QUICK HITS (vs. ELON)

►The March 12 meeting between Elon and UNCG marks the 55th all-time meeting between the two schools on the diamond. Elon holds the series lead (38-16), but the Spartans have won three of the last four games in the series, including three straight between March 7, 2017 to March 7, 2018.

►The Spartans are 12-19 all-time against Elon when playing in Greensboro with two of the wins being vacated in the 2011 campaign due to infractions. Five of the 12 home wins for the Spartans have come under current head coach Link Jarrett. The two teams have met four times at a neutral site, during the Southern Conference Tournament with Elon prevailing in all four contests. Elon owns a 14-5 lead in the series on its home turf, winning the only extra inning affair between the two programs at Elon on April 29, 2012 as the two battled for 10 innings.

►The Phoenix are one of four opponents that UNCG is scheduled to face both on the road and at home. The others include Wake Forest, Winthrop and High Point. UNCG and Elon has six common opponents this season including Wake Forest, N.C. A&T, Western Carolina, Quinnipiac, High Point and Campbell.

►Elon has been picked to win a competitive race for the CAA baseball title in 2019 according to a vote of the league's head baseball coaches. The Phoenix received four first-place votes and finished atop the poll with 57 points. Following close behind in a tie for second with 54 points were defending CAA champion UNCW, which got one first-place vote, and back-to-back regular-season champion Northeastern, which picked up the other four first-place votes. Charleston was fourth with 47 points, followed by Delaware (34 points), James Madison (32 points), William & Mary (19 points), Hofstra (14 points) and Towson (13 points).

►The Spartans are 61-84 all-time against teams that make up the Colonial Athletic Association. Of the nine teams that make up the league, UNCG has squared off against six of them, the exceptions being William & Mary, Northeastern and Hofstra. The most wins have come against College of Charleston (20-30), followed by Elon (16-38), UNC Wilmington (12-10), Towson (6-1), Delaware (5-1) and James Madison (2-4).

►Elon returns five starters and several top pitchers from last year's 36-23 squad that placed second in the CAA standings. The Phoenix pitching staff is headlined by a pair of preseason All-America honorees in junior right-handers Kyle Brnovich (8-2, 1.71 ERA, 147 K's) and George Kirby (10-3, 2.89 ERA, 96 K's). The bullpen includes Jared Wetherbee (2-1, 4 svs., 4.07 ERA) and Brandon Justice (0-3, 2 svs., 2.13 ERA). Three all-conference selections are back in the Elon lineup with infielders Cam Devanney (.287, 5 HR, 23 RB) and Joe Satterfield (.268, 4 HR, 43 RBI) and designated hitter Garrett Stonehouse (.268, 2 HR, 38 RBI) (*statistics were heading into 2019 season*).

SPARTANS TABBED SECOND IN PRESEASON POLLS: One year after winning the Southern Conference regular season title, the UNC Greensboro baseball team was picked second in the 2019 preseason coaches and media polls that were released on Thursday, Feb. 7.

The Spartans, who won their second regular season league title in program history since joining the Southern Conference in 1998, were 39-15 overall and 18-3 in conference action a season ago. UNCG has posted at least 35 wins in three straight seasons for the first time in program history. After earning wins in two elimination games in as many days, the Spartans season came to a close at the 2018 SoCon Tournament with an 8-4 setback to Western Carolina.

Webster, who hit from the two-spot of the lineup in all 54 games, finished the 2018 season with second-best batting average (.380) on the team and fourth-best in the conference a season ago. He was responsible for 11 extra-base hits on the campaign, while scoring 51 runs and driving in 37.

Webster finished with 29 multi-hit games in 2018, ending with a single-season high four hits on two occasions against Marist (4-4, RBI, 2 runs; March 3) and Mercer (4-5, run). The junior from Randleman, N.C., was also responsible for a .456 slugging percentage, .417 on-base percentage and seven stolen bases over the course of the slate.

Embler, a redshirt senior from Southern Pines, N.C., was named to the First Team Preseason All-SoCon for the second time in as many seasons. He was the leadoff hitter in the UNCG lineup throughout the course of 2018, posting with a .357 batting average, ninth-best in the league and fourth-best on the team. Embler finished tied with Cesar Trejo for most doubles (15) and was third on the team in hits (81), earning the second-best on-base percentage (.438) for the Spartans in the process.

UNCG, ELON CLASHING FOR 55TH TIME: The Spartans and Phoenix are meeting for the 55th time on the diamond on Tuesday evening. Elon holds a 38-16 advantage in the all-time series, including a pair of wins that were vacated by UNCG in 2011.

The Spartans are 7-7 against Elon under current head coach Link Jarrett, winning three of the last four games, dating back to March 7, 2017, when UNCG posted a 12-8 victory. After earning the four-run win on March 7, UNCG came through with a 10-3 victory (May 2, 2017) and a 7-5 win (March 7, 2018). The Phoenix snapped UNCG's three-game winning streak in the series in their last meeting with an 8-7 triumph on May 15, 2018.

