryan Jones and Tristan Keck scored their first collegiate goals against UAA in what was their first collegiate game.

Among the Conference Leaders

The Mavericks have several players who rank among the NCHC's best for all games played.

Seniors Fredrik Olofsson and Mason Morelli are tied with three others for second in NCHC points with 18 each. Morelli is tied for second in the conference with nine goals while Olofsson is in a four-way tie for fourth with 11 assists.

Olofsson and Morelli are tied with Colorado College's Nick Halloran for the NCHC lead with nine power play points. Morelli has five goals, tying him for first in the conference with Western Michigan's Hugh McGing, and four assists while Olofsson has three goals and six assists. Junior Zach Jordan is in a three-way tie for fourth with eight power play points (2-6-8).

Junior Dean Stewart is tied with two others for fourth in defenseman scoring with three goals and nine assists for 12 points. All are career bests for Stewart who has equaled his output from his first two seasons.

Freshman Taylor Ward is third in freshman scoring with 13 points (5-8-13). Ward has earned eight of those points in NCHC play, putting him in second in conference scoring for rookies and in a tie for sixth among all players.

Special Teams

Omaha ranks eighth in the nation and second in the NCHC on the power play at 24.4 percent. The Mavericks were held without a power play goal in a series for the first time at St. Cloud State on Dec. 7-8 but still have scored at least one

power play goal in 13 of their first 16 games. Their only other empty outing was a 7-2 loss at Arizona State on Oct. 27. They had a string of eight straight games with a power play goal snapped at SCSU.

The Mavericks continue to work on their penalty kill which ranks seventh in the NCHC and 52nd nationally at 76.3 percent.

Heavy Hitters

Entering the weekend, the Mavericks had the second-toughest strength of schedule in the nation as determined by the KRACH ratings. Their rating of 239.2 is second only to Ohio State with a rating of 295.9. Fourteen of their first 16 games have been against teams in the top 20 of the Pairwise rankings.

The Mavericks will likely stay in the top five this season with 16 of their remaining games against teams currently in the top 20 of the Pairwise. Only one of those teams is outside the top 16.

This season, the Mavericks play four teams that played in the NCAA Tournament last season including the two teams that played for the national championship. In all, they'll have 12 of their 34 games against tournament teams. Here's the breakdown:

Last season, the Mavericks played seven teams that had appeared in the NCAA Tournament the previous year, posting a record of 10-10-0.

Monthly Hardware

November was a good month for awards for the Mavericks. Senior Mason Morelli was named the NCHC Player of the Month for scoring five goals and seven assists for 12 points to lead all conference players.

Freshman Taylor Ward was named the NCHC's Rookie of the Month for earning three goals and seven assists for 10 points to lead all freshmen and tie for second in the conference among all players.

They were the first monthly awards for both players and the first garnered by a Maverick since Austin Ortega was named the Player of the Month in December of 2016.

Award Season

The Mavericks picked up their fourth weekly award on Dec. 3 when freshman Taylor Ward was named the NCHC Rookie of the Week, his second such honor. He had a goal and three assists in UNO's series with Colorado College on Nov. 30-Dec. 1.

Omaha earned two weekly awards from the NCHC following its series with Arizona State. Senior Mason Morelli was named the Offensive Player of the Week for scoring three goals and adding four assists for seven points in the series. It was Morelli's first weekly award of his career.

Senior Evan Weninger picked up Goaltender of the Week honors for his performance against the Sun Devils. He went 2-0-0 with a 2.00 goals-against average and a .944 save percentage while earning a 44-save shutout in the finale of the series. He has earned six weekly awards in his career.

Ward earned Omaha's first weekly award of the season, picking up NCHC Rookie of the Week honors following the Mavericks' split with Miami on Nov. 2-3. Ward scored two goals and had one assist while finishing +1 in two games.

Last season, the Mavericks had nine weekly award winners but no rookies of the week.

NCHC History

The Mavericks are in their sixth season in the National Collegiate Hockey Conference, having come in as a charter member. Last season, they went 10-13-1-0/0 in conference play, putting them in a three-way tie for fifth place. UNO was 7-4-1 against the NCHC at home and 3-9-0 on the road.

