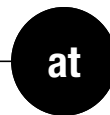
Wolves Travel to Flagler Classic

» For the first time, the West Georgia Wolves will compete in the Flagler Classic at Flagler College in St. Augustine, FL. The classic will feature Lees-McRae, Walsh University, Embry-Riddle Aeronautical, and host Flagler. UWG opens with Flagler on Sept. 13, at 12:00 PM and will also play Lees-McRae on Friday afternoon as well.

» After a slow start to the first weekend, the Wolves finished in strong fashion, blasting Trevecca Nazarene and Montevallo by a 3-0 count on Saturday afternoon to open the year with a 2-2 record after the first four matches.

» This weekend will be the second of three tournament weekends for the Wolves this season. West Georgia opened at the UAH Classic last weekend in Huntsville, Ala., and will now travel to St. Augustine, Fla. for four matches this weekend. The final tournament will be on October 18-19 in Birmingham, Ala., with the annual GSC-SSC Crossover.

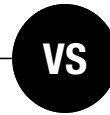

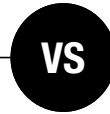

HEAD COACH JON MOSELEY

After a successful opening campaign in Carrollton, Jon Moseley returns for his second year as the head coach of UWG volleyball in the fall of 2019.

Moseley joined the West Georgia family in 2018 following 12 years as the head coach at Shorter University in Rome, Ga., where he amassed a record of 85-25 against Gulf South Conference competition over the past six seasons. He has compiled a 289-131 record during his 13-year tenure at Shorter and West Georgia, and he is the winningest coach in Shorter volleyball history. His team was the regular season GSC Champion in 2014 and 2016, and he was voted GSC Coach of the Year in 2016. In 2014, the Hawks reached the NCAA tournament in their first year of eligibility.

Moseley's first season at the helm of the UWG program was a massive step in the right direction for West Georgia volleyball. After four seasons of less than double-digit wins on the court at UWG, the Wolves won 11 matches, including a 5-11 mark against Gulf South Conference competition. The new-look Wolves announced their arrival with authority at the UAH Classic in Huntsville, Ala., beating LeMoyne-Owen 3-0 in the season opener for Moseley's first victory as the head coach at UWG. The Wolves did one better that evening, besting GSC foe and tournament host Alabama Huntsville in a non-conference match, 3-1 to move to 2-0 on the year. In addition, the 2018 West Georgia squad did something that no other UWG team has done, winning a match at the GSC-SSC Crossover. The Wolves beat Nova Southeastern 3-1 on the first day of competition, the first-ever win for UWG at that event.

In his tenure as a Division II volleyball coach, Moseley has defeated five teams ranked in the AVCA NCAA Division II Top-25 Coaches' Poll, coached two NCAA All-Americans, 10 All-GSC performers, four Academic All-GSC performers and had 87 GSC Academic

Honor Roll selections. The Honor Roll selections were the most of any league school during that period (2012-16). In 2012, Shorter's volleyball team won the NCCAA South Region title, and took runner-up honors at the national tournament. In his first season as head coach in 2006, Moseley led the Lady Hawks to a 22-8 record, which at the time was the best mark in program history. For his efforts that year, Moseley was named the SSAC Coach of the Year.

In 2007, Moseley's fifth-seeded Lady Hawks captured the program's first SSAC Tournament championship and advanced to the NAIA Volleyball National Championship.

Prior to his collegiate experience at Shorter, Moseley was the head volleyball coach at Guntersville High School in Guntersville, Ala. At Guntersville, he coached his teams to back-to-back Alabama Group AAAA state championships in 2004 and 2005. Prior to his time in Guntersville, Moseley served as the head volleyball coach at Cherokee County High School in Centre, Ala. There, Moseley's teams advanced to the Elite Eight six times, including Final Four appearances in 1998 and 2003, with trips to the state championship game in 1999, 2001 and 2002. He was named the Gadsden Times Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2005 and the Marshall County Coach of the Year in 2004 and 2005.

Moseley graduated cum laude from Vanderbilt University in 1993 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Mathematics and a minor in Latin American Studies. He earned his Master of Education degree in Secondary Education from Vanderbilt in 1998.