UNCG's longest winning streak in the series is four games, which spanned from April 6, 1999 to Feb. 27, 2001 under then head coach Mike Gaski. The longest winning streak for Elon in the series is 10 games, which spanned from April 26, 2008 through April 1, 2011.

The former Southern Conference rivals, until Elon's departure from the league after the 2014 campaign, squared off against each other a total of 37 times in league play, including four occasions in the conference tournament. Elon owns a 4-0 mark against the Spartans in SoCon Tournament action.

The two have only played one extra inning game in the all-time series, which came on April 29, 2012, as Elon prevailed 3-1 in 10 innings.

THE PRINCETON REVIEW: UNCG capped off a four-game sweep of Princeton over the weekend by outscoring the Tigers by a 19-10 margin.

Five Spartans hit better than .400 over the three-day, four-game series, including Zach Kuchmaner, who led all UNCG hitters with a .667 batting average after going 2-for-3 from the plate with a run scored. UNCG backstop Ryan Caveness also put together a solid weekend, finishing with a .556 batting average, .889 slugging percentage while going 5-of-9 from the plate, scoring two runs and smashing the only home run of the series.

Junior Caleb Webster closed out the clash with the Tigers by hitting .455 (5-of-11) from the plate, scoring three runs and accounting for two RBI. Both Jacques Koonce (5-for-12) and Josh Madole (5-for-12) finished with a .417 batting average in four games against Princeton. Madole was responsible for four RBI, most of any UNCG hitter, while posting a .417 slugging percentage and a .500 on-base percentage.

Three UNCG pitchers picked up victories against Princeton, including Jack Voigt, who snagged two wins over the weekend. Voigt logged 1.1 innings, surrendered two hits, one run and converted a strikeout against the Tigers.

Jeremiah Triplett earned his second win of the season in the first game of Sunday's doubleheader, tossing six innings, allowing two hits and three walks, while striking out



eight Tiger batters. The eight K's mark the most in a single game for any UNCG pitcher this season, topping a previous mark that was shared by both Triplett (7, vs. Quinnipiac (Feb. 16)) and Voigt (7, vs. Penn (March 2)).

"LINK" TO THE MLB: During UNCG head coach Link Jarrett's seven-year tenure as the Spartans head coach, which began in 2013, he has witnessed 15 players selected in the Major League Baseball Draft. That marks the most of any Southern Conference program with Samford (14), Western Carolina (11) and Mercer (10) also with 10 or more in that span.

<RECAPING LAST FOUR GAMES>

UNCG COMPLETES DOUBLEHEADER SWEEP OF TIGERS: The UNCG baseball team maintained its perfect mark at home with a doubleheader sweep of Princeton on Sunday, March 10, by winning the first game 6-2 and the second game by a 5-3 margin, as the Spartans completed the series sweep in the process.

The first game of the afternoon was a pitcher's duel over the first three innings, as UNCG's Jeremiah Triplett and Princeton's Andrew Gnazzo held the opposing lineup without a hit. The Tigers broke through with a hit in the top of the fourth, while UNCG came through with two in the bottom of the frame.

The Spartans offense got rolling in the fifth when Mike Ferrara and Zach Kuchmaner reached base ahead of Coleman Sawyer, who delivered a hit that scored Ferrara for second for the 1-0 advantage. Sawyer moved to second on a wild pitch, which was followed by a single to centerfield by Jacquez Koonce that pushed the UNCG lead to 2-0.

After holding the Tigers hitless in the top of the sixth, UNCG's offense put three more runs on the board in the home half of the inning. It began when Caleb Webster reached on a single to short, moving to second on a throwing error. Ryan Caveness followed with a single up the middle, putting runners on the corners. Josh Madole drove a single through the left side of the infield, plating Webster for the third run of the game.

Ferrara continued the UNCG sixth by reaching on a fielder's choice that got Caveness at third. Kuchmaner roped a one-out single to third, loading the bases for Sawyer. A passed ball with Sawyer at bat plated Madole for the fourth UNCG run of the day and second of the inning. With two outs in the inning, after Ferrara was out on a play at the plate, Kuchmaner scored from third on a passed ball to give the Spartans a 5-0 advantage.

Princeton managed to get two runs back in the top of the seventh when Alex Dickinson drove a two-run home run over the left-centerfield wall. UNCG got one of those runs back in the bottom of the inning when Madole drove a single into right field, scoring Webster from second base after the junior standout reached on a single to third for his second hit of the game.

The two teams completed the four-game series with a seven-inning game that helped UNCG maintain its perfect 9-0 mark at home.