All-time, the Mavericks are 54-63-11 in NCHC play. They are 30-30-4 all-time against NCHC teams at home and 24-33-7 on the road.

Among current players, senior Fredrik Olofsson leads all Mavericks with 19 goals and 23 assists for 42 points in 80 games. His fellow senior, Mason Morelli, is next with 16 goals and 18 assists for 34 points in 65 games and another senior, Steven Spinner, has 16 goals and 17 assists for 33 points in 83 games.

Junior Zach Jordan leads all players, averaging .583 points per NCHC game (48 GP, 16-12-28). Olofsson (.525), Morelli (.523), Tristan Keck (.429 in 56 GP, 12-12-24) and Spinner (.398) follow in points per game.

UNO's all-time leader in points per game in NCHC play is current Pittsburgh Penguin Jake Guentzel who averaged 1.08 points per game (72 GP, 28-50-78) in three seasons. Austin Ortega is the all-time leader in goals and total points, scoring 34 goals and 46 assists for 80 points in 92 NCHC games (.870).

The (Golden) Goose Egg

The Mavericks earned their first shutout in more than a year and a half when they blanked Arizona State, 4-0, on Nov. 24. Their most recent shutout before that had been on Feb. 25, 2017, a 3-0 whitewash at North Dakota - a span of 53 games.

Omaha's last home shutout before the Arizona State game came on Jan. 21, 2017, a 2-0 win over Miami. As was the case in all three games, Evan Weninger was goal. He now has earned five career shutouts to rank third all-time at UNO.

Career Firsts

Travis Kothenbeutel scored his first collegiate goal in Omaha's 6-4 win over Arizona State on Nov. 23, becoming the third Maverick freshman to net his first career goal. Chayse Primeau scored his first collegiate goal against Notre Dame on Oct. 20, becoming the first UNO freshman to score a goal this season. Classmate Taylor Ward recorded his first career goal at Arizona State on Oct. 27.

Among other freshman milestones: Ward picked up his first collegiate point with an assist at Union on Oct. 13, becoming the first Maverick rookie to notch a point this year; Kothenbeutel picked up his first point with an assist against Notre Dame on Oct. 20; and John Schuldt had his first assist on Ward's goal at Arizona State. Tyler Weiss earned his first point with an assist at St. Cloud State on Dec. 8, his sixth career game.

Sophomore Nate Knoepke picked up his first career point with an assist at Arizona State on Oct. 26.

Weninger Moves Up The Ladder

Senior Evan Weninger ranks in the top 10 in several career goaltending categories at UNO. With 43 career wins, he ranks fourth and is two wins from catching Jerad Kaufmann in third. Weninger moved into second all-time in career saves at UNO during the series at St. Cloud State (Dec. 7-8). He now has 2,642 and is behind only Dan Ellis who ranks first with 3,125 career saves. Weninger is third with five career shutouts, just one from equalling Faulkner.

Weninger is fourth in games played (95) and minutes played (5,350:09). His 3.15 career goals-against

average ranks ninth all-time at UNO while his .904 career save percentage is third best.

Climbing a Different Ladder

Goaltender Evan Weninger earned an assist on Zach Jordan's goal at St. Cloud State on Dec. 8, the fifth of his career. He now has six career points, tying him with Dan Ellis for second all-time in points by a UNO goaltender. He is just one point behind John Faulkner who leads all Omaha goalies with seven career points, all assists.

Weninger was given credit for Omaha's final goal in its 11-7 win over Miami on Jan. 12, 2018. That made him the 10th goaltender in NCAA history to score a goal and the first Maverick. The goal also set a school record for goals in a game.

Career Numbers

At the season's halfway point, a number of Mavericks have hit or are on their way to posting career-best numbers. Among the highlights so far:

Riley Alferd - Tied his career high for goals in a season (3)

Kevin Conley - Tied his career highs for goals (3), assists (4) and points (7) in a season

Mason Morelli - Career high for goals in a season (9); tied his career best for points in a season (18)

Dean Stewart - Career highs for goals (3), assists (9) and points (12) in a season

Of those approaching career marks:

Zach Jordan - Three assists from tying career best for assists (12)

Fredrik Olofsson - Four goals from tying career best for goals (11); three assists from tying career best for assists (14)

First-Year Captains

Senior Mason Morelli is serving as the Mavericks' captain this season. It is his first time wearing a letter for UNO.