Moseley married the former Ana Oliver in the summer of 2011. In 2013, the couple welcomed their first child, a daughter named Ada Caroline and their second child, James Daniel, arrived in December of 2015.

ASSISTANT COACH ANNA GRAHAM

Returning for her second season with the UWG program is assistant coach Anna Graham. Graham is a vital member of the team, coaching the middles and spending time recruiting.

Graham was a graduate assistant for Shorter

after her playing days, earning a Bachelor of Science in Psychology in the fall of 2015. She then worked to obtain a Master's Degree in Business Management. Following her graduation from Shorter's business school, Anna went on to work at Gadsden City High School while maintaining a connection with volleyball by coaching several travel ball teams and doing camps across Alabama and

Georgia throughout the summers.

Graham is no stranger to Gulf South Conference volleyball, as she was part of the transition from NAIA to NCAA play, and a member of a team that finished second in the Gulf South Conference twice in the regular season before being eligible for postseason play. In those two seasons, Shorter played in the NCCAA (National Christian College Athletic Association) national tournament, reaching the national finals in Graham's sophomore year and the semifinals in her junior campaign.

As a sophomore, Graham had 377 kills on the year, which ranked fifth in Shorter volleyball history. As a junior, she was a strong player on the front line for Moseley, leading the team in blocks and earning NCCAA All-Region honors. As a senior, Graham was finally eligible for postseason honors with the Gulf South Conference, earning All-GSC honors in leading the Hawks to win the regular season title in the first full year of eligibility and reaching the NCAA National Tournament.

GRADUATE ASSISTANT ANNA METZLER



Head coach Jon Moseley didn't need to go far for an addition to his staff for the fall of 2019, as he added a talented and experienced

former player to joining the UWG Coaching staff for the 2019 volleyball season. Anna Metzler played collegiately at Dalton State College for three seasons before transferring to West Georgia to play in the fall of 2018. She played mostly as a libero last year as a senior for the Wolves.

GAME NOTES: WEEK TWO

Freshman of the Week

UWG freshman middle Tierra White made history on Tuesday, becoming the first UWG player to win Gulf South Conference Freshman of the Week. White had 41 total kills with a .390 hitting percentage and added 13 blocks to earn the nod from league officials in the weekly voting. Her biggest game came against Alabama Huntsville when she had 13 kills with just two errors to lead the Wolves.

Preseason GSC Standings

West Georgia was picked to finish seventh in the 2019 Preseason Coaches' Poll, released recently by the Gulf South Conference. Should the Wolves finish in that spot or higher, UWG would earn a berth into the 2019 Gulf South Conference tournament. West Florida was picked as the favorite to win this year's crown, and the Argos have won the past two league championships. Montevallo, Alabama Huntsville, and Lee round out the top four in this year's standings.

Wharton All-Around Play

Senior outside hitter McKenna Wharton was a big part of the Wolves' 2-2 start to the season this past weekend. Wharton had 36 kills in the four matches, averaging 2.77 kills per set with a .220 hitting percentage for the weekend. Wharton and freshman Tierra White tied for the most kills in a single match this weekend, as both had 13 against Alabama Huntsville on Friday evening in Spragins Hall.

September On the Road

The Wolves will open the 2019 season as road warriors, as UWG will only play in the friendly confines of The Coliseum twice in the month of September. The first match at home for UWG will not be until the second week of the season, as the Wolves will host Clark Atlanta at 7 p.m. on September 17. The only other September match at The Coliseum will be on September 26 against the Shorter Hawks. First serve for that one is set for 7 p.m.

Fleming Starts Strong

The West Georgia Wolves started with a solid hitting weekend in Huntsville. Much of that was driven by senior setter Madi Fleming, who delivered on 122 assists in the first weekend of the season. The Columbus native comes into the second weekend of the season needing just eight assists to become just the fifth setter in school history with 2,000 career assists. She is averaging 9.38 assists per set on the season, leading the Gulf South Conference after the first weekend.

Hitters Junior and Freshman

Anjelina Webb and Carrington Terrell had a strong first weekend for the Wolves, as both averaged more than two kills per set through the first four matches of the season. Webb started with 2.54 kills per set, good for third on the team while Terrell averaged 2.27 kills per set in her first weekend of collegiate volleyball.