The Spartans (10-4) scored all five runs in the second inning, which came as a

result of five hits. Josh Madole started the process when he was hit by a pitch, moving to second a sacrifice bunt by Jacquez Koonce. David Flores grounded out to short, scoring Madole from third, providing UNCG with the 1-0 lead. Hogan Windish reached on a fielder's choice that put runners on the corners, which was followed by a single down the left field line by Greg Hardison that scored Coleman Sawyer for the second UNCG run.

Austin Emblar continued the offensive onslaught for the Spartans, loading the bases for Caleb Webster. With Webster at the plate a wild pitch by Reece Rabin allowed Windish to score from third for the 3-0 UNCG advantage. Webster followed with a bases-clearing double to right field, scoring Emblar and Hardison as the lead grew to 5-0.

Princeton (1-6) retaliated in the top of the fourth, scoring its first run of the game on a bases loaded grounder by Max West. Teammate Joseph Flynn recorded the second run on a wild pitch by Colin Best, slicing the Spartan lead to 5-2.

The Tigers tacked on their final run of the game in the seventh after Nadir Lewis reached on a two-out double to left field. Flynn dropped a single to left, scoring Lewis in the process, before moving to second on a single up the middle by David Harding. The Spartans defense converted the final out with a fly ball to right field, ending the threat.

Freshman Austin Koehn, who pitched 3.2 innings of relief, earned the first victory of his collegiate career after holding the Tigers to one run on three hits, while striking out four. He came in relief of Best, who worked 3.1 innings, allowed one hit, two runs and four walks while striking out two.

THREE-RUN EIGHTH INNING LEADS UNCG TO 10-7 WIN: After being held to one hit over a four-inning stretch between the third and seventh innings, the UNCG baseball team came through with two hits and four runs in the home half of the eighth to earn a 5-3 win at UNCG Stadium on Saturday, March 9 versus Princeton.

The Spartans took advantage of two walks and a hit by pitch in the first three batters of the eighth inning when Mike Ferrara drove a single through the left side of the infield to score the second run of the game. Josh Madole followed with two-run single to centerfield, scoring Austin Emblar and Ryan Caveness in the process, giving UNCG a 4-3 advantage. The final Spartan run crossed the plate when Coleman Sawyer grounded into a double play, scoring pinch runner Hogan Windish from third, extending the lead to 5-3.

Princeton attempted a rally in the ninth, when Joseph Flynn reached on a walk and Max West followed with a double to centerfield that put runners at second and third, but a Brandon Stephens strikeout coupled with a diving catch by Zach Kuchmaner to end the game slammed the door on the Tigers comeback.

Stephens picked up his first save of the season after getting the final two outs of the game. Junior lefthander Jack Voigt (2-1) earned his second win in as many days after recording two outs in the top of the eighth, including one for a strikeout.

Maddux Holshouser tossed the first five innings for UNCG, allowing three runs on four hits along with a walk, while striking out three Princeton batters along the way. He gave way to Corey Jackson, who faced eight batters over the next 2.1 innings, where he tallied one strikeout.

Caveness (2-3, 2 RBI, run) and Madole (2-3, 2 RBI, run) were the only hitters in the UNCG lineup with multiple hits on the day. The Spartans finished the afternoon with eight hits, five of which came in the first two innings of the game.

LATE HOMER LIFTS SPARTANS PAST PRINCETON: Junior catcher Ryan Caveness blasted a solo home run over the left field wall in the bottom of the sixth inning that helped the Spartan baseball team remain unbeaten at home with a 3-2 victory over Princeton on Friday, March 8 at the UNCG Baseball Stadium.

Caveness, who finished 2-for-4 from the plate, lifted a 3-1 pitch by Ryan Smith to left field that gave the Spartans a 2-1 advantage through six complete innings. The Spartans added their third of the game in the seventh when Jacquez Koonce led off with a single to centerfield. Koonce, who reached third on back-to-back sacrifice flies, scored the third run off a wild pitch by Eric Hoefler.

Koonce's run proved valuable in the top of the eighth, when Princeton manufactured its second run of the game. The Tigers drew consecutive walks to start the inning and moved the runners to second and third on a sacrifice bunt by Max West. Max Machiorlette followed with a grounder, scoring Joseph Beckett from third to cut the lead to 3-2. Sy Snedeker worked the count to draw a walk, putting runners on the corners for the Tigers with two outs, but UNCG's defense closed the door as Austin Emblar reeled in the liner to second.

Caveness, the lone Spartan with an extra base hit, was one of three UNCG hitters with two hits on the day, along with Koonce (2-3, 2 runs) and Mike Ferrara (2-4).

The Spartans also received a solid start from Phillip Sanderson who tossed 5.1 innings, allowed one run, one walk and finished with five strikeouts. Corey Jackson worked one inning out of the bullpen, striking out one of the four Princeton batters he faced.

Jack Voigt picked up the win for UNCG, allowing one run and two walks to the three batters he faced. Chad Sykes came home to earn his second save of the season in two innings of work, where he allowed one walk and one hit while striking out one Tiger batter.