A quartet of his fellow seniors are serving as alternates. Ryan Galt, Fredrik Olofsson, Jalen Schulz and Steven Spinner all wear A's. It also is the first time any of those players has worn a letter for the Mavericks.

Welcome To Omaha

The Mavericks brought in nine newcomers to their roster this season, a stark contrast to last year's class of just three players.

Six of Omaha's newcomers are true freshmen. Chayse Primeau (Dubuque), John Schuldt (Fargo) and Jason Smallidge (Youngstown/Central Illinois) are all graduates of the USHL. Taylor Ward (Penticton) played last season in the British Columbia Hockey League, Travis Kothenbeutel (Austin) played in the North American Hockey League and Tyler Weiss played with the U.S. National Team Development Program.

Two of the newcomers will begin their UNO careers as sophomores. Forward Kevin Conley played his freshman season with Denver before suiting up for Sioux Falls of the USHL last year. Defenseman Nate Knoepke played just two games for Minnesota before finishing the year with Sioux City of the USHL in 2017-18.

Goaltender Matej Tomek starts his career at UNO as a junior after two seasons at North Dakota. He played for Waterloo of the USHL last season.

In the last five years, the Mavericks' largest incoming class was 10 in 2015-16, one year after they brought in nine true freshmen.

The Century Club

Senior Mason Morelli played in his 100th career game against St. Cloud State on Dec. 8, become the latest Maverick to hit that mark this year. Senior Lukas Buchta did so against Arizona State on Nov. 24. Several other players could hit the century mark for games played this season. Seniors Ryan Galt (five) and Riley Alferd (14) are closing in on that mark as are juniors Ryan Jones (15), Tristan Keck (17) and Teemu Pulkkinen (23).

In addition, senior goaltender Evan Weninger is five appearances from hitting 100 games played.

Senior Steven Spinner is UNO's active leader in career games played at 121. He has missed just six games in his collegiate career.

Abdicating The Throne

Last season, Mike Gabinet was the youngest head coach among the 60 NCAA Division I men's hockey programs, but this year he no longer holds that distinction. The baton has been passed to Denver's David Carle who, at 29, is more than eight years junior to Gabinet who turned 37 on Sept. 26.

In fact, with several new head coaches joining the NCAA ranks this season, Gabinet looks downright grizzled. Alaska's Erik Largen is 32 years old and Alaska Anchorage's Matt Curley is 35. Gabinet is now the fourth-youngest D-I head coach.

Polling Place

The Mavericks were picked to finish seventh in this year's NCHC preseason media poll. Only once in the six-year history of the conference have they been picked to finish in the top four. That was prior to the 2015-16 season when they were selected fourth but finished sixth.

In the first two seasons of the NCHC, the Mavericks finished third although they were picked eighth in the inaugural preseason poll and sixth in year two. They have not finished in the top four of the conference in each of the last three seasons, ending up sixth in 2015-16 and 2016-17 and tying for fifth but winning the tiebreakers last season.

A Bunch of Smart Kids

Last season, 23 of UNO's 26 players were named NCHC Academic All-Conference for achieving at least a 3.0 grade-point average. That put them second only to Western Michigan which had 24. It marked the fourth time in five seasons the Mavericks have led or tied for the conference lead in Academic All-Conference nods. An NCHC-leading thirteen of those players - Riley Alferd, Alex Blankenburg, Lukas Buchta, Ryan Galt, Zach Jordan, Jordan Klehr, Lawson McDonald, Joel Messner, Mason Morelli, Fredrik Olofsson, Cole Pickup, Martin Sundberg and Tyler Vesel - were named NCHC Distinguished Scholars for earning a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or better.

Eleven Mavericks also were named All-American Scholars by the American Hockey Coaches Association. The award is given to student-athletes who earned at least a 3.6 GPA each semester and participate in at least 40 percent of their team's games. Alferd, Blankenburg, Buchta, Galt, Jordan, Messner, Morelli, Olofsson, Pickup, Sundberg and Vesel all were honored.
